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

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# Asarco Volunteers Work Hard at Hubbard Park, Hayden and Around the World

It took about forty volunteers about six hours to take on and complete a very ambitious project right here in Kearny. And similar projects were undertaken by volunteers in various locations in other countries, too, all on the same day.

Mike Kotraba, General Manager of Ray Operations for ASARCO, led the volunteers, all employees of the mine. They met at 8 a.m. on Saturday to assemble for a photograph, then were divided into task groups to work on the old Teen Center, the Town Hall, and the ramadas beside the swimming pool at Hubbard Park. The cleaning and scraping had been done earlier in the week, so the volunteers got right to work taping off and painting the structures.

Some volunteers prepped the ramadas while others trimmed out weeds. One group worked on trimming the trees which were close to the buildings. This last group

included Mike Kotraba himself, who thoroughly enjoyed attacking the invading branches. Children of the employees wanted to pitch in too, so they enjoyed hauling and stacking the branches.

Paul Sullivan's expertise made him the natural choice to lead the painting group. Paul was one of the people who voluntarily worked on the painting of our beautiful library building earlier this year.

That's not all. ASARCO is also donating the paint needed to cover the exterior of Constitution Hall... there just wasn't enough time on Saturday to take that job on. Further, ASARCO is donating new tables for the ramadas. The old ones are rusty and dangerous.

Not to be outdone by the pit crew, the General Manager of Smelter Operations, Joe Wilhelm, convened ASARCO employees in Hayden to paint the playground structures in the park, as well

as the whole wall which boundaries the park and the smelter. Earlier, ASARCO employees spent time planning and fabricating a large outdoor grill which was installed in the park at Winkelman Flats.

Go take a look at the results. I think you'll be pleased.

On another note, I have been told that the number of non-running vehicles in our yards and on our streets has been growing. This is both a safety and blight issue. If you have a non-runner, the Town of Kearny might be able to help. Town Manager Anna Flores keeps a list of individuals and organizations who take these cars away. 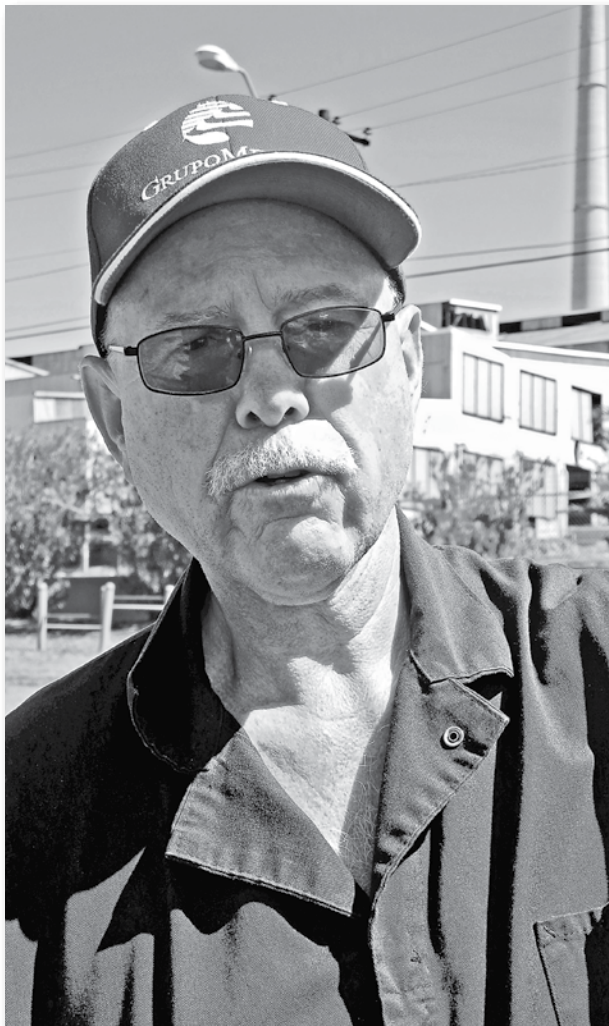

# Hayden gets bragging rights after win against rival Ray

The latest edition of the Hayden-Ray rivalry took place last Friday night in Kearny and ended with the Lobos soundly defeating the Bearcats, 44 – 14.

“We did a good job,” Hayden head coach John Estrada told the *Copper Basin News*. “We executed and the kids were hungry.

They performed well.”

The win was the fourth-straight for the Lobos, who started the season with back-to-back losses against St. David and NFL YET, a pair of top-ten teams.

After getting banged up in the two early-season losses, the Lobos are again fully healthy and it’s made a difference.

“It’s totally different when a team is healthy and we’re able to execute,” he said.

“We’ve been able to keep climbing the ladder.”

During the four-game winning streak, Hayden’s average margin of victory is 36 points, nearly the same number they defeated the Cats by on Friday.

For Ray, the loss is costly with another forfeit win upcoming this week as the result of North Phoenix Prep.

“Once again, it was the passing game that

got us,” Ray head coach Frank Lechuga said. “And we weren’t able to capitalize on the fumbles we created.”

The Cats host No. 2 Superior in the regular-season finale for both teams on Oct. 14. It’s likely a must-win game for Ray if they want any hopes of reaching the playoffs.

Hayden will host the mighty Panthers this Friday. Kickoff is scheduled for 7 p.m.

## Pinal County Public Health flu shots available starting Oct. 10

FLORENCE - Influenza (also known as flu) causes thousands of deaths each year. The Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends that everyone six months and older gets a yearly flu shot. Getting vaccinated each year against flu protects you and the people around you who may be more vulnerable to serious illness due to the flu, such as pregnant women, young children, people age 65 and older, and people with asthma or other chronic medical conditions.

To prevent the spread of flu and protect your family, you can take the following steps:

- Get vaccinated as early as possible!
- Wash your hands with soap and water often.
- Disinfect surfaces.
- Cover your cough or sneeze.
- Stay home from work or school when you are sick.

Pinal County Public Health Services District will begin providing flu vaccine to the public on Monday, October 10, 2016. Due to limited availability, appointments are recommended for adults and will be available October 10 through October 22. Flu shots are available at no cost for uninsured and under-insured residents based on eligibility. Adults and children should bring their immunization records and insurance information if available with them to their visit.

The Towns of Ray, Sonora and Barcelona no longer exist, but the memories live on in those that once lived, or had family, in the now ghost towns.

In the 1950's, the Kennecott Mining Company expanded until their open pit operation threatened to swallow up the towns of Ray, Sonora, and Barcelona. Kennecott built a community called Kearny to house the soon-to-be-displaced population, many of them miners. People moved into the houses the mine built in the new planned

community. Others bought their houses from the mine and moved their whole house to Kearny, Superior or Riverside. Once everyone was relocated, the Kennecott open pit mining operation destroyed the towns of Ray, Sonora and Barcelona. The Ray pit now owned and operated by Asarco Grupo Mexico sits over the location of these three lost towns.

The families that once lived or visited family in the lost towns have not forgotten. The weekend of Oct. 7 and 8 they will be coming together to reconnect and reminisce.

Were you a student of Ray High School back when the town still existed? On Oct. 7, the Ray Class of 1961 Reunion is holding its 55th High School Reunion. It's been 10 years since the last reunion. The Class of 1961 was the first class to graduate in the new school in Kearny after the population of Ray moved to the new town. If you are part of the Ray Class of 1961, or you attended school

in Ray, come join the fun. A Steak Fry is being held at the General Kearny Inn. There is no planned entertainment, just some music, good food and the opportunity to visit with old friends. If you would like to attend, call Rose Bradford at 520-483-0709 and make a reservation.

The Tonto National Forest (TNF) is preparing a management plan for the Apache Leap Special Management Area (SMA) as directed by the Carl Levin and Howard P. "Buck" McKeon National Defense Authorization Act (NDA) for Fiscal Year 2015. The plan will establish desired conditions, objectives and standards to guide future management of the area. The management plan will be prepared in consultation with affected tribes, the Town of Superior in Pinal County, Arizona, Resolution Copper, and interested members of the public.

The Apache Leap SMA currently includes lands under federal and private ownership. Upon completion of the Southeast Arizona Land Exchange (also included in the NDA), the Apache Leap SMA will include only federal lands. The NDA directs the exchange of the 110-acre Apache Leap parcel presently owned by Resolution Copper – the operating company and project proponent for a proposed underground copper mine near Superior -- to the TNF. This parcel will be added to an existing 697-acre area of TNF to form the approximately 807-acre Apache Leap SMA, which encompasses the Apache Leap escarpment, east of Superior.

The purpose of the Apache Leap SMA, as set forth in the NDA, is as follows: (1) to preserve the natural character of Apache Leap, (2) to allow for traditional uses of the area by Native American people, and (3) to protect and conserve the cultural and archaeological resources of the area.

To assist with the management plan's development, a public workshop will be held on October 20, 2016, in the Superior High School multi-purpose room located at 100 Mary Drive, Superior, Arizona. The purpose of the workshop is to inform the public about the SMA plan development process and to receive input from the public on development of the plan. The meeting will take place from 5 to 8 p.m. A presentation by a TNF representative will begin at 5:30 p.m., followed by an interactive public workshop.

In addition to the public workshop, the TNF is inviting public input into the SMA plan development process. Submit inputs to the TNF by mail at Apache Leap SMA, P.O. Box 34468, Phoenix, AZ 85067-4468. Further information concerning the development of the management plan can be found online at [www.ApacheLeapSMA.us](http://www.ApacheLeapSMA.us). Public input will be most useful if received by November 21, 2016.

Upon completion of the management plan, the TNF will conduct a National Environmental Policy Act Environmental Assessment (EA) of the plan. There will be opportunities for public comment on the proposed management plan during the EA process in early 2017.
