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Big win for the Lobos puts them in the #1 position

What a win! What a win!

Last Friday, the Hayden football team ended its regular season with a game against St. David. The Lobos closed out the night with a victory, putting their regular season to an end with a perfect 9-0 record.

Hayden led the first quarter, 14-6, with touchdown passes thrown from Fabian Elvira, one to Isaac Castillo

for 19 yards, and one to Brandon Garner for 78 yards.

The second quarter was a defensive battle with the Tigers scoring their only touchdown, and the Lobos taking a 14-12 lead by halftime.

The third quarter continued to be a defensive game, with St. David's offense keeping the ball away from the Lobos, and scoring a touchdown, taking a 19-14 score into the fourth quarter. The Lobos marched down the field, and scored on a 5-yard pass from Fabian Elvira to Moraes Cruz to take the score to a 20-19 lead.

Hayden's defense, who's been strong all year, answered the call and stopped St. David's offense, and gave the Lobos back the ball with 8 minutes left. The Lobos offense went back on the field and worked their way down the field, 80 yards with strong running from Deondre Collier and Cruz. The boys' offense sealed the game when Cruz scored on 3-yard run and with Garner catching the 2-point conversion from Elvira, giving the Lobos a 28-19 victory over St. David.

The Lobos will receive a bye for the first round of the playoffs, and play the winner of the San Manuel V. Superior round one game, on Friday, Oct. 28.

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) requires Pinal County to publish an Annual Action Plan outlining the use of HUD funds for the Community Development Block Grant Program (CDBG), HOME Investment Partnership (HOME), and Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) funds.

Pinal County, in conjunction with the cities of Eloy, Florence, Mammoth, and Maricopa would like to invite you to a public meeting. The meetings are to solicit ideas for potential projects. All Pinal County citizens are invited to voice their comments regarding housing and community development needs, strategies to meet identified needs, and identifying barriers to those needs. Public input is an essential component of this planning effort. CDBG projects must benefit low to moderate income residents and address one of the national objectives of the CDBG program. Sample projects include public facilities, infrastructure, housing, and public services. HOME projects must provide housing opportunities for low and moderate income residents. Sample projects include owner-occupied housing rehabilitation, down-payment assistance, and housing development. ESG projects must benefit persons experiencing homelessness or at-risk of homelessness. Sample projects include homelessness prevention and rapid re-housing.

For the fiscal year 2023, Pinal County will receive approximately \$2 million in CDBG funding, \$650,000 in HOME funding, and \$150,000 in ESG funding.
