

Opinion: Economic growth depends on new and old industries alike

The road to economic growth and fiscal sustainability is paved with lower taxes, a balanced budget and a less intrusive regulatory environment. When these conditions are met, the private sector can flourish and create jobs.

Arizona is blessed with five C's: copper, cattle, cotton, citrus and climate. The first C, copper, was a critical

engine of growth throughout Arizona's history. In recent years, however, the weight of excessive federal regulation crushed growth in this industry.

But this can change. The Southeast Arizona Land Exchange and Conversation Act of 2013 is a great first step. The bill – sponsored by Rep. Paul Gosar (R-AZ) – authorizes the construction of an underground copper

mine in Superior, Arizona through a land exchange. The economic impact of this mine is staggering.

The mine will create approximately 3,000 construction jobs over an initial six to ten year period. Then, once the mine is fully operational, it will employ more than 3,700 people. These are high-paying jobs that range from \$40,000 to \$120,000 annually in an area of the state

that is particularly suffering economically.

The total economic impact of the mine on the state of Arizona is estimated at \$61.4 billion. That means more than \$1 billion per year over the life span of the mine. Additionally, the mine will generate almost \$20 billion in federal, state, county and local tax revenue.

In order to be successful, Arizona must create new jobs and attract industries that may not have a significant presence in Arizona while continuing to develop the industries that helped make our state great. We have a unique opportunity to create real net new sustainable employment, now it's time to leverage it. Silver City, New Mexico. He has not decided on a major but plans on attending college after high school.



Resolution Copper Project halts shaft development temporarily to make cooling, ventilation upgrades

SUPERIOR, Ariz., Oct. 14, 2013 -To upgrade ventilation and cooling of RCM shaft 10 and ensure the health and safety of employees and contractors, Resolution Copper Mining LLC (RCM) will place approximately 48 members of its contractor workforce on temporary leave while a construction and engineering solution is implemented and tested to increase cooling and ventilation to critical work areas within the shaft. The temporary reductions affect the project's contractor workforce. A crew of about 34 contractors will remain for shaft upkeep and maintenance.

The company anticipates that some workers will be recalled before the end of the year. The remainder are projected to be recalled by mid-2014 when shaft sinking is expected to resume.

"Temperatures in the

shaft are at about 116 degrees - too hot for comfort and safety - and humidity is at 100 percent. We are in the process of completing construction and engineering solutions to increase cooling and reduce temperatures that are acceptable and comfortable for our workforce," said Andrew Taplin, project director. "While this change is difficult for everyone, safety is our first priority and organizational value."

Taplin said the mine must ensure that contractors are safe and conditions are right before they return to work. The health and safety of Resolution Copper's workforce is the absolute, top priority.

The shaft-sinking work is an essential aspect of the project. It is the only way to gather critical information needed for future mine designs. Since 2008, the

company has been working with contractor Cementation to sink the #10 shaft to a depth of 6,943 feet below ground level. The current shaft bottom is at 6,630 feet.

"Resolution Copper is one of the most attractive, undeveloped copper deposits in the world. It is absolutely world class. It will bring benefits locally, regionally and to the state of Arizona, and we are committed to seeing it through," Taplin said. "We have invested

more than \$1 billion to date in the project. Most of that investment has been used to sink the exploratory shaft to full depth. Our contractor workforce has been working extremely hard to accomplish that goal, and nothing is more important than their health and safety. It is our primary focus, and we will not compromise or make exceptions in this area. When we have fully implemented and tested the construction and engineering changes to

the cooling system, all our contractors will be called

back to work, and the shaftsinking work will resume."

Bearcats defeat Panthers

The Bearcats were led by Dominic Bravo with 3 touchdowns on the night, including one on an 80-yard punt return. Robin Newman added two touchdowns and quarterback Destry Yocum had one touchdown on a 58-vard run. Newman finished the game with 11 carries for 77 yards.

For the Panthers, it was a difficult and emotional night. Starting quarterback Nicolaus Cruz left game early with a severe concussion. The loss of Cruz, who does it all for the Panthers, was difficult to overcome for a young Panthers' team.

"Once he was hurt the impact was felt," head coach Ryan Palmer said about the effect of Cruz's injury on the team.

Palmer said his team committed "too many turnovers" in the game to stay competitive with an experienced Bearcats' team.

WHEREAS the State Legislature has provided ar alternative method for calculation of the number of signatures required on nomination petitions for the offices of mayor and council at a town nonpartisar election; and WHEREAS, the Town has consolidated its elections with the state election cycle resulting in a potential significant increase in the number of signatures required on nomination petitions for town elections; and WHEREAS the Town finds that the adoption of the alternative allowed by state law may increase candidate participation; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE Town Council of the Town of Superior, as follows: THE NUMBER OF SIGNATURES REQUIRED ON NOMINATION PETITIONS FOR A CANDIDATE FOR THE OFFICE OF MAYOR OR COUNCIL SHALL BE ONE THOUSAND (1,000) SIGNATURES OF AT LEAST FIVE (5) PERCENT BUT NOT MORE THAN TEN (10) PERCENT OF THE VOTE FOR MAYOR IN THE LAST PRECEDING ELECTION AT WHICH A MAYOR WAS ELECTED, WHICHEVER IS LESS.
