

# SaddleBrooke burglary suspect taken into custody

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located at 38725 S. Mountain View Blvd., regarding a burglary which had occurred sometime during the evening.

When deputies arrived on scene, it was determined suspect(s) unknown had forced entry into a storage room at the complex sometime during the evening. Once inside, the suspect(s) had stolen three new 55 inch televisions which were still in their boxes. Each television was valued at approximately \$1,000.

According to the reporting party, employees had moved 11 new televisions into the storage room two weeks prior.

PCSO Property Crime detectives were assigned the case. Detectives felt this burglary was possibly done by an employee who moved the televisions. The televisions, the reasoned, were not visible from outside of the storage room and only the individuals who moved them into the room knew about them being in there. On Sept. 19, 2013, detectives spoke with

an employee identified as Rudy Leeth, 35, San Manuel, at his residence. Rudy was one of the

employees who helped move the televisions into the storage room. Rudy was evasive in his answers and denied being involved with the burglary.

"After speaking with Rudy," Pinal County Sheriff Paul Babeu said, "detectives watched him leave the residence and go to work. Detectives then knocked on the door of the residence and spoke with his father who was home. They asked him if Rudy had a 55 inch television which he brought home recently. The father said his son did have one and proceeded to show the detectives the television. The serial number on the television matched one of the televisions which had been stolen from the storage room."



Detectives then went to the SaddleBrooke Country Club and arrested Leeth for burglary. Leeth admitted to committing the burglary and stealing one of the televisions, according to the Pinal County Sheriff's Office Public Information Officer Tim Gaffney. Leeth was booked into the Pinal County Adult Detention Center for burglary, theft and possession of stolen property. The investigation is still active as detectives are trying to determine if other suspects were involved and where the other two missing televisions are.

### One killed, one injured in hit and run accident

Winkelman, AZ – The Pinal County Attorney's Office and Arizona Department of Public Safety are asking for help from the public in identifying two young males who walked away from a fatal collision on Highway 77 between Mammoth and Winkelman on Sunday, Sept. 29, 2013. According to a spokesperson for the County Attorney's Office, the collision occurred at 8:30 a.m. A Dodge Intrepid and a Harley Davidson motorcycle collided approximately 10 miles south of Winkelman. The collision resulted in the death of a woman believed to be in her 50s/60s. A male, also in his 50s/60s, sustained severe life threatening injuries. The occupants of the Intrepid appear to have walked away from the scene.

Authorities are asking that any member of the public with information about the accident or having seen two young males in shorts and t-shirts on foot in that vicinity should contact AZ Department of Public Safety by calling 9-1-1. Pinal County Attorney Lando Voyles said, "When innocent life is snatched from a family and a community, it's a moral and legal duty for those with knowledge to call authorities to help bring justice to all of us." At press time, no other information was available. A possible reward is being offered for information leading to the identity of the two young men who walked away from the accident. 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### Army Corps of Engineers begin permitting process for ASARCO tailings

**By Mila Besich Lira** *Copper Area News* The US Army Corps of Engineers began the public participation process for the development of the ASARCO tailings expansion. ASARCO has identified state trust land

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
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in the Ripsey Wash area as the future tailings pond. The process to begin selecting and permitting tailings sites for ASARCO has begun, in anticipation for the closure of the Elder Gulch tailings site. ASARCO officials explained that the Elder Gulch tailings pond has six to ten years left, before they exceed the height limits.

Officials from ASARCO explained that the company had explored other areas including Granite Mountain, Copper Butte, Devil's Canyon and areas behind Hayden. Ripsey Wash was chosen as the site due to its proximity to the Ray pit mine, the hydrology and geology of the area. The site once permitted will require the Kelvin-Florence Highway and the Arizona Trail to be rerouted and will also require the relocation of a Salt River Project power line. The tailings site will be located close to the A-Diamond Ranch and will be transported by a slurry pipeline that will be constructed along the



Kelvin-Florence Highway. Ripsey Wash is a tributary to the Gila River and in order to protect the Gila River, ASARCO will construct a seepage dam that will allow any runoff water from the tailings to be stored on the tailings site then pumped back to the pit. Once the water reaches the pit it will be processed



through wastewater treatment plants and will then be reused for mine operations. This process will be required to keep the Gila River from being contaminated.

The Army Corps of Engineers conducted the public permitting process, which explained all of the permits and public participation processes that will have to occur before final approval is given to construct the tailings site. The Corps expect to have a draft Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) by September of 2014 and by October of 2015 they expect to have a decision statement.

The studies and public participation facilitated by the Army Corps of Engineers will determine if the site can be permitted for tailings. Their permitting process will address all direct, indirect and cumulative impacts to the area. Those impacts will include environmental impacts, socioeconomic and wildlife impacts. After the permitting process is complete the Corps may decide not to take any action or make any recommendations, they may accept the permit or they may approve and request other mitigation efforts to take place.

Several members of the public attended the meeting, however comments made by members of the public were not stated publicly. Those speaking were encouraged to record their comments with the court reporter assigned to the public hearing. See more photos online at http://bit.ly/17pgpSS. **By John Hernandez** Copper Area News A replacement project for the Aravaipa Creek Bridge has been planned by the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT). The bridge located on State Route 77 is approximately 10 miles north of Mammoth between mile marker 123 and 124 in Pinal County. The project will also include minor roadway improvements between the mile markers.

The Aravaipa Creek Bridge replacement project is scheduled to begin this fall. ADOT plans include widening the bridge and replacing the piers, bridge deck and abutments. Construction is expected to take approximately 12 months to complete and will be done in two phases. This will allow traffic to be maintained during construction. During the project construction, temporary

traffic signals will be installed at both ends of the bridge and will be adjusted periodically to allow efficient movement of traffic across the bridge. There will be one travel lane open at all times with traffic controls in place to allow alternating north and southbound traffic. Drivers should expect delays of five to ten minutes but no more than 15 minutes throughout the construction.



### Oracle State Park re-opens for weekends October through April

Oracle State Park Center for Environmental Education will re-open to the public on Saturdays and Sundays starting on Saturday, Oct. 5, 2013 from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. The park's fall and winter season will last until Sunday, April 27, 2014. The park will hold events during their season and will also have school programs by reservation and be open for tours of the Kannally Ranch House and hiking on the weekends.

Opening weekend Hummingbird Program and Guided Sunset Bird Walk on Saturday. Oct. 5: Naturalist Kathe Anderson leads the Bird Walk. It is free with park admission, but a reservation is required by calling 520-896-2425. The program begins at 3:30 p.m. in the living room of the Kannally Ranch House, followed by a guided Sunset Bird Walk until 6 p.m. (Please note: the park entrance gate closes at 5 p.m., but the exit gate will remain open until the end of the bird walk.)

The program will feature a 30-minute video focusing on identifying the dozen or so hummingbirds that visit or reside in Arizona, including segments on nesting and "singing" hummingbirds, with stunning photography. The balance of the program will be an interactive question and answer session, with a handout listing some of the best places to see hummingbirds in Arizona. Birding and Breakfast on Sunday, Oct. 6: Enjoy an early morning guided bird walk with naturalist, Kathe Anderson, followed by a light breakfast on the patios of the ranch house, while participants finalize the list of morning

sightings. Breakfast hospitality is courtesy of the Friends of Oracle State Park, who are planning the menu. The Bird Walk will begin at 7 a.m., so a reservation is required, since it begins one hour before the park entrance gates open to the

Both activities are free with park admission.

Workshop: Papermaking with Local Plants on Saturday, Oct. 26: Join Val Bembenek from 1 to 3 p.m. Learn basic papermaking using mold and deckle in vats of iris leaf, ocotillo flower, creosote leaf pulps and take home richly textured sheets. Reservation is required by calling 520-896-2425. The \$15 workshop fee includes

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

# Miners keep rolling in San Carlos with 59-0 shut out; will host Canyon State for Homecoming

San Manuel Miner The San Manuel High School Miners varsity football team headed out to San Carlos on Friday and posted a shut out win 59-0 over the Braves. San Carlos has improved this year, picking up a couple of valuable wins over Alchesay and Tanque Verde and entering the game at 2-2 while the Miners had a 1-3 record. With the win the Miners now sit at a 2-3 overall and a 2-0 section record.

San Manuel's stout defense flexed their muscle in the first quarter as defensive end Jonathan Croci recovered a fumble and ran it in from 26 yards out for the touchdown. The point after touchdown kick was no good for a 6-0 Miners lead.

The Miners offense was not far off to get on the scoreboard and shortly responded as running back Shane Kelly ran the ball in from 33 yards out – heading around the left side for 'Pay-Dirt'. The point after touchdown by Anthony Garcia was good for a 13-0 lead in the first quarter.

The Miners defense continued their dominance forcing the Braves to give the ball back to the San Manuel where running back Richard Romo took the ball up the middle six yards for the touchdown. The PAT kick was good by Garcia for a 20-0 first quarter lead.

In the second quarter, the Miners picked up right where they left off in the first quarter. This time quarterback Bryan Valdez connected with wide receiver Alavaro Alvarez for 29 yard touchdown pass for the touchdown. The PAT was no good to add to the lead 26-0.

On the next offensive possession, the Miners continued to take to the friendly skies as Daniel Medina hauled in a 50 yard pass from Valdez for the touchdown. The kick was no good for a 32-0 score in the second quarter. San Manuel aired it out

once again with tight end Jonathan Croci grabbing the 25 yard pass from Valdez for touchdown. The kick was no good for the 38-0 score in the second quarter.

The Miners took the 38-0 lead into the half and did not miss a step in the third quarter as Kelly took the hand-off, sprinting 45 vards around the left side for the touchdown. The kick by Garcia was good to bring the score to 45-0 in the third quarter. The clock would now start to run as imposed by the AIA Mercy Rule, when a team is ahead by 42 points – the clock will continue to run except for injuries and time outs. In the fourth quarter, run-

ning back Isidro Wasko ran the ball around the right side for the one yard touchdown run. The kick was no good by Manny Chavez to add to the score 51-0.

The Miners would get onto the scoreboard once more as Wasko would take the ball in from 39 yards out on a punt return for the touchdown. The two point conversion was good for the 59-0 final.

Offensively for the Miners, on the ground Shane Kelly rushed for 151 yards on 10 carries with two touchdowns; Richard Romo rushed for 84 yards on eight carries with one touchdown; Ben Quijada rushed for 23 yards on five carries; Isidro Wasko rushed for eight yards on two carries with one touchdown.

In the air, Bryan Valdez went 5 for 6 for 119 yards with three touchdowns. Hauling in the passes were Daniel Medina with one catch for 50 yards and one touchdown; Alvaro Alvarez had two catches for 42 yards and one touchdown; and Jonathan Croci had two catches for 27 yards and one touchdown. On Special Teams, Isidro


Un Special Teams, Isidro Wasko had a 39 yard punt return for a touchdown.

Defensively for the Miners, Armando Sierra had seven tackles with one quarterback sack; Jordan Peasley had five tackles with three sacks and one interception; Arian Rodriguez had five tackles; Jonathan Croci had one tackle and a 26 yard fumble recovery for a touchdown; Gabriel Sierra had three tackles; and Alvaro Alvarez had two tackles.

Head Coach Steve Elmore said, "It was a good win for us against a well - coached San Carlos team. We still have a lot of work to do this week getting ready for the Homecoming game on Friday night against Canyon State. We look forward to the challenge and look forward to the stands be packed."

The Miners will host the Canyon State Academy Rams for Homecoming on Friday night with kick off slated for 7 p.m.

The Rams will enter the game with a 3-2 overall and a 2-0 section record with the wins coming over North Pointe Prep 37-9, Baboquivari 62-0, and San Tan Foothills 36-32.




