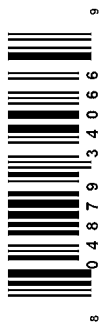

Superior signs Sister Cities Agreement with Huásabas, Sonora, Mexico

During the regularly scheduled September Council meeting the Town of Superior approved a formal Sister Cities Agreement with the municipality of Huásabas, Sonora, Mexico.

The initiative began this past summer with the Consul General of Mexico in Phoenix and Tucson making initial connections between Arizona Cities and Towns and potential sister cities in Sonora, Mexico. The culmination of the relationship agreements were celebrated last week during an official signing ceremony at the Way of the

West Museum in Scottsdale.

Huásabas is a small community in the mountains of Sonora, Mexico with a population around 900 residents. The town is well known for their ranching and agricultural based economy. They are well known for exporting machaca beef, Bacanora a mescal based spirit, and grain for cattle. They also have some mining nearby along with a some tourism in the area. The Town of Superior and Huásabas exchanged gift baskets with local arts and food items from each community.

During the signing

ceremony, Rafael Barcelo Durazo, Head Consul of the Tucson Mexican Consulate, shared in his remarks that the purpose of creating the Sister City Agreements was to connect cities and towns of all sizes to connect and build relationships, that the relationships will aid in connecting and supporting the communities, to promote each other, share ideas and resources and build cross-border relations. Arizona and Sonora, Mexico are both working to improve and increase trade corridors between the two states across the international border.

The delegation from Huásabas is planning to visit Superior in 2023.

“We look forward to hosting our Sister City and learning more from them. The products made in their community are truly exceptional. There is much we can share and learn from each other,” said Mayor Mila Besich.

Other cities and towns signing agreements during the ceremony were: Flagstaff, Arizona with Navoja, Sonora; Cottonwood, Arizona with Mazata´n, Sonora; Show Low, Arizona with Imuris, Sonora; Avondale, Arizona with Puerto Penasco; Nogales, Arizona with Ba´cum, Sonora; Nogales, Arizona with Cananea, Sonora; Nogales, with Imuris, and Tolleson, Arizona with Fronteras Sonora. Alfonso Durazo Montano the Governor of Sonora and Marisol Flores-Aguirre, Director for the Southern Arizona Office for Governor Katie Hobbs, served as honorary witnesses of the agreements.

He is preceded in death by his parents, JW and Helen; brother Larry, and niece Deidra.

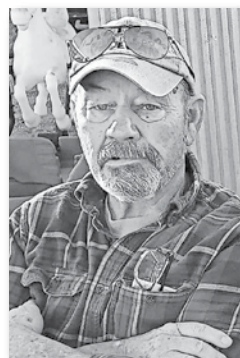
