Hayden defeats rival Bearcats; playoffs next for both

The No. 8-ranked Hayden football team defeated its rival, the seventh-ranked Ray Bearcats, last Friday night in a come-from-behind 20 – 14 victory.

The Lobos were punched “in the mouth” at the start by the Bearcats, according to Hayden head coach John Estrada.

“We came out really flat and made a lot of mistakes,” Estrada told the Copper Basin News. “We stuck to our game plan, made some adjustments at half time, and finished very strong.”

“I was very proud of our kids,” he added. “They kept their composure and kept playing hard. The tables turned in the

second half and the Bearcats didn’t have an answer.”

After their loss last week to Ft. Thomas, the Lobos were playing a nearly must-win game versus Ray for more than one reason.

“It was a big game for us,” Estrada said. “Not only win and make it to the playoffs, but more because it was the Ray Bearcats. Our boys proved they are resilient by coming back from a 14-point deficit. They kept playing hard and got the job done.”

The Lobos’ win sets up a rematch with No. 9 Ft Thomas, a team they played just two weeks ago in a 56 – 42 defeat.

"It could go either way," Estrada answered. "It's the playoffs; the team that wants it more will come out victorious."

Romero, Coleman lead Bearcat runners

The Ray cross-country team, led by Phillip Romero and Dallin Coleman, will finish its regular season this Friday at Globe before preparing for next week's Sectional Championship in Gilbert.

A team of typically six runners, sometimes eight – four freshman, two sophomores and two seniors – depending on the football team's schedule, has a chance to follow a great regular season by making history.

"I am excited this year as it is our third season since beginning the program," Ray head coach Brian Colerman wrote in an email to Copper Basin News. "I am optimistic if everyone runs their race we stand a chance to qualify (for state) as a team for the first time in Bearcats' history." It won't be easy, but nothing worth achieving ever is.

The Cats' competition includes several other small schools around the state, including "an extremely tough section," according to Coleman.

Romero, a sophomore, is in his second year of competition and has a chance to qualify for state as an individual. Dallin Coleman, a freshman, has an equal chance to qualify individually.

The Cats find strength in numbers, as senior teammates Chandler Coleman and Dyllin Lopez as well as sophomore Luke Warren and freshmen Matt Rutter, Saul Torres and Eric Kelley have each also enjoyed turns at leading the team.

"(It) keeps me guessing as to who will beat who each week," the Cats' head coach said. "The plus to this is a great pack time for these boys. That is always a strong point when it comes to placing as a team."

The sectional meet is scheduled for Oct. 27 at Crossroads

"I am really excited to work with this group and look forward to these young athletes having great careers throughout their high school years," Coleman said.
