

Kearny's Water System Aging

rizona's cities and towns have a big problem, a problem growing under our feet. Water and sewer lines installed fifty or more years ago are rusting away, and the financial resolve to fix or replace them is lacking. In the last two years, water line breaks substantially increased in Kearny. Our water filtration plant, which takes out the large metal particles after chlorination takes place, has struggled to do its job. The struggle comes from poor engineering in the first place, which did not take into account elevation-caused water pressure changes which cause water hammering and damage to pipes and equipment.

When excavating to repair the water break on Alden Road this summer, the age damage was evident. Branches off the main water line are severely rusted, and pipes coming off the main are clogging with mineral deposits.

Last year, as the town was planning for new fire hydrants, Fire Chief Kenny Piggott remarked that one of the difficulties we will face is affixing the new hydrants to old lines which are in bad repair. We have the grant to pay for the new hydrants, but what will be found as we install them?

Over fifty years ago, when Kearny came about,

all of Arizona was growing. It was easier for Arizona towns to build new water and sewer lines and treatment plants. People figured that new equipment would require less maintenance, and population growth would provide new water users to pay the rates required.

But in some places, especially in copper towns, the economic growth stalled. Kearny did fine for 20 or 25 years, but eventually the growth stopped and the town began cutting maintenance staff and staff salaries in order to balance the budget. These actions have come back to haunt us, big time! Now we do not have enough workers or enough money to keep things going.

Our water rates are part of the problem. They have remained at pretty much the same low rate, not at all keeping up with the cost of living much less covering all the maintenance required.

We have been working with state and federal agencies on grants and loans to improve our water holding tanks and improve our supply lines. But grants are as scarce as hen's teeth, and we are having a hard time getting the lowinterest and long payment period loans that we require. Arizona's Water Infrastructure Finance Authority (WIFA) stated that our water rates are too low to pay off the loans and cover future maintenance costs, so they consider us a poor financial risk (we have to pay the loans off, after all). Our water rates are, indeed, much below those of almost all towns and cities in Arizona.

I hope that we, as a town, will develop the financial resolve to fix our problem. I think we can develop a stepped increase in our water rates to allow us to get the loans we require. Paying more for our water is better than not having water at all.

Now, on to brighter things. We have just come off the wonderful car show, with people from all over Arizona coming to Kearny. Thanks, Rip and Katie Vache of NAPA, for the new spark of life you bring to us. This Saturday is the third Farmer's Market and Swap Meet next to Rail and Copper Park, and it is growing. This Saturday is also the night of the concert sponsored by the Copper Community Action Board, which will take place at the school auditorium in Winkelman at 5 p.m. It's a fund raiser to help them acquire non-profit status to continue their fine work.
