Election Updates: Rios behind, Woody Cline wins and no changes for LD 8

Voters in the Copper Corridor turned out in record numbers to cast their ballots for

the Presidential and statewide elections, along with those critical elections voters

made their choices for County Supervisors in Pinal and Gila Counties along with Legislative Districts 8.

As the votes began to tally, Supervisor Pete Rios held an early lead over Kevin Cavanaugh for Pinal County Supervisor District 1. As the days of vote counting went on, the lead transferred to Kevin Cavanaugh. At press time incumbent Supervisor Pete Rios is behind by 417 votes. The race has not been finalized but at press time Kevin Cavanaugh was winning with 10,076 votes to Rios' 9,659 votes.

In a statement to Copper Area News Supervisor Rios said, "I congratulate Mr. Cavanaugh. Even though I never got to meet him or debate him on issues, but he got more votes and that's how democracy works. To my constituents in the Copper Corridor and Supervisor District one, thank you for four decades of support. I'll decide any future plans for me next year."

Gila County voters in District 2 easily re-elected Supervisor Woody Cline. Cline beat Bernadette Kniflen with 56.90% of the votes. Total vote count at press time: Supervisor Cline 4,334 (56.90%)

to Bernadette "Bernie" Kniflen's 3,268 (42.90%).

"I learned a lot in my first four years in office and I look forward to working hard and getting even more things done in my next four years. Thank you to all that voted for me," stated Supervisor Cline

Voters in both Gila and Pinal Counties kept the Legislative District 8 incumbents in office. Democratic contender Sharon Girard had an early lead over Frank Pratt and David Cook for the Arizona House of Representatives. At press time the Arizona Secretary of State has declared that Rep. David Cook has secured another term in the House and he will be joined by Frank Pratt who was termed out in the Arizona Senate as the LD 8 House of Representatives. Rep. TJ Shope having been termed out in the House of Representatives ran against former State Senator Barbara McGuire for the LD 8 Senate Seat. Shope maintained a lead throughout the vote tally, winning the seat with 58.44% to 41.56% for McGuire.

The election results will all need to be certified by the County Board of Supervisors before they are official.

HWUSD will remain online; winter sport season cancelled

The Hayden-Winkelman Unified School District has decided to continue online learning until the end of the first semester, which, due to the district's late start, is Jan. 28, 2021.

"The District believes online learning will be the safest for students, families, and the community as COVID-19 case continue to rise in Arizona," explained

Superintendent Jeff Gregorich. The Governing Board will revisit returning to in-person schooling in January, he added.

All HWUSD teachers and support staff have received extensive training to provide quality online instruction for both the academic and social emotional needs of students during the pandemic.

In addition, all students receive iPads and access to internet service as needed.

"We want to provide the best online instruction possible and make certain every student is learning. Our students' academic growth and safety is our top priority, and we will continue to work to ensure every student is receiving a

quality education," said Gregorich.

In addition, the District has canceled the winter sports season, which include basketball and wrestling at both the high school and junior high. The cancelation was due to the concern for the safety of the players and their families as COVID-19 numbers continue to rise.

AZYP will host virtual training meeting

In partnership with Copper Corridor Substance Abuse Coalition, the Arizona Youth Partnership (AZYP) will be holding a training meeting, 'Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) Presentation', on Friday, Nov. 13, starting at 9 a.m. and ending at 10 a.m. at the Safety Miners area in Superior Town Hall. Due to necessary safety precautions brought about by the COVID-19 pandemic attendees will join in via Zoom.

This training is available to anyone who wants to understand the impact of ACEs on the health and well-being of Arizona youth. If you are a teacher, coach, pastor, scout leader, medical professional, an

employer who has youthful employees or someone else who regularly deals with youth this program is meant to help you understand the needs of those who have experience or are experiencing ACEs?

What qualifies as an ACE? A trauma that occurs before age 18. This could be physical, mental or even situational, such as recurrent physical or sexual abuse; contact sexual abuse; alcoholism or drug use in the home; incarcerated family member(s), household members who are depressed, suicidal, mentally ill or institutionalized; having no parents or only one parent; a parent who was treated violently; emotional neglect and physical

neglect.

Adults who were asked if they grew up with exposure to any of the above traumas, it was found that the higher the number of exposures there were had a direct correlation to certain health, social and economic risks that they experienced as adults.

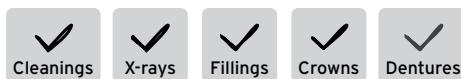

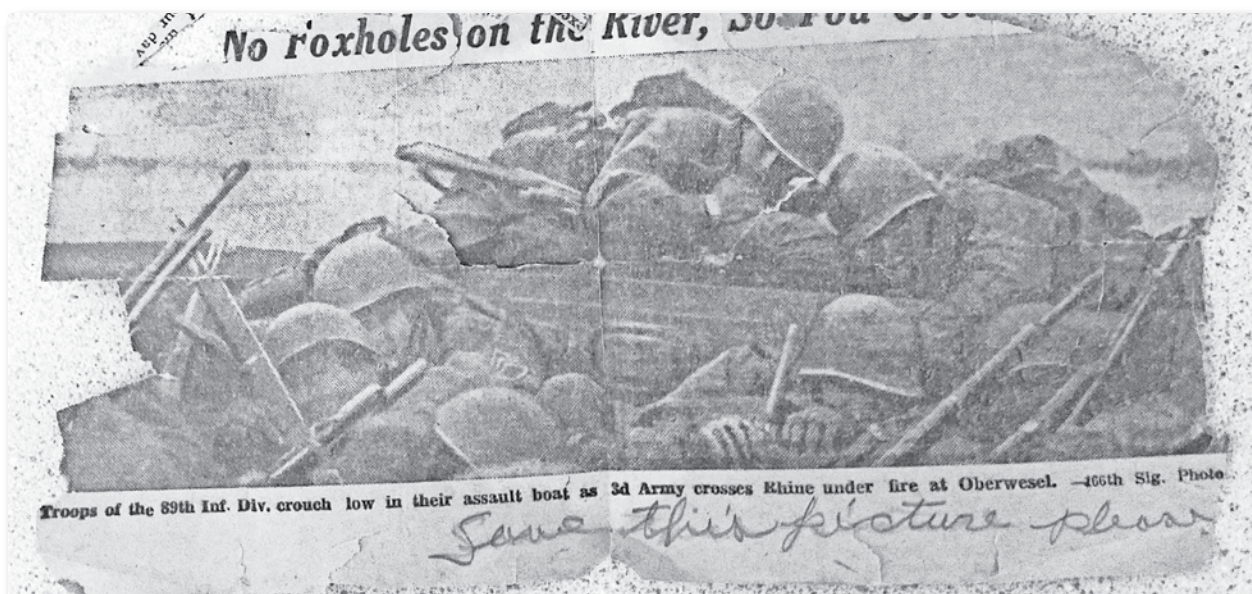
Celebrating Our Veterans: Cruz B. Aguirre

This year we celebrate the 75th anniversary of the end of World War II and today, Nov. 11, we celebrate Veterans Day.

These two dates mean so much more to the family

Like so many of our World War II Veterans, Mr. Aguirre is no longer of this earth. He died in 1987 at the young age of 67, leaving his family to grieve.

The Aguirre family reached out to *Copper Area News Publishers*, wanting to do a tribute to their father on Veterans Day, to tell his story so others could see what he gave in service to his country.

"I asked my mom questions about our dad," his son Daniel Aguirre said, "for he was not much for talking about the war. He would rarely talk about himself in general.

"My mom stated, 'He was a man that did a job and left it there. He wouldn't talk about it later,'" Daniel added.

Cruz was born May 27, 1920 and was a member of the Civilian Conservation Corps, working at the Grand Canyon. He served in the CCC from Oct. 10, 1939 until Sept. 13, 1940.

When he was 22, he enlisted in the Armed Services. Just like so many other young men of his era, he was ready to defend his country. The attack on Pearl Harbor on Dec. 7, 1941, brought so many uncertainties to all.

On Feb. 3, 1942, Cruz reported to Fort Bliss, Texas, to begin his training. The first assignment for this young Combat Infantryman was the Aleutian Islands in Alaska. He left on June 19, 1942.

Japan had invaded the small islands as a strategic stronghold.

"While traveling by Dutch Harbor, his first eyewitness of war was seeing smoke bellowing from the building that had been attacked," Cruz's son said.

The extreme weather on the Islands created a challenge to both American forces and machinery.

"He recounted having to guide himself from building to building by holding onto ropes that were

secured to each building," Daniel said.

His service to the Aleutian Islands concluded March 31, 1944.

Cruz was sent back to the states for additional training and was reassigned to the 89th Infantry division under the command of General Thomas D. Finley. On Jan. 10, 1945, Cruz left for France and arrived at Camp Lucky Strike on Jan. 21, 1945.

His unit participated in several major battles as they made their way through Central Europe. The 89th joined the Third Army under the command of General George Patton while advancing through the Rhineland and crossing the Sauer, Moselle and Rhine rivers – all while under fire.

One of Cruz's worst encounters during World War II occurred while crossing the Rhine River.

"He once told my mom that he hid in the shadows of doorways as German troops marched in front of him. He was also listed as Missing in Action (MIA). He was with a group of men that took some German soldiers prisoners while an MIA. After a few days they came across an American camp. He was reunited with his troop at that camp," his son recalled.

Cruz once sent back a newspaper clipping of a photo, asking for them to keep it safe for him. "He never explained to us why it meant so much to him," Daniel said.

On April 5, 1945, Cruz's unit encountered resistance in the town of Eisenach, Germany. They continued

fighting until April 18, 1945 when they secured the town of Zwickau, which was the last major engagement in Europe. Victory in Europe Day, V-E Day, was May 9, 1945.

Cruz separated from the Army on Nov. 13, 1945, and he returned to Hayden to work for the Kennecott Copper Company. He married

Amelia Lopez on Dec. 28, 1947, and the couple raised six children, Cruz, Lupe (Guzman), Gabriel, David, Daniel and Edward.

“He was a very humble man,” Daniel said. “As I look back, I realize my dad was the ultimate family man. He would cash in his vacation time to buy us school clothes or the necessities and

rarely took a vacation. Holidays were always celebrated in our household. He loved the game of baseball, playing pool, and, as a young man, he enjoyed dancing.”

families who so selflessly share their loved ones so that we have the freedoms we do in this country.

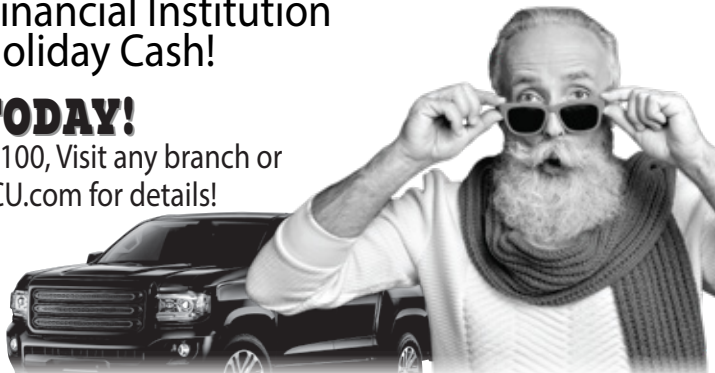
