New federal requirements for CDL applicants coming in February; applicants must be trained by a registered provider



Beginning Feb. 7, 2022, the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) will require new commercial driver license (CDL) applicants and those seeking to upgrade their CDL to receive training from a certified organization on the national registry of Entry-Level Driver Training (ELDT) providers.

ELDT training includes curriculum in three areas: theory, range and road. To process and issue a CDL, the Arizona Department of Transportation Motor Vehicle Division will need to validate that an applicant has completed these training requirements.

This requirement impacts drivers attempting to:

- Obtain a Class A or Class B commercial driver's license

(CDL) for the first time.

- Upgrade an existing Class B CDL to a Class A CDL.
- Obtain a school bus (S), passenger (P), or hazardous materials (H) endorsement for the first time.

The ELDT regulations are not retroactive and do not apply to individuals holding a valid CDL or an S, P, or H endorsement issued prior to Feb. 7, 2022.

If an organization or business currently trains its drivers and is interested in becoming a certified training provider on the national registry, visit tpr.fmcas.dot.gov to learn how to register as a provider.

Now that there is a loosening up of COVID-19 restrictions, parties are being planned to take the Copper Corridor through the "cold" months. Hayden and Winkelman are kicking it off for locals with Halloween Fun Night, which will be held on Thursday, Oct. 28, at the Hayden-Winkelman Lalo Serrano Stadium starting at 5 p.m. and stretching into the wee, but not too wee hour of 8 p.m.

Three hours of games, food, a hayride, pumpkin painting, a costume contests, photo booth, petting zoo, the styling tunes of DJ Mr. Luke Music and more.

Regular sized nachos, the petting zoo, and caramel apples will be \$2. Candy apples, all drinks (soda, water, hot cocoa, tea), popcorn ball and hot dog will cost \$1 per item.

All of the above is meant for friendly and family fun and not for shivers up the spine. Despite the season and the association, by mention of prices, the petting zoo is not "an evil petting zoo" and all persons are requested not to get confused on the issues of caramel apples being used for petting or what sort of hot dog they can bite into for \$1.

Recently, State and National media have reported an increase in positive COVID-19 Cases. The communities of the Copper Corridor have also started to see an increase in positive cases. The new Delta variant of COVID-19 has been reported as highly transmissible. The CDC and other health officials warn that those who are not vaccinated should continue to practice physical distancing, wear masks in public and avoid crowded places and is also strongly recommending everyone wear a mask indoors and in group settings.

Governor Doug Ducey has signed executive orders that prohibit Cities and Towns from mandating mask wearing, limiting restaurant capacity or other enacting other physical distancing requirements. At this time there is no indication that there will be any restrictions put into place. Local schools are also prohibited from requiring masks be worn on campus.

COVID Vaccines are readily available at local clinics in the region including Cobre Valley Clinics in Superior and Kearny, Pinal County Public Health and Sun Life Clinics. Other chain pharmacies such as Walgreens, grocery story pharmacies and CVS also have vaccines available.

We last reported daily COVID-19 case increased on Oct. 11, 2021. Above is a chart showing our last reported number and the current number of total cases for each of the Copper Corridor communities through Oct. 25, 2021. Keep in mind that zip code data also includes unincorporated areas around a community. For instance, Riverside/Kelvin area is included in the Kearny zip code. Aravaipa and Dudleyville are included in the Winkelman zip codes, etc.

Those experiencing COVID-19 symptoms should seek testing and quarantine until they can confirm a negative test.

Working together, we can slow the spread of the virus across the Copper Corridor. Wear a mask in public, remain physically distant (6ft apart or more), practice good hygiene (wash your hands frequently, sanitize high touch areas) and stay home if you are not feeling well.
