

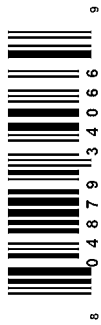

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

In response to Edward Aguirre's letter on CAC property taxes

There were several statements in Mr. Aguirre's opinion piece that are misleading concerning the signs, closure of the Aravaipa campus, and state funding to Central Arizona College (CAC).

First, let me address the signs. The signs that Citizens for Fair Taxation (CFFT) used were purchased shortly after the May 19, 2015 meeting thus the 45% was used. On June 9, the CAC Board of Governors (BOG) voted to change the outrageous tax increase to 20%. Due to the expense of these signs we crossed out the 45%, and wrote in 20%. There is a clearer picture of this sign on Twitter, go to search, type in 'sign recall petition', then scroll down to Sept. 18. In addition, flyers were distributed to Oracle residents describing CAC's meetings for the tax increase. While in Oracle gathering signatures, there was one woman who did complain that the 20% was not obvious. She

was informed that if she would bring a magic marker her concerns would be accommodated. She refused. Further, this particular woman stated that CFFT wanted to close the Aravaipa campus. Even after it was explained to her that her statement was patently untrue, she persisted in this accusation until she was instructed to leave. Concerning state funding, I'm reminded of an infamous quote from Mark Twain, "There are three kinds of lies: lies, damned lies, and statistics." By using information from 2006 it appears that the state has fiscally abandoned CAC. Further, one of CAC's contentions to justify their most recent tax increase has been to place the blame on the lack of state funding. Interestingly the facts don't substantiate CAC's accusation. In 2014 CAC received \$2,023,900 (<http://1.usa.gov/1VQHMuY>) while in 2015 they received \$1,903,500 from the state (<http://1.usa.gov/1LJ6Tu7>) The difference in state aid from 2014 to 2015 was \$120,400. For example, this amount could have been replaced by using one less administrative position (salary = \$100,000 to \$200,000/year). CAC could also have replaced these monies with the 6% increase on our property tax assessments this year, which CAC automatically receives.

There's additional information that many may not know. In 2008 Pinal County voters agreed to let CAC obtain 98 million dollars in bond money which the taxpayers would ultimately have to repay. Personally my share of this bond money has increased 203% in 5 years, from 2010 to 2015. Of this bond money CAC irresponsibly spent \$8.3 million for the 203 acre San Tan Valley campus. According to an October 12, 2011 article in the Wall Street Journal, Group Manages to Pull Off Desert Flip in Arizona, CAC spent

\$43K/ac for much more land than needed for this campus. In January 2011 this land had been purchased for \$23K/acre. So in 9 months the original purchaser made \$20K/Ac. Further, CAC didn't even bother to have an appraisal performed. In addition one would have to question why a community college satellite campus needed so much acreage. Then there's the issue of recent tax increases. In 2013, the CAC BOG voted to increase property taxes by 35%. There was such an outcry from voters that three weeks later this particular increase was changed to 16%. As there isn't any oversight of CAC's tax increases, they continue to increase taxes, burdening Pinal County taxpayers. In 5 years, from 2010 to 2015, my taxes for CAC have increased 57%. These are just a few of the fiscal issues that I had concerning CAC.

As many of us know there are always two or more sides to every story. The language on the sign was due to economic factors; we did cross out the 45% increase, changing it to 20%. CFFT does not advocate closing any campuses; however it does advocate that the CAC BOG be fiscally responsible to Pinal County taxpayers. CAC BOGs current tax increase is not due to a decrease in state funding.

Resolution Copper hosts reclamation tour

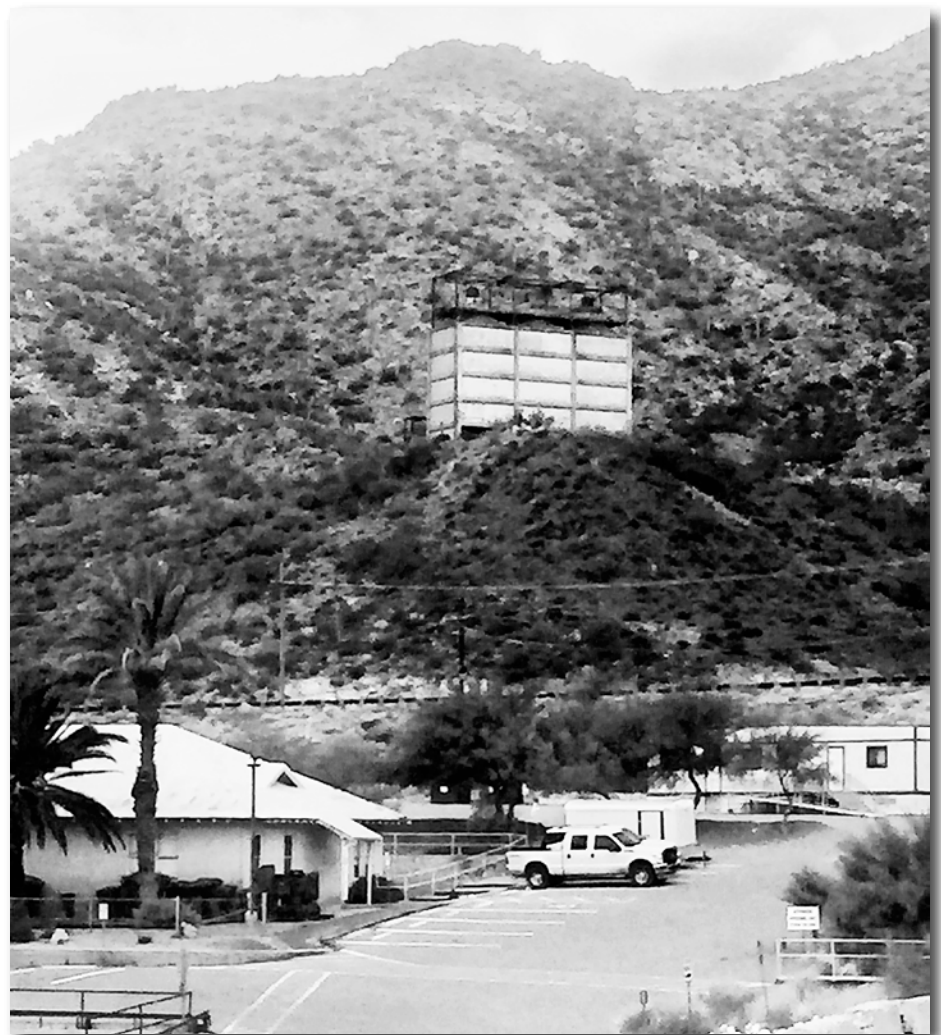
Visitors from around the state including two out of state visitors from Tennessee attended the tour of the reclamation of the old Magma mine site given by Resolution Copper.

No doubt about it, Panthers win sectional championship

The Panthers left no doubt last Friday night at Gilbert Christian.

In front of a local TV station and thousands of fans for both teams, the Superior football team erased any doubt they're a state title contender after a 62 – 37 victory over then fourth-ranked Gilbert Christian.

"I would like to thank the parents and community of Superior for all of the support they have shown for this team," Panthers' head coach Ryan Palmer said after the game. "On Friday at Gilbert Christian High School's field, on their homecoming, Superior had more fans than the home team. The community's continued support of this team is important and very much appreciated."

Superior took advantage of the one game on their schedule to show those who may have thought their undefeated season was the result of playing a weaker schedule. Now the third-ranked team in the state, everyone knows what the Panthers' players and coaches knew since the summer: They can win a state championship.

"I am very proud of this team. They worked extremely hard to accomplish the goal of a section championship," Palmer told the Superior Sun. "It was a total team effort and the leaders stepped up and earned this victory."

"It was a big win for this program, but this team still has not played their best football," he continued. "We are going to continue to outwork our opponents every day and strive to reach our ultimate goal."

Junior quarterback Nicolaus Cruz had a coming out party of sorts, showing that he is one of the top players in the state regardless of division. He ran for two touchdowns and threw one to Michael Salazar during a high-scoring first quarter that ended with the Panthers leading, 22 – 15.
