United Food Bank mobile food distribution in Kearny more vital than ever; next one scheduled for Nov. 1

Every month on the first Friday, United Food Bank delivers a truckload of food to Kearny for folks in need. The food bank typically serves around 80 people each month.

This month, due to the ongoing strike at Asarco's Ray Mine and Hayden Smelter, United Food Bank will be bringing additional food to assist families impacted by the prolonged strike. The food bank estimates that nearly 1,700 people are impacted by the strike.

The Copper Basin is part of Mesa-based United Food Bank's 19,000-square-mile service area and is served by a mobile food distribution on the first Friday of each month. United Food Bank expects to serve 300 people at the next distribution event.

The next food distribution is set for Friday, Nov. 1, at 8 a.m. United Food Bank will distribute food until 10 a.m. or when the food runs out. To accommodate the anticipated increase in people served, United Food Bank has made arrangements to move the distribution site from the courthouse where it normally has been held to Church of the Good Shepherd at 617 Senator Chastain Rd.

There are no income requirements to receive the assistance.

"If you are hungry, we want to feed you," a representative of the food bank said.

Daily lane restrictions of US 60 near the Pinto Creek Bridge scheduled to begin Oct. 31

Motorists on US 60 between Miami and Superior should expect daily lane restrictions for the Pinto Creek Bridge replacement project starting Thursday, Oct. 31.

Alternating lane restrictions are planned Mondays through Thursdays between 6 a.m. and 4 p.m. and Fridays between 6 a.m. and noon. During those hours, flaggers will be directing traffic and drivers should plan for delays. The daily lane closures are expected to last for several weeks.

The first full closure of US 60 is scheduled for Thursday, Nov. 7, between 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. Full closures will continue each Tuesday and Thursday for several weeks.

Hayden advances; Lobos face longer and tougher road in Quarterfinals

The No. 5 Hayden football team easily defeated No. 12 St. David last Friday in the opening round of the 1A State Championship playoffs, 48 – 6. Now the Lobos will make the more than three-hour trip to face No. 4 Salome this Friday.

"(The team) played well," Hayden head coach John Estrada said. "(We) executed and got the job done. Our younger players got a lot of playing time which is always good for the future of our football program. It also allowed some of our starters to rest and heal."

Indeed, the Lobos are banged up, as they have been all year. Still, they've persevered and expect the same as they move on through the playoffs.

"It's been an uphill battle all season with injuries," said Estrada. "Our kids have handled the adversity very well which

defines our team."

The No. 4 Frogs enter Friday's game with a record of 6 - 2, with their only losses to No. Williams and No. 2 Bagdad. "Salome is a sound team with some seasoned players," Estrada said. "Their skilled players are very quick and fast. They run a lot of misdirection plays and throw the ball well.

"We beat them last year in the quarterfinals (36 - 14). I'm sure that will be a big motivator for them. They'll be hungry and we will need to play at our

Despite the injuries, Estrada said his team needs to focus on what it does best. He also believes the Lobos are playing their best at the right time of the season.

"Last Friday's game looked more like Hayden football," he said. "That's our plan this Friday, play Hayden football.
