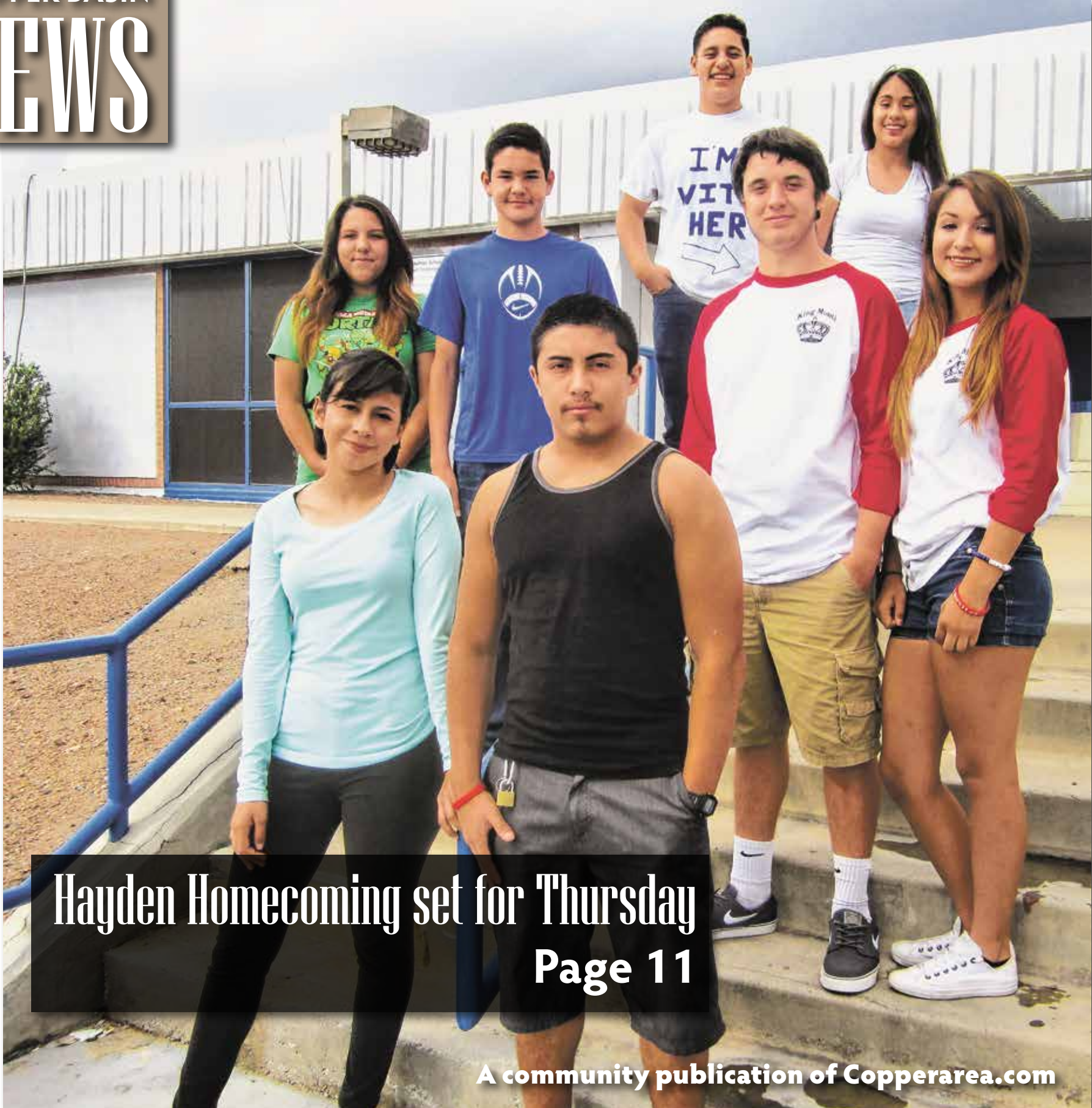

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

CFFT, CAC Board recall and closure of Aravaipa campus

In the past few weeks, have you seen or heard of petitioners hanging around the copper corridor with a sign reading, "45% PROPERTY TAX INCREASE FOR ALL OF PINAL COUNTY BY CENTRAL ARIZONA COLLEGE," I am writing this editorial to inform you, from a student's perspective, what this means to me and why it happened.

On May 19, 2015, the Pinal County Community College District Governing Board voted to accept the CAC budget for fiscal year 2015-2016.

This vote followed a truth in taxation hearing where board members voted to increase the current tax rate from \$1.91 to \$2.76 per \$100 of net assessed valuation. In response to concerns expressed by local citizens, the CAC Governing Board voted on June 9 to change the tax rate to \$2.30 per \$100 of net assessed valuation.

A response to this tax rate included a committee called Citizens for Fair Taxation and chairman Garland Shreves to take action to recall and re-elect CAC's governing board to make cost saving measures. With great sadness, I am writing because the committee received enough petitions to recall two of the four targeted board members. Petition signatures are currently undergoing verification.

I feel that most of the signatures from our side of the county were acquired through misinforming the public. From Mammoth's La Casita to Kearny's Norm's Grocery, petitioners purposely advertised their sign in a way that was interpreted for all of Pinal County property taxes to increase by 45%, and that if you sign their petition, it won't happen. Note CAC's share of the property tax is only 14%, and CAC's board voted their rate to 20%. Yet, petitioners advertised otherwise.

The initial rate increase was made from a 2-year period of careful consideration to Pinal County residents

and CAC's future. Before this, many cost containment measures were instituted. Please understand that CAC's state funding was nearly lost this fiscal year. Also, since the year of 2006, state funding for CAC has decreased 80% and tuition has increased 64%.

What the people advertising for the recall in eastern Pinal county DID NOT tell you is that one of the so-called cost saving measures to keep from increasing taxes is to close the Aravaipa Campus.

To the recall supporters, the Aravaipa campus is seen as unnecessary and that its services could be given completely online.

As a student of the Aravaipa campus, I feel targeted. I am furious.

Aravaipa's location is rural, serves the copper corridor, and aids students like me who cannot afford to attend the Signal Peak campus, or initially transfer to university.

Know this, the Aravaipa campus has yielded the best foundation of my academic career, an ultimate collegiate experience. This is true for many others and myself as students of the Copper Corridor. Advancement of my extremely rural area **DEPENDS** on Aravaipa as our **ONLY** access to higher education.

This facility offers vital services such as a learning center and library that teaches research methods, counseling services that assist students far beyond classrooms, financial aid, and many outreach programs. All of these services could never be substituted by online methods.

Closing the Aravaipa campus will terminate access to higher education, leaving my community of Pinal County behind to compete economically.

Why would anyone sign a petition to take away success from future Aravaipa attendees and myself? It's vindictive. What saddens me is that signers of the petition did not know this. For the supporters of the recall, the message I receive is that higher-ed seeking students in eastern Pinal County are not worth the investment.

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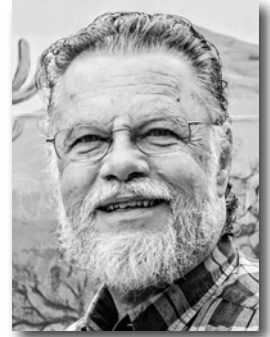
Journey for a Clean Kearny Continues Oct. 17

The Journey for a Clean Kearny continues with another grand cleanup of the town on Saturday, Oct. 17, from 8 a.m. until 2 p.m. Volunteer workers will scour the community to eliminate all that prevents our town from being beautiful.

The overall cleaning scheme is similar to the successful cleanup we had this Spring. All volunteers will be asked to come to Town Hall to receive "marching orders" and sign a volunteer liability waiver. Two large rolloff containers will have been placed on the lot at the corner of Jamestown and Tilbury, and workers will be on hand at the Transfer Station on Hwy. 177. Additionally, people will staff the oil collection center at the Town Yard and the burn pile near the airport. Rip Vache and the people at NAPA will gladly accept old car batteries.

Rose Bradford is coordinating the groups and individuals who will spread out over the town to pick up litter. Bags will be provided, and people are asked to wear good shoes, gloves, and headgear.

Just as before, volunteers with trucks and trailers will go up and down the streets, assisting residents with curbside

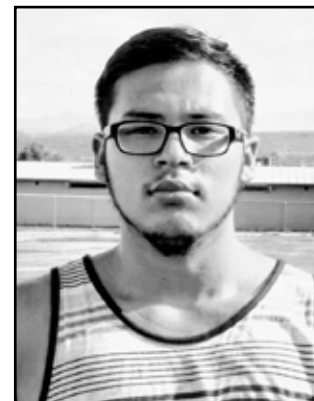

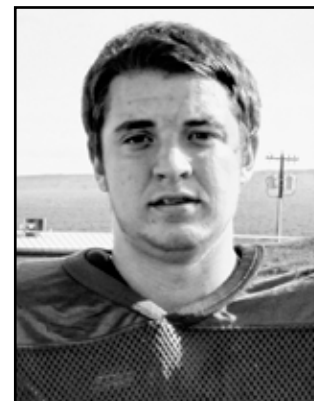

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Mic Johnson: The Voyage of the Nitta Maru

On Jan. 12, 1942, more than 1,200 prisoners of war captured at Wake Island were marched to a dock where they boarded the Nitta Maru, a converted passenger ship. As they boarded the ship, many of the prisoners had to walk a gauntlet across the deck between two lines of Japanese sailors who punched, kicked and spit on them. They were then jammed into the ship's hold. Three hundred prisoners were left on Wake Island but all but 98 civilian heavy equipment operators would be sent to POW camps in late 1942.

The prisoners were given a copy of the Japanese naval regulations for prisoners of war written in English. The regulations began, "The prisoners disobeying the following orders will be punished with immediate death." The punishment of death could be given for simple actions including disobeying orders and instructions, talking without permission and raising loud voices, climbing the ladder without orders, and those walking and moving without orders.

Toilets were buckets or cans set up in the four corners of the ship's hold. When they were full, a prisoner was selected to carry the buckets to the center of the hold where they were pulled up to the deck by a derrick. Within 48 hours of departing Wake Island the temperatures dropped from subtropical to freezing.

"It got damned cold," said Mic Johnson.

The POWs had no warm clothing; the hold was not heated or ventilated. They were given blankets but had to sleep in shifts as they were jammed in so tight there was not enough room for everyone to lie down. They endured the cold and starvation for 12 days. During the voyage, they remained in the hold the entire time. Some of them were beaten by their Japanese

captors.

The Nitta Maru stopped in Yokohama, Japan to drop off 20 of the prisoners. On the crossing between Japan and China, Lieutenant Toshio Saito, the head of the ship's guard ordered his men to randomly select five American military personnel and bring them up to the deck of the ship. Three sailors and two marines were blindfolded and forced to kneel on the deck. Saito ordered them beheaded. The bodies of the Americans were then used for bayonet practice before being tossed overboard.

The 98 civilian workers who stayed on Wake Island were forced to work finishing the runway, roads and the rest of the naval base. In 1943, fearing an invasion by American forces, Admiral Shigematsu Sakaibra ordered the prisoners taken to the north end of the island where they were blindfolded and executed by machine gun fire. One American prisoner managed to escape. He returned to the site of the mass burial and, on a coral covered rock nearby, carved 98 U.S. PW 5-10-43. It has become a monument to those who died there. The prisoner was later captured and Sakaibra personally beheaded him. After the war, Sakaibra was tried and sentenced to death by a military tribunal. He was hanged for the war crime in 1947 on the island of Guam.

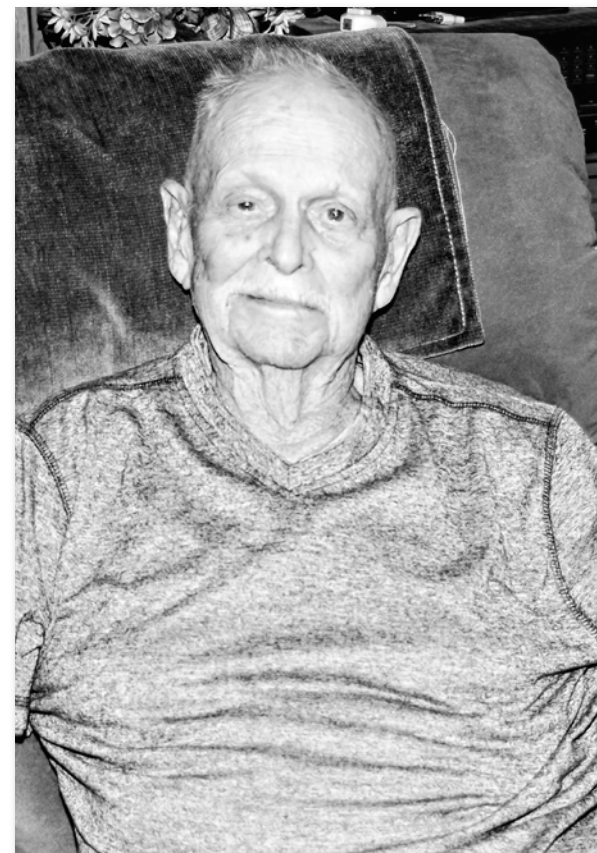
The Nitta Maru made port in Shanghai, China on Jan. 24, 1942.

"The temperature was 35 degrees when we landed," said Mic.

The prisoners, weakened by a near starvation diet and living in cramped quarters disembarked from the ship and were forced to march, some of them barefoot, 12 miles to a prison camp known as Woosung.

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Kearny Police Report
