One killed, one injured in hit and run accident; information sought on identity of car driver, passenger

Winkelman, AZ – The Pinal County Attorney's Office and Arizona Department of Public Safety are asking for help from the public in identifying two young males who walked away from a fatal collision on Highway 77 between

Mammoth and Winkelman on Sunday, Sept. 29, 2013.

According to a spokesperson for the County Attorney's Office, the collision occurred at 8:30 a.m. A Dodge Intrepid and a Harley Davidson motorcycle collided approximately 10 miles

south of Winkelman. The collision resulted in the death of a woman believed to be in her 50s/60s. A male, also in his 50s/60s, sustained severe life threatening injuries.

The occupants of the Intrepid appear to have walked away from the

scene.

Authorities are asking that any member of the public with information about the accident or having seen two young males in shorts and t-shirts on foot in that vicinity should contact AZ Department of Public Safety by calling 9-1-1.

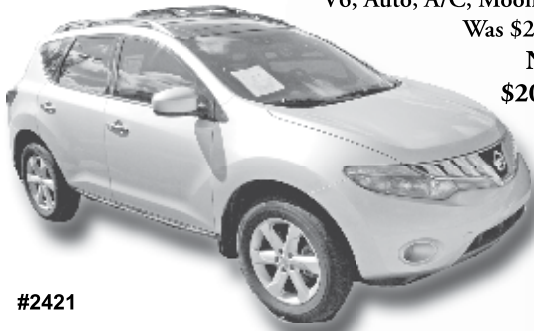

Army Corps of Engineers

The US Army Corps of Engineers began the public participation process for the development of the ASARCO tailings expansion. ASARCO has identified state trust land in the Ripsey Wash area as the future tailings pond. The process to

begin selecting and permitting tailings sites for ASARCO has begun, in anticipation for the closure of the Elder Gulch tailings site. ASARCO officials explained that the Elder Gulch tailings pond has six to ten years left, before they exceed the height limits.

Officials from ASARCO

explained that the company had explored other areas including Granite Mountain, Copper Butte, Devil's Canyon and areas behind Hayden. Ripsey Wash was chosen as the site due to its proximity to the Ray pit mine, the hydrology and geology of the area. The site once permitted will require the Kelvin-Florence Highway and the Arizona Trail to be rerouted and will also require the relocation of a Salt River Project power line. The tailings site will be located close to the A-Diamond Ranch and will be transported by a

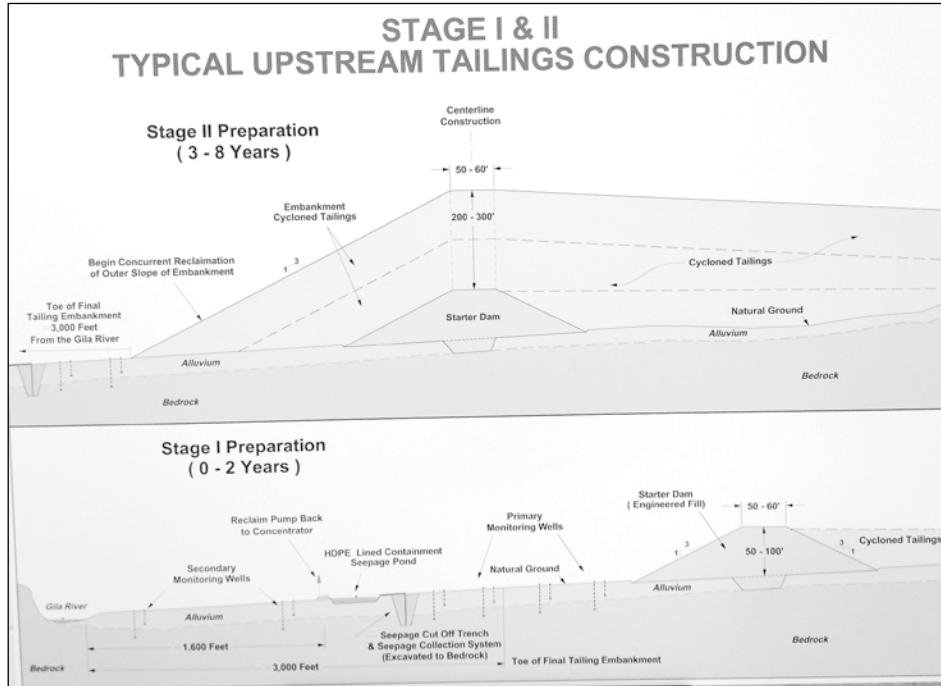

Economic Development Council, ASARCO, the proposed Apache Sky Casino and the Towns of Winkelman and Kearny to participate in the planning process. The update to the general plan is required by the State of Arizona; the plan will help the town to plan for future development and set development goals for the community.

The council also approved town staff to purchase a backhoe in the amount of \$98,610, and authorized the Town Manager to sign a contract with the lowest responsible bidder to replace the town hall roof. The council also approved a resolution to endorse the Gila County half cent sales tax for transportation ballot initiative.

Mayor Charles "Chale" Vega introduced the proposed Code of Ethics for the Town of Hayden. The Code will create a policy for the Town of Hayden, Staff Council and Advisory Board Members to uphold, promote and demand the highest standards of ethics from all of its officials. Approval of the Code of Ethics was tabled.

begin permitting process for ASARCO tailings



slurry pipeline that will be constructed along the Kelvin-Florence Highway.

Ripsey Wash is a tributary to the Gila River and in order to protect the Gila River, ASARCO will construct a seepage dam that will allow any runoff water from the tailings to be stored on the tailings site then pumped

back to the pit. Once the water reaches the pit it will be processed through wastewater treatment plants and will then be reused for mine operations. This process will be required to keep the Gila River from being contaminated.

The Army Corps of Engineers conducted the

public permitting process, which explained all of the permits and public participation processes that will have to occur before final approval is given to construct the tailings site. The Corps expect to have a draft Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) by September of 2014 and by October of 2015 they expect to have a decision statement.

The studies and public participation facilitated by the Army Corps of Engineers will determine if the site can be permitted for tailings. Their permitting process will address all direct, indirect and cumulative impacts to

the area. Those impacts will include environmental impacts, socioeconomic and wildlife impacts. After the permitting process is complete the Corps may decide not to take any action or make any recommendations, they may accept the permit or they may approve and request other mitigation efforts to take place.

Several members of the public attended the meeting, however comments made by members of the public were not stated publicly. Those speaking were

St. Joseph's History: A new church

As I was gathering information for this piece I talked with Msg. Raul Trevizo, who was raised in Hayden. He described the history of St. Joseph's Parish as a trinity... The Founding, The New Church and The Remodeling. The three were equally important to help build and blend the parish into what it is today. This is the second and third installments of the trinity.

The New Church

A few years after Fr.

Machain came to the parish, it was decided that a new church should be built. The existing St. Joseph had served the Catholic faithful for more than 40 years, but the cost of maintaining and repairing the old building was climbing each year.

A site was selected and construction began. The new church would sit high on a hill on Mountain View just off Hwy 177 overlooking the Gila Valley below. The original plans called for a modern fan shaped building with a

basement that would house a parish hall and kitchen. But those plans were changed much to the surprise of the parishioners who were hard at work raising funds for the building.

After the top of hill was leveled and the basement was dug out, orders came from the Diocesan Office of Property and Planning to fill the hole back in and the plans were being changed. It wasn't known at the time why, but later it was discovered that the changes were thanks

to a certain person in that office who was embezzling funds. He skimmed off the differences in the original costs and pocketed the money. Two other parishes in the Diocese also fell victim to this scheme. The person was eventually caught and served time, but unfortunately not before the buildings were well on the way to completion.

The first Mass at the new St. Joseph was held in December of 1974 and the church was officially dedicated on Mar. 16, 1975

with the most Rev. Bishop Francis Green officiating. Fr. Machain wanted to give everyone before some time to get acquainted with the new building to see how things worked before the dedication.

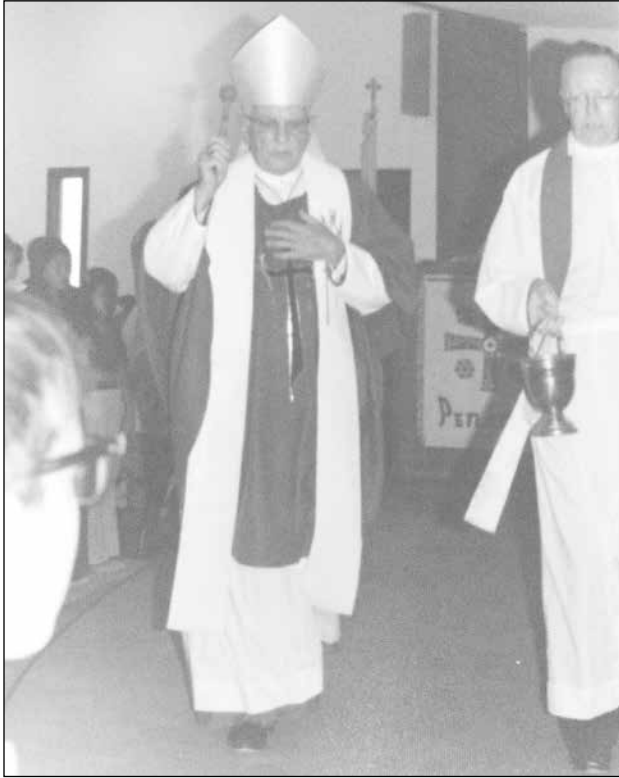
Finishing work still had to be done on the structure and landscaping and road improvements were needed. Fr. Machain praised the new church's versatility, saying that a soundproof screen could be used to divide the main room into a parish hall and a worship area. The altar, pulpit and lectern were in the middle of the room.

Other features included a prayer room, offices, a confessional, storerooms, a kitchen and a dining area. In

addition, Fr. hoped to have a new rectory built. The parish had raised \$175,000 of the church's costs and was built by the Matt Lang Construction Co. of Tucson. It was designed by architect Jim Smith, also of Tucson. Worship services at the old St. Joseph's ended with the opening of the new church but the facilities were still used for church functions and as a youth ministry center for awhile.

In the meantime, plans were being made for the fate of the Our Lady of Guadalupe. It was to be demolished but not forgotten. The mission became a pile of rubble and the old church in Hayden was abandoned but the heart of the

buildings live on.

Fr. Bryan Sherry, who came to Hayden in 1976, said at the time he didn't think the people would mind as long as the cherished symbols were moved.

The life sized statue of Our Lady of Guadalupe which was

located above the main altar was installed in the sanctuary of the new church and the life size crucifix of Christ from the Hayden church was placed opposite the statue. Also moved were the bells from both buildings and they still ring out to call worshippers

from high on the hill.

By moving the bells and the statues to the new church "the past is included in present tradition."

Before Fr. Sherry arrived at St. Joseph's Fr. Joseph Bartos served the parish for a short time. Fr. Ed Carscallen followed Fr. Sherry and other priests were between October of 1983 and June of 2001 included Fr. Leopold Gleissner, Fr. Kevin Clinch (who served for 12 years), and Fr. Larry Kasper.

The Remodeling

Soon after Fr. Dale Branson arrived at St. Joseph's in July of 2001, he began formulating plans to update the church to make it more usable and comfortable. His enthusiasm

got the people excited and many projects were completed during his 10 year stay at the parish.

The folding doors behind the back altar were replaced with a solid wall and a door opening. The Blessed Sacrament Chapel was created, the rails to the altar were constructed and the interior of the church was painted with murals by local artist Wanda Mitchell-Tucker.

New lighting was installed to highlight the statues and artwork. Stained glass windows replaced the old windows and new doors were also installed.

The most enthusiasm came when new padded pews replaced the old folding chairs

and a steeple went up on the roof of the building.

As one parishioner said, "He turned a funeral home into a church," and another said, "Now it's a Church."

Fr. Robert Rodriguez came to the parish in November of 2011 and did a little remodeling of his own by expanding the office areas and adding more space to the religious gift shop.

Fr. Robert left in June of 2013 and the parish is now ministered to by Fr. Matthew Thayil, a missionary from India. So it has gone full circle in the last 100 years, a parish founded by a missionary is now again served by a missionary.

Many sacraments have

been given and received at St. Joseph's many buildings over the years, some of these buildings are gone, but the spirit of the people remain strong in their belief in their parish. As Fr. Thayil says, "It's not the church building that makes the parish, it's the people."

I want to acknowledge Homer Ortega for providing such great material and pictures, Msg. Raul Trevizo and Fr. Dale Branson for allowing me to pick their brains and most of all Fr. Anastasio G. Font, OCD, who did the research and put together the booklet called Carmelites Among the Miners where the majority of my information came from.

Bearcats top Apaches to extend win streak to five

The Ray Bearcats extended their winning streak by beating the Ft. Thomas Apaches 62-14 last Friday night.

The Apaches started the night holding the Bearcats on their first offensive possession forcing them to turn the ball over on downs. Going with a no huddle offense the Apaches wasted no time taking the lead on the 4th ranked Bearcats as they drove 60 yards in just five plays as the Apache quarterback found his receiver wide open in the back of the endzone for the

first score of the game. The two point attempt failed giving the Apaches a 6-0 lead. The lead did not last long for the Apaches as the Bearcats came right back on their next possession to take the lead on the first of two rushing touchdowns on the night for quarterback Destry Yocum. That would be the first of 50 unanswered points in the first half by the Bearcats. The two point conversion attempt was successful slightly cutting into the Bearcat lead. The Bearcats added one more score in the third quarter on

a 2 yard touchdown run by running back Robin Newman to put the Bearcats up 56-14 heading into the final quarter of play.

As the clock continued to run turnovers by both teams kept the fourth quarter scoreless until the final seconds of the game when Austin Huffman took a Lorona handoff and scrambled 70 yards for the score as time expired giving the Bearcats a 62-14 victory.

The Bearcats offensively compiled over 400 yards of total offense. On the passing end of the game Yocum completed 15-24 passes for 189

yards and 2 TD the Bearcat quarterback also ran for 67 yards on 6 carries and 2 TD. Newman rushed for 31 yards on 5 carries and 1 TD and caught 4 passes for 22 yards. Leading the receiving core was Bravo who had 8 catches for 145 yards and 3 TD. Seth Harmon had 3 catches for 22 yards.

Defensively the Bearcats dominated the Apaches holding them to under 150 yards of total offense and forcing 7 turnovers (1 fumble, 6 Interceptions). Leading tacklers for the Bearcats were Bravo and Yocum with 6 tackles each

both also had interceptions Bravo (2) Yocum (1). Ryan Bickley and Julio Noriega each had 5 tackles and 1 sack each. Jacob Pace with 4 tackles. Newman, Huffman, Lorona, and Harmon each had 2 tackles. Harmon (2) and Lorona (1) also had interceptions.

With the victory the Bearcats improved to (5-0) on the year setting up a showdown with undefeated Pima (5-0) this Friday at Dave Mcfee Memorial Stadium. This should be an intense and exciting game so please come out and show your support.
