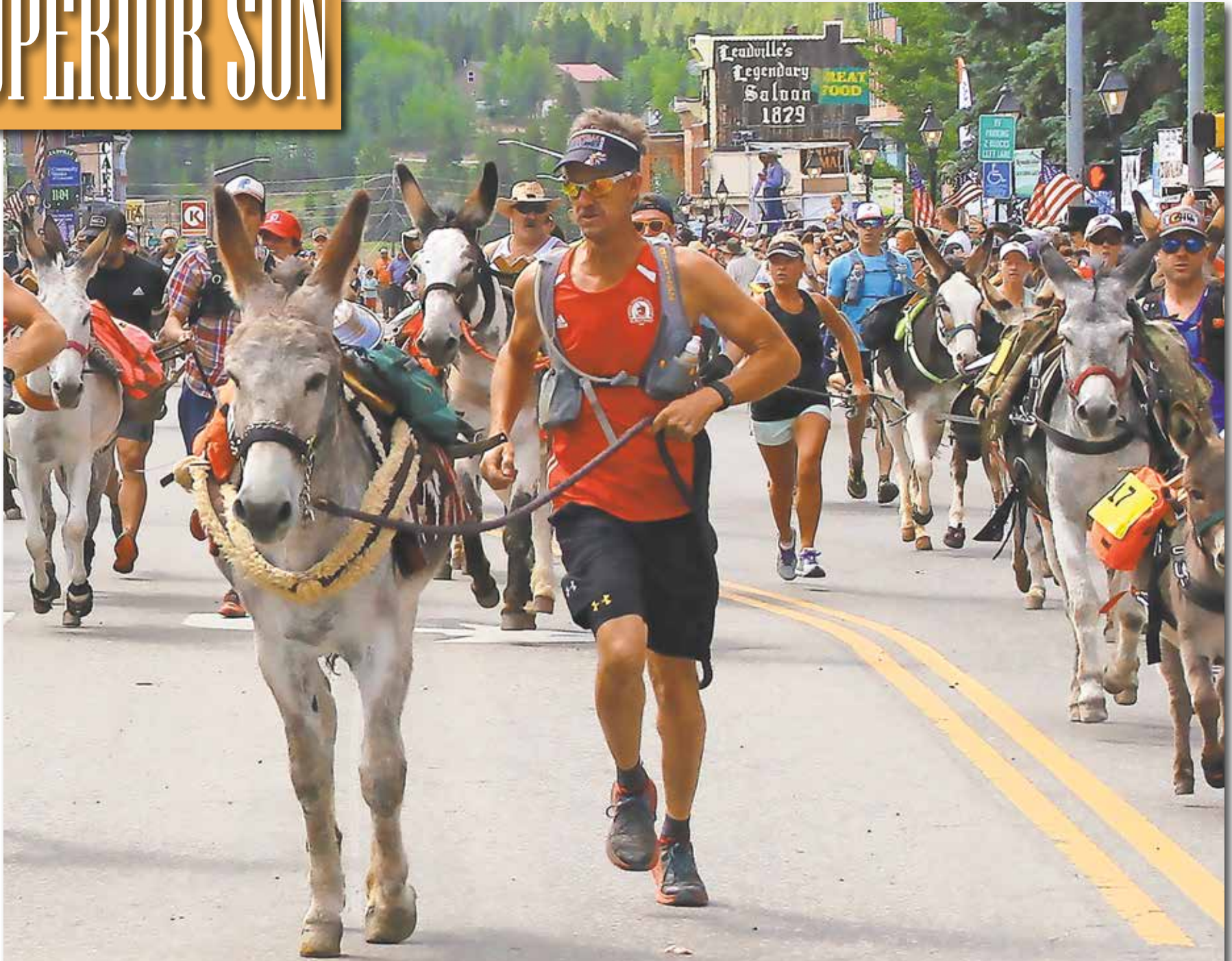

Pinto Creek Bridge replacement project underway on US 60; new bridge will improve travel east of Valley for decades to come

PHOENIX – An Arizona Department of Transportation project on US 60 east of the Phoenix area is replacing the 70-year-old bridge over Pinto Creek with a nearly 700-foot span designed to better accommodate personal and commercial travel for decades to come.

Traffic restrictions are scheduled to begin Monday, Oct. 7, on US 60 between Miami and Superior as construction gets underway on the two-year, \$22.7 million Pinto Creek Bridge project.

Motorists should plan for lane restrictions and delays from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Wednesday, Oct. 7-9. The restrictions will allow crews to mobilize equipment and begin construction of an access road into Pinto Creek Canyon.

Additional restrictions and closures are tentatively scheduled to begin the week of Oct. 21. Lane restrictions are scheduled from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily, with full closures of US 60 scheduled from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Tuesdays and Thursdays. These restrictions and closures are expected to continue for about six to eight weeks.

During the full closures, which will allow crews to conduct blasting to move the highway about 30 feet to the north to align with the new bridge, motorists will detour on state routes 77 and 177 through Winkelman. This will add at least 45 minutes to the trip between the Globe area and Superior. Providing consistent days and times for these full closures is designed to help those relying on US 60 better schedule their travel between the Globe and Phoenix areas.

Additional overnight closures are expected later in the project to place bridge girders and pour the concrete deck for the new bridge. Toward the end of the project, a five-day closure of US 60 will be required to finish realigning the highway with the new bridge.

The new bridge will be 695.5 feet length and supported by three piers. Being built adjacent to the current bridge, which will continue to be used during construction, it will have one lane of traffic in each direction and 8-foot-wide shoulders.

Once the bridge is completed, crews will dismantle the existing bridge, built in 1949 with an estimated lifespan of 50 years. While it remains safe for traffic, the existing bridge doesn't meet current standards for bridge design used by ADOT, the Federal Highway Administration and the American Association of State Highway Transportation Officials.

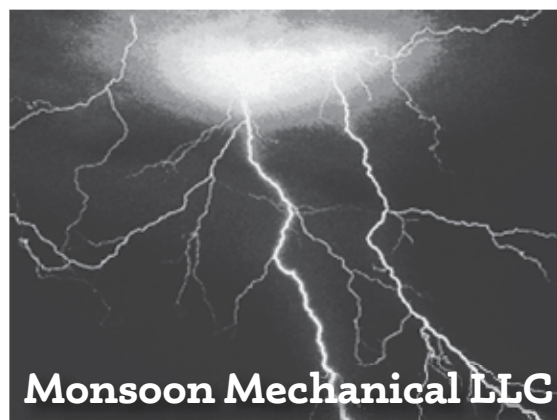

Superior wins championship rematch with Hayden

Last Friday's rematch of the 2018 1A State Championship Game might feature the same teams in this year's title game.

No. 3 Superior and No. 5 Hayden started out like a heavyweight fight with the fighters moving around the ring without many punches being thrown, as the first quarter ended without any points being scored.

But things changed in the second quarter when Superior landed a couple of haymakers, scoring 24-unanswered points before halftime. The Panthers outscored the Lobos 22 - 12 in the second half to secure a rather decisive victory, 46 - 12.

"We made a lot of mental mistakes early on," Superior head coach Ryan Palmer

said afterwards. "Once we settled down and started doing the little things right, we played much better."

Superior senior captain Sammy Lopez did it all Friday night. He scored a pair of touchdowns - one receiving and the other a pick-six - with three interceptions and a fumble recovery to go along with 98 yards receiving. Lopez now leads the 1A Division with seven interceptions.

"Sammy had an outstanding game and is having a great senior season," Palmer said. "Sammy works hard and has a great attitude. He leads by example, which is exactly what you want from a captain. He has stepped up nicely into a leadership role both on and off the field."

Superior junior Adam Navarrette also scored a pair of touchdowns - one receiving, one rushing - and finished with

138 all-purpose yards and an interception. On defense, Matthew Diaz-Gonzales (13), Navarrette (14) and Gabe Castillo (13) all totaled double-digit tackles. Junior Marc Mendoza recorded two sacks and senior Gabriel Otero recovered a fumble and returned it for a touchdown.

Hayden, which was without starting quarterback AJ Castillo for a third-straight game, suffered its first loss of the season.

"We didn't play well," Lobos' head coach John Estrada said. "We didn't stick to our game plan and got beat."

Hayden senior Gibby Carmelo rushed for a touchdown and threw for another to junior Manny Guillen.

It's important that Hayden rebounds to maintain a top-seed in the playoffs, perhaps even a first-round bye.

"Last week's game is over," Estrada said.

"We need to learn from it and move on. It'll be challenging from here on out. We need to continue to work hard and get ready to play on Fridays."

Superior will host Ray, which faces a must-win game to earn a playoff berth. The Panthers don't need any extra motivation.

"The Copper Helmet is up for grabs," Palmer said. "(We) love the tradition of the rivalry and will be excited to play for it on our home field. We also have a chance to secure our fifth-consecutive Region Championship, which is a great milestone for our program."

Superior's inaugural Burro Run set for Saturday,

The Superior Chamber of Commerce, with the support of the Town of Superior and LOST (Legends of Superior Trails), is proud to announce

a new event in Superior ... and Arizona for that matter. The first Superior Burro Run will be held this Saturday, Oct. 12. The massive coordination

of recruiting the runners and burros, arranging for their stay at the Box 8 Ranch, has been handled by Monique Williams of the Az Burro Cross Club. Sixty teams, consisting of a runner and a burro, will be racing on the streets of

Superior as well as through the trails of the U.S. Forest Service toward Picket Post. You won't want to miss this exciting event.

While the race is in progress there will be vendors, music, fun things to do for all ages

and a beer garden – no, scratch that – the “Bad Ass Bar” on Main St.

The directions follow: Long Course (approximately 12 miles), Short Course (approximately 6 miles) and the Fun Run (approximately

3 miles) will all start together at 10 a.m. in front of the Chamber building, 165 W. Main St. They will head West, turn left (South) at Stone, turn right (West) at Brown, turn left (South) on Belmont, cross Sunset and run to the West and a little bit South on Little League property, turn right (West) and cross the vacant lots that become O'Donnell and continue West on O'Donnell.

At the intersection of O'Donnell, Panther Drive and Sunset, the Fun Run will turn right on Sunset, continue to Belmont, turn left and return the way they came until they get to Main St. where they will cross Main St to Porphyry, turn right (East) on Porphyry to Magma, right on Magma to Main St., right to the finish line. The long and short courses will continue West on Panther Dr turning left (South) at the Fire Station and into the USFS land. The trails on the USFS land will be marked and they will return the same way they started, leaving USFS land heading East on Panther Dr. and left (North/East) on Sunset Dr. to Belmont, turn left on Belmont and return the way they came until they reach Main St. where they will cross Main St. to Porphyry (Short Course, yellow line) or Copper (Long Course, red line) turn right to Magma, right on Magma to Main St. and right on Main St. to finish line.

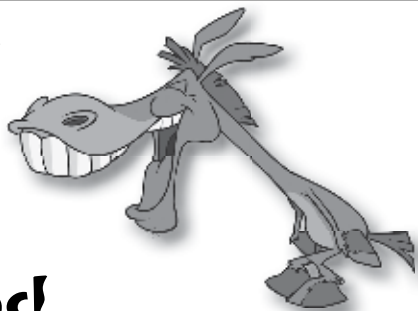

Four generations and nearly 50 years add up to one thing for Mary Reynoso – a lifetime achievement award from the Minority and Small Business Alliance of Southern Arizona.

"This award belongs to the family," Mary told *Copper Area News*. "They've kept me going."

La Casita is very much a family business.

"It takes all of us," Mary explained.

With her five children, 14 grandchildren and 23 great-grandchildren, most of whom live in the Tri-Community, Mary has no problem staffing the restaurant. Six of her grandchildren work full-time at the restaurant and the others pitch in when needed.

Mary grew up in Superior, attending school and graduating from Superior High School in 1956. She moved to Mammoth and got married soon after.

She and her husband opened La Casita in Mammoth, albeit a much smaller building, in May 1970. Business from Magma Copper helped the fledgling restaurant out quite a lot, Mary said.

The restaurant as it stands today includes a series of additions to the original building. In those days, Mary explained, you didn't go to the bank for a loan to expand. "You had to save your money," she said.

In the nearly 50 years of its existence, La Casita (and the Reynoso family) has given a lot back to the community. Terry and Serapio Rodriguez, Mary's daughter and son-in-law, volunteer their time at the Blessed Sacrament Catholic Church, helping out with the students in Catechism and cooking during the Fiestas. The family makes sure to bring food for grieving families. At any given time, you can find a jar on their counter collecting

money for a sick child or for someone who was injured.

"We're a caring community," Mary said.

The caring extended even in the acceptance of the award from the Minority and Small Business Alliance of Southern Arizona. The awards ceremony was held Sept. 26 at the Casino del Sol in Tucson. Cost was \$500 for a table to attend. With many of the Reynosos in attendance, Mary said, "We needed more than one table."

All the funds raised from the event are being used for scholarships.

"Six girls received scholarships (that night)," Mary said, proud to be "helping people go to school."

Businesses from all over Tucson donated prizes that were grouped together into baskets and raffled off. Terry won a basket with tickets to the University of Arizona vs. Arizona State University basketball game, two bottles of wine and a stay for two at a fancy hotel. Funds from the raffles also will benefit scholarships.

Mary hopes that students from San Manuel, Mammoth and Oracle will apply for scholarships from this group.

Mary was nominated for the award by Oracle resident Vivian Sampson and was pleased to accept.

"It was a really great honor," she said.

We're all proud of you, Mary. Congratulations to your entire family.

The Legends of Superior Trails (LOST) Inc. has been a 501(c)3 non-profit organization since 2015. The organization is tasked with helping to maintain, develop and promote hiking, mountain biking and equestrian trails in Superior and the surrounding area.

Recently the organization has kicked off their 2019 Fall Fundraiser to raise money to construct the next segment of the LOST which will connect the US 60 Park to the LOST trailhead located at the Superior Municipal Airport. The fundraiser is "\$3.00 a Foot", for every \$3 donated a foot of trail can be constructed. Recently the Town of Superior secured a long term property easement with the Ruiz Family and BHP to construct the trail. The Army Corps of Engineers and ADOT have all approved the necessary permits to allow the trail to be constructed.

"Everything requires a great deal of cooperation and team work. This full alignment of trail is something many people have been working on over the past decade. The LOST will not only provide recreational access but will also create safe walking paths for our residents, especially our youth to avoid crossing the highway," Mayor Mila Besich explained.

This next segment of trail will connect the entire length of the trail which will allow hikers to hike from the Picket Post Trailhead west of Superior to the Queen Creek Tunnel on the eastern edge of the LOST Trail. Long term plans call for loop trails to be constructed south of Superior through the Resolution Copper recreation mitigations otherwise known as the Recreation Users Group (RUG) plan. This project would add an additional 50 miles of stacked looped trails in the area.

The LOST has applied for multiple grants in conjunction with the Town of Superior to construct this next segment. The LOST works in partnership with the land managers to manage and maintain the LOST.

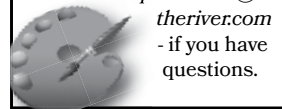
