# Superior Superintendent Urges 'Yes' Vote on Two Propositions

he Nov. 3 ballot contains two items (Prop 447/Prop 448) for the Superior Unified School District.

Prop 447 is a continuation of the budget override for the Maintenance and Operations budget. This money directly supports the day-to-day operations of the schools and their programs. This budget override has been in place for over 20 years and is necessary for the District to operate at its current levels. An antiquated state funding formula and declining enrollment have made it necessary to pass budget overrides. A "yes" vote on prop 447 will allow the District to continue to support our students and programs.

Prop 448 on the ballot is the sale of the Old Harding Building (Bus Barn) and 40 acres of land across from the Highlands to the west of Golf Course Rd. The District is asking the Superior Community for the right to put those properties up for sale or lease. The Superior Unified School District Governing Board believes the sale of these properties could not only provide economic growth for the Town but also be used to attract more families into Superior. Any future potential sale would need to be approved by the Governing Board. All proceeds from the lease or sale of these properties must be used for capital



improvements or to pay down debt. A "yes" vote on Prop 448 will authorize the sale or lease of these properties. Both Prop 447 and Prop 448 are located on the back of





Copper Area News is committed to providing our readers with as much information as possible. We post a daily update on our Facebook page with the total positive COVID-19 Data. This graph shows the daily counts of positive cases for the past week as of press time on Oct. 20, 2020.

There are a few points we would like our readers to consider when following this data.

1. This will continue to be a rolling total of positive cases. It does not reflect recoveries or deaths. The Arizona Department of Health Services does not break out this data. 2. If you see a reduction in numbers from day to day it is most likely due to a data entry error or mis-coding of a zip code (at the state level). 3. This is all zip code based data; most of our zip codes include unincorporated areas. There is no way to track exactly which areas each of the positive cases are. Example, Kearny and Winkelman each have small communities in their zip code that are not in the Town's incorporated boundaries.

4. If you live in Gila County, please follow the Gila County Health and Emergency Management, Facebook. They have maintained their data on recoveries and current positive cases.

5. You can follow other data such as ICU bed use, Ventilator use and hospital capacity online: https://bit.ly/3inh280

Working together, we can slow the spread of the virus across the Copper Corridor. Wear a mask in public, remain physically distant (6 feet apart or more), practice good hygiene (wash your hands frequently, sanitize high touch areas) and stay home if you are not feeling well.

# Superior not challenged by Cicero Prep in romp

For the third-straight week, it was a short night for the Superior football team's starters as the Panthers outscored Cicero Prep Academy 32 - 6 in the first quarter on their way to 79 - 6 victory last Friday night in Scottsdale.

"We have a talented team that is yet to play our best game," Superior head coach Ryan Palmer said afterwards. "Our potential is high, and we will continue to strive towards achieving our goals."

The Panthers' starting offense has yet to play more than a half in any of their first three games, but the players are still piling up prolific numbers. Friday night, the starters played about a quarter-and-a-half. Junior quarterback Matthew Cruz completed six passes, five for touchdowns and senior receiver Josh Marquez had three receptions, all of them for scores.

"Josh has good size and speed, he is capable of a big play every time he gets his hands on the ball," Palmer said about Marquez' performance in Friday's win. "He ran some nice routes and made the most of his targets."

Senior running back Matthew Diaz-Gonzalez averaged nearly 10 yards per carry with a touchdown. Senior receiver Nathan Duarte hauled in a 57-yard touchdown reception. Senior superathlete Adam Navarrette totaled 139 yards of offense on four rushes and a pair of receptions, which is an average of more than 23 yards every time he touched the ball on offense. Of course, that is in addition to a 28-yard kickoff return and two punt returns totaling 49 yards.

"My philosophy is that once we hit a running clock, the less experienced players get to show what they can do," Palmer said about the starters' limited playing time to this point of the season. "We do not have a large enough enrollment for a JV team, so the second half of these games gives those players valuable game experience.

"A lot of the starters now, played in those second-half running-clock games when they were freshmen and sophomores." Freshman running back David Drennan was one of the players that showed what

he can do after the starters exited, rushing for 80 yards and three touchdowns on just three rushing attempts.

Defensively, senior Marc Mendoza led the Panthers with eight tackles, including one-and-a-half of the team's four sacks in the game. Senior Matthew Perez had an interception and sophomore Zachery Duarte contributed with five tackles and one-and-a-half sacks.

There's isn't much to complain about with an undefeated record, but the Panthers haven't been tested, and doing so in the playoffs could be a risky proposition.

"It's tough balancing game experience and conditioning with sportsmanship," answered Palmer, when asked if he has any concern about his starting lineup getting enough work.

With a win this Friday at home against undefeated Tempe Prep, the Panthers will clinch their sixth-straight region title and one of the top-four seeds in the state playoffs that start next month. **Up next:** Friday, Oct. 23, vs. Tempe Prep. Kickoff is scheduled for 7 p.m.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF SUPERIOR AMENDING SECTIONS 5-2-1 and 5-2-3 OF THE SUPERIOR TOWN CODE AND DECLARING AN EFFECTIVE DATE WHEREAS, said Town Building and Safety Codes are in need of substantial revision to meet changed conditions and to conform to existing laws; and WHEREAS, said This Ordinance shall take effect 30 days from the date passed and adopted by the Town Council of the Town of Superior; and **BE** IT ORDAINED by the Town Council of the Town of Superior, Arizona, that the Code of Ordinances of the Town of Superior, Arizona, are amended to read as follows: SECTION I: Section 5-2-1 of the Superior Town Code is amended as follows: Section 5-2-1 Adoption of International Fire Code. The "International Fire Code" 2018 Edition, prepared and published by the International Code Council, shall be the Fire Code of the Town of Superior. SECTION II: Section 5-2-3 of the Superior Town Code is hereby amended as follows: Section 5-2-3 Local Amendments to International Fire Code Amend Section 101 General by replacing [name of jurisdiction] with "Town of Superior" Amend Section 903.2.8.2 Care facilities by removing the word "shall" and replace with "may". Amend Section 5607.3 Blasting in congested areas, by deleting the last sentence and adding the following subsections: Section 5607.3.1 Testing. Seismic and air blasting testing shall be conducted by an independent testing agency and the results recorded in the blasting log for each blast. Tests may be waived for distances greater brook and the blasting log for Cacher blast, registing by the damage to adjoining property from the blasts. Section 5607.3.2 Blasting Mats. When blasting within 500 property from the blasts. Section 5607.3.2 Blasting Mats. When blasting within 500 feet of a structure, Blasting mats shall be used to prevent fragments from being thrown. Mats may be required at distances exceeding 500 feet if the code official determines that further precautions are necessary to protect adjoining properties. Section 5607.3.3 Notification. When blasting within 1000 feet of an occupied structure occupants shall be notified in writing no less than 48 hours and no more than 5 days prior to the blast. A copy of the notification shall be submitted to the code official at the same time as the occupants. Amend Section 5607.4 Restricted hours, by adding the following after the last Sentence: "No blasting shall be conducted on weekends or holidays." Add a new Section 5607.16 as follows: Section 5607.16 Blasting Logs. For all blasts within 1000 feet of a structure a detailed blasting log shall be maintained. The log shall be submitted to the code official within five days after the last blast authorized by the permit or upon expiration of the permit. For blasting within 500 feet of a structure, a copy of the log shall be submitted to the code official prior to the next blast. The code official shall review the log to determine that all blasting operations have been in compliance with this code. Subsequent blasting shall not be performed without permission from the code official.

- The log shall contain the following information: A copy of the approved permit and blasting plan
- The location of the blasting operation
- The date and time of each blasting occurrence
- If blasting mates or other cover was used
- A copy of the seismic readings and information on who conducted the tests Any and all known damage or injury that occurred as a result of the blast. If there
- was none, then that shall be stated Any other information the code official may require to demonstrate compliance

with this ordinance Failure to comply with the provisions of this section may result in revocation of the blasting permit. SECTION III: All other ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance or any part of the codes adopted herein by reference and are hereby repealed. SECTION IV: If any section, subsection, sentence, phrase, clause or portion of this ordinance, or any part of the codes or regulations adopted herein by reference is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of by reference is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decisions shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof. 
