Fire Prevention Week 2019 is Oct. 6-12

Did you know that October is known as Fire Prevention Month? Do you know that Fire Prevention Week has been observed since 1922 and is sponsored by the NFPA – National Fire Protection Association. And did you know that in 1925 President Calvin Coolidge proclaimed Fire Prevention Week a national observance making it the longest-running public health observance in the country? But where and when did the event happen that started this observance?

Many of us have heard about the Great Chicago Fire of 1871. The fire started on Oct. 8, 1871 and burned until Oct. 10, 1871 in a neighborhood in the southwest section of the city after a long period of hot, dry, windy conditions and the predominantly wooden building construction of the time helped lead to the conflagration. The fire leapt the south branch of the Chicago River and destroyed much of central Chicago. It then leapt the main branch of the river consuming the near north side.

It has been told through the years that Mrs. O'Leary's cow started the fire by kicking over a lit oil lamp in the barn causing dry hay to ignite. While there is no dispute that the fire started on the O'Leary property, it has never been proven that the cow was the cause.

During the three days of the fire, approximately 300 people were killed, roughly 3.3 square miles of the city was destroyed approximately 100,000 people were left homeless and it is estimated that 17,400 structures were destroyed. This tragedy started the movement to the fire codes we use today.

The theme of Fire Prevention Week 2019 is "Not Every Hero Wears a Cape. Plan and Practice Your Escape Plan." So, how can you be the "hero" in your family? It's easy just start with sitting down with all family members and doing these simple things together:

1. Plan an escape route. You need to know 2-ways out of every room.
2. Draw a floor plan of your home marking both escape routes as well as where the smoke alarms are in each room.
3. Practice your fire drill escape plan at least twice a year. While it is sometimes OK to announce "this is a drill" you should never always declare it as being a drill. By doing that, if a real fire were to happen and your smoke alarm went off during a real fire, your family might not take the warning seriously and delay their escape. When a real fire is occurring you only have one to two minutes in which to escape! It's NOT like in the movies or on TV where people take a long time to get out.
4. Make sure your "Family Meeting Place", the place where your loved ones will gather after they escape, is a stationary object, not something that moves like a neighbor's car or

a bike in the front yard. A tree or fence post make good Family Meeting places. Reinforce the rule: "Once you are out STAY OUT!" DO NOT go back in the burning building for anything!!

5. Test Smoke alarms monthly both day and night. Replace batteries in alarms that use a standard 9-volt battery at least twice a year. It is NOT recommended/required to replace the battery in an alarm that has a 10-year lithium battery.

When it comes to maintaining your smoke alarm, get your kids involved!! Helping you help maintain your alarms is a great way to get them used to the idea of fire safety and being prepared. Want a fun family activity that your kids will enjoy as you maintain your smoke alarms? As a family sit down and choose a single date for all your smoke alarms as their "birthday". Mark that date on your calendar each year. Plan a birthday party for your alarms. Take the kids shopping for the smoke alarm(s) birthday present – a new battery for each alarm. On the alarm(s) birthday sing "Happy Birthday" to the alarms, have an adult help the kids give the alarm(s) their new battery birthday present. Then the whole family can enjoy having a birthday party for the alarm(s). And speaking of maintaining your alarms, when you change the batteries, take the brush attachment of your vacuum and dust out the alarm while you have it open. Dust and cobwebs can accumulate in the alarm possibly making it sound off a false alarm.

You are home and your smoke alarm sounds off with its warning "Beep! Beep! Beep!" What do you do?

1. Be sure to sleep with your bedroom door CLOSED! When a fire happens it's the smoke that will get you long before the flames will. A closed bedroom door helps protect you from the toxic smoke produced by a fire. This is a hard concept for parents with small children. If you are worried about not hearing your kids at night, invest in a baby monitor and keep their bedroom door CLOSED!
2. If you hear the smoke alarm, get down low and crawl low under smoke! The freshest, cleanest air is closer to the floor than the ceiling.
3. First test the bedroom door to see if it hot by using the back of your hand, NOT your palm, before attempting to open the door to escape. If the door is hot, go to your second way of escape, usually the window. DO NOT break the glass in the window (like they do in the movies or on TV) as this can cause glass shards that can cut you badly as you try to escape. Sit to the side of the window and signal first responders from that position. Let them come to you!
4. Teach kids NOT to hide (under the bed or

in a closet). Yes, they will be scared but let them know that is OK. The firemen need to find them and they may not be able to if a child hides.

Vandalism at the Dave McFee Memorial Field

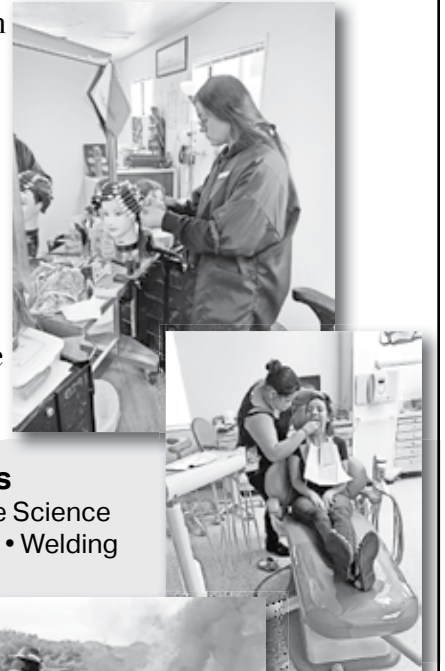
Over the weekend, *Copper Basin News* learned that following Friday night's game at Ray High School, vandals caused damage to Dave McFee Memorial Field.

Hayden beats rival Ray; remains undefeated with championship rematch next

The Hayden football team entered last Friday's game in Kearny against rival Ray undefeated and the Lobos remained that way after a one-sided 60 – 14 victory.

Now 6 – 0, the Lobos will look to make it seven-straight victories without a loss this Friday, but it won't be easy with defending state champion Superior visiting Winkelman in a rematch of last year's state title game.

Last Friday's game was close early, as evidenced by the 8 – 6 score at the end of the first quarter. The Lobos turned it on the jets after that, outscoring the Bearcats 52 – 8 during the final three quarters.

"I thought we started off well and then the wheels fell off," Ray assistant coach Jimmy Fessenden told Copper Basin News. "We

have no excuses. We got beat."

Johnavon Pace and Alex Bravo each scored a touchdown for the Cats.

The 60 points tallied by the Lobos is a season-high, which is impressive considering they were without starting quarterback AJ Castillo, who missed his second consecutive game with an injury.

"Next man up," Hayden head coach John Estrada said. "Our kids have adjusted and are working hard. They're fighting through the adversity."

Are they ever.

The Lobos are averaging 48 points per game without two-year starter Castillo leading the offense.

Junior Manuel Guillen, who replaced Castillo as the starter, threw three touchdowns, including a pair to Vincente Aguirre and another to Malachi Carmelo.

Jorge Rodriguez ran for a trio of touchdowns and Gibby Carmelo ran for one. Julian Gonzales added a defensive touchdown on a scoop-and-score.

"(The) team played well," Estrada said. "We controlled the tempo of the game. Boys did their job, we stuck to our game plan, and came out victorious."

"Once again our line dominated the trenches. We attacked Ray's strength, and it didn't have an answer to stop us."

"When Castillo went down, we didn't think their passing game would be strong, but as you can see it was," Fessenden said.

Hayden will need to continue that type of production and perseverance against a Panthers' defense that seems to have found its groove the last two games after allowing more than 100 points in back-to-back games earlier this season.

"We'll need to play at our best come Friday; no mistakes and we'll need to do our jobs," Estrada said.

The Cats face a near must-win game this week, especially with the regular-season finale at defending state champion Superior the following week.

"Friday is huge," Fessenden said. "If we want to make the playoffs, we need to win at least one more game. We have put (last) Friday behind us and are focusing on Arete Prep, which is another good team."

The 1A East Region Championship is at stake for Hayden this Friday, and likely a top-seed in the playoffs, which begin later this month.

What is Hyperbaric Wound Therapy?

Hyperbaric oxygen therapy involves breathing pure oxygen in a pressurized room or tube. Hyperbaric oxygen therapy is a well-established treatment for decompression sickness, a hazard of scuba diving. Other conditions treated with hyperbaric oxygen therapy include serious infections, bubbles of air in your blood vessels, and wounds that won't heal.



In a hyperbaric oxygen therapy chamber, the air pressure is increased to three times higher than normal air pressure. Under these conditions, your lungs can gather more oxygen than would be possible breathing pure oxygen at normal air pressure.

Your blood carries this oxygen throughout your body. This helps fight bacteria and stimulate the

release of substances called growth factors and stem cells, which promote healing.

Conditions for Treatment

Hyperbaric oxygen therapy is used to treat several medical conditions. And medical institutions use it in different ways. Your doctor may suggest hyperbaric oxygen therapy if you have one of the following conditions:

- Anemia, severe
- Brain abscess
- Bubbles of air in your blood vessels (arterial gas embolism)
- Burn
- Decompression sickness
- Carbon monoxide poisoning
- Crushing injury
- Deafness, sudden
- Gangrene
- Infection of skin or bone that causes tissue death
- Non-healing wounds, such as a diabetic foot ulcer
- Radiation injury
- Vascular wounds
- Skin graft or skin flap at risk of tissue death
- Wounds that won't heal

During Hyperbaric Therapy

Hyperbaric oxygen therapy typically is performed as an outpatient procedure and doesn't require hospitalization. If you're already hospitalized and require hyperbaric oxygen therapy, you'll remain in the hospital for therapy. During hyperbaric oxygen therapy, the air pressure in the room is about two to three times normal air pressure. The increased air pressure will create a temporary feeling of fullness in your ears — similar to what you might feel in an airplane or at a high elevation. You can relieve

that feeling by yawning or swallowing. For most conditions, therapy lasts approximately two hours. Members of our health care team will monitor you and the therapy unit throughout your treatment.

You may feel somewhat tired or hungry following your treatment. This doesn't limit normal activities.

Fire restrictions lifted Friday on state lands

Recent moisture and cooler temperatures allow the Arizona Department of Forestry Management to lift fire restrictions on state-owned and managed lands across Arizona.

As of 8 a.m., Friday, Sept. 27, the agency will lift Stage I restrictions in Gila, La Paz, Maricopa, Mohave – south of the Colorado

River, and Yuma Counties.

Stage I Fire Restrictions went into effect in June, but lingering dry conditions, an abundance of grass statewide, and a scarce monsoon season forced the agency to keep restrictions in place longer than normal.

During an average year, restrictions are typically

lifted after the monsoon arrives in mid-July. Those storms bring widespread moisture, help decrease temperatures, and increase humidity. All of those elements are necessary to reduce fire activity.

Even though restrictions will be lifted Friday, DFFM wants to remind the public to be fire safe when outdoors.

- Never leave a campfire unattended. Always be sure it is out and cool to the touch before leaving.
- If towing a vehicle or trailer, ensure tow chains are secure and never dragging.
- Never burn on windy days and have water

nearby if using any type of equipment that throws sparks.

• Target shooting and fireworks are never allowed on state lands at any time of the year.
