United Steelworkers on strike

After a year of negotiations with ASARCO-Grupo Mexico, the United Steelworkers voted to strike. The official strike vote was announced late Friday evening.

Employees left their positions for the picket lines at 11 p.m. on Sunday, Oct. 13, 2019. The strike affects the Ray Pit, Hayden Smelter Complex, Silverbell operations and the Amarillo Refinery in Texas.

In addition to the United Steelworkers, the United Auto

Workers and the unions for machinists, electricians, operating engineers and boilermakers also went on strike.

ASARCO's best and final offer presented to the unions in early October froze pension plans, would have left twothirds of the workers without a raise and doubled the cost of the employee costs for healthcare. Despite a growing demand for copper that has increased the cost per pound, the employees have not seen a raise in nine years.

ASARCO released the following statement on Tuesday,

For eight years, local resident Chuco Waddell has helped low-income residents of Hayden-Winkelman – generously volunteering his time and tax preparation skills as a VITA

Local officials invite you to join them at the Hayden Senior Center Wednesday, Oct. 23, for 11 a.m. coffee and light refreshments – and chance to salute Chuco, meet other members of the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance team - and learn how this innovative program helps local residents. All are welcome!

Are you good with numbers? Why not volunteer with VITA! Consider this as a volunteer assignment – a 'desk job' helping low-income Gila County residents with paperwork, scheduled around your availability - and where you'll be part of an elite team helping secure more than \$1 million for taxpayers in your community.

And no, you don't have to a tax expert to join the Community Action Program's Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) team. "A new volunteer only needs to be friendly and willing to learn," said Dorine Prine, "no special experience is necessary -- training is provided for free, and at the volunteer's own pace. Once the training is completed, a VITA volunteer takes an openbook test to become IRS certified to prepare income taxes for

low income clients. Our volunteers contribute as many hours

as they have available, and on a schedule that is convenient to them.

Wonder if it's meaningful work – with a measurable benefit in your community? Prine reports Gila County's VITA team completed 758 income tax returns last year, 249 in Globe; 431 in Payson and 78 in Hayden. They helped secure a total amount of refunds of \$1,107,363 - and since their service is free, that saved low income taxpayers more than \$265,000 they would otherwise have paid in tax preparation fees – money they could use for groceries, car payments, utility bills or other daily essentials.

"And its definitely a fulfilling way to volunteer," said Prine. "VITA volunteers have told me they take satisfaction helping hard-working low-income clients receive the full amount of their tax refund, and avoid predatory lenders. They enjoy knowing this is a way to help make their community a better place. Some even volunteer in order to learn a trade they will be able to use in the future – and volunteering is a great asset to add to your resume."

Hayden outscores NFL Yet; No. 1 Williams visits next

The No. 4 Hayden football can't be blamed if it was perhaps looking ahead to this week's game at home against No. 1 Williams during its high-scoring affair on Homecoming last Friday night against NFL Yet Academy. The Lobos matched their season-high point total in a 60 – 42 victory.

"We played ok and got the win, considering all the distractions with Homecoming," Hayden head coach John

Estrada said. "Our young kids played a lot of minutes, which is always good."

Junior Manny Guillen, who replaced injured starting quarterback AJ Castillo, threw four touchdown passes in the win, including three to senior Vincente Aguirre and another to Gibby Carmelo. Vincente also returned one of his two interceptions 56 yards for a defensive score. Senior running back Jorge Rodriguez rushed for three touchdowns, including one for 80 yards and another for 30 yards.

If Estrada thought Homecoming was a distraction, he'll

have another – and maybe two – this week on Senior Night with the top-ranked Vikings coming to town in what could be the first of two meetings between the teams this season.

"We'll need to play our best game of the season to beat them," Estrada said. "It's been a challenge throughout the season with multiple injuries. We'll give them all we've got."

Five²: Superior clinches region title, possesses Copper Helmet for fifth time in five years

The now No. 3-ranked Superior football team defeated Ray last Friday night, 54 – 6, clinching both the 1A East Region Championship and possession of The Copper Helmet for a fifth-consecutive season.

"Winning [both] five years in-a-row just speaks volumes," Superior head coach Ryan Palmer told Copper Area News afterwards. "I couldn't be prouder of the kids and the alumni who set the standard of excellence."

Superior scored early and often against an undermanned Ray team that dressed only 12 players against the defending state champs. Sophomore quarterback Matthew Cruz threw five touchdown passes, including two in the opening quarter to junior Adam Navarette, who added a rushing touchdown in the game's first 12 minutes to give the Panthers a commanding 22 – 0 lead.

The same duo would connect for another touchdown during the first two-and-a-half minutes of the second quarter before Cruz threw another to senior Sammy

Lopez. Gabe Otero, a senior, added a rushing touchdown before halftime, extending the Panthers lead to 46 – 0 when the teams headed to the locker rooms.

"The offensive line was good for me tonight," said Cruz, who completed 9-of-15 for 136 yards. "Adam stepped up when he needed to; it was a great team win."

Navarrette totaled 132 all-purpose yards with four touchdowns - three receiving and one rushing. He had three receptions in the game, all for touchdowns.

"I was just prepared," Navarrette answered when asked about his success in the game. "The offensive line was getting great blocks, the receivers were (making) great blocks, and without them I wouldn't have been able to do anything."

Ray scored its lone touchdown on a 74-yard pass from junior Alex Bravo to senior Eric Manriquez with 4:22 left in the third quarter.

"We realized their cornerbacks were playing closer than usual, so we keyed off that and Eric made a little move, got open, and it was there," explained Bravo.
