Insurance Issue Cancels Fireworks at Football Game

To the Parents, Students, Faculty and the Family members of the Hayden-Winkelman Unified School District,

In response to the social media comments involving the Hayden Fire Department and the fireworks that were supposed to be discharged for the Hayden-Ray middle school football game and were cancelled.

For those who don't know, the Town of Hayden has a general liability insurance for the town employees, including the fire department. This insurance policy covers the fire department on calls within the Town of Hayden and the surrounding communities. This includes Dudleyville, Winkelman, Aravaipa, Kearny and Dripping Springs, whether there is a fire or any emergency call that the Hayden Fire Department is called out for. In order to discharge fireworks, there is a separate policy that the

town needs to purchase, that we were unaware of, and it was brought to our attention the day before the game.

Some comments that were made to the HFD were making it sound like we did not want to shoot and that was not the case. There were also comments about the school having insurance that covers the discharge of fireworks, and the policy that the school carries does not cover the discharge of fireworks. Before any individuals and you know who, you are, start commenting on things that you know nothing about, please get your facts straight before posting on social media.

Another shut-out win for Hayden has put them near the top of the 1A ranking, just under Williams and over St. David (ranking as of noon Tuesday, Oct. 4).

The Hayden football team collected their most recent victory last Friday in their game against Dishchii'bihoh. Rotating their varsity and JV players, the Lobos walked away with a 67-0 final score.

The boys played a strong offense, racking up the points. Fabian Elvira went 7-10 with

140 yards of passing, 2 touchdowns and 1 interception. Paul Gaither went 5-8 with 54 yards passing, 1 touchdown, 3 rushes for 51 yards and 1 touchdown. Moraes Cruz had 2 rushes for 33 yards and 2 touchdowns. Deondre Collier had 1 rush for 63 yards, 1 rushing touchdown and 1 reception for 17 yards. Tyler Garner had 1 rush for 12 yards. Jordan Rodriguez had 1 rush for 12 yards, 1 reception for 10 yards, and 1 receiving touchdown. Kino Lorona had 2 rushes for 2 yards, 1 reception 22 yards and 1 rushing touchdown. Brandon Garner had 4 receptions for 68 yards and 1 touchdown.

Isaac Castillo had 2 receptions for 55 yards, and 1 touchdown. Chris Casillas had 2 receptions for 17 yards.

ADOT launches Name-A-Snowplow contest

PHOENIX – The Arizona Department of Transportation has 200 snowplows and is calling on the public to give names to some of them.

Wait, there are snowplows in Arizona?

You better believe it – Arizona's high country (the Copper Corridor's Oracle and Globe included) receives a tremendous amount of snowfall and Flagstaff is one of the snowiest cities in the country – and it's past time to properly recognize the vitally important, high-use heavy machinery.
