# Two bomb threats disrupt classes at M-SM Pk-12 School; two students facing charges

Two students at Mammoth-San Manuel Pk-12 School are facing charges following bomb threats made last week.

According to the Pinal County Sheriff's Office, on Thursday, Nov. 7, at approximately 1:30 p.m. deputies were dispatched to the school in San Manuel for a reported bomb threat. A student discovered a written threat in a bathroom and told a staff member.

The students were brought to the

football stadium while deputies swept the campus.

Nothing suspicious was found and the building was cleared and classes resumed.

On Friday afternoon, the student responsible for writing the threat was identified. The juvenile male was booked into the Pinal County Juvenile Detention Center and was charged with one count of terroristic threats and one count of disruption of an educational institution.

In a second incident, on the morning of Friday, Nov. 8, a student viewed a second potential threat on social media and showed it to their teacher. The teacher then reported it to the School Resource Officer, who began investigating.

The campus was placed on a "soft" lockdown that lasted for three hours, forcing cancellation of the school's Veterans Day celebration.

The student, a male juvenile, who

posted the threat on social media was identified. He admitted to sending the image as "a joke" following the previous day's incident. Charges of disruption of an educational institution were filed on Tuesday against the student.

PCSO Public Information Officer Lauren Reimer said both students have been suspended for 9 days, and long term suspension (expulsion) has also been requested.

## Ray and Oracle school districts pass override/bond elections; other Pinal districts not as fortunate

Voters in the Oracle Elementary School District and the Ray Unified School

District approved their respective bond and override elections. These elections help the districts to increase their budgets in addition to the revenues they receive from grants and the State of Arizona.

Ongoing cuts of state and federal funding have created an increased need for local school districts to call for override and bond elections.

Voters in the Ray Unified School District approved their override continuation with 60.56% voting to approve the

continuation of the override; 39.44% voted no on the continuation. There were a total of 568 mail in ballots returned.

The Governing Board of the Oracle Elementary school district called for

# Evan Apuron repeats as State Champion in the Butterfly at State Championship Swim Meet, setting state record

The 2019 Division III High School State Championship Swim Meet was held at the Phoenix Country Day Aquatic Center in Paradise Valley on Nov. 7-8.

Junior Evan Apuron successfully defended his title in the 100 Yard Butterfly with a winning time of 50.71. His winning time is new State Record for Division III Swimming, edging out the previous record of 50.90 set by Zabric Kline from Bourgade Catholic High School in 2016.

Apuron also swam the 50 Freestyle and finished in 4th place with his personal best time (and School Record Time) of 21.41.

The 35 points that Apuron earned were enough for the Miners to finish in 20th place in the team standings (out of 58 teams in Division III).

“The State Record is a huge achievement. The fact that he is the fastest Butterflyer in Division III history is a testament on how hard Evan has worked to make it happen.” Coach Alex Gort proudly asserted, “In these times of instant gratification, Evan has shown the perseverance necessary to achieve his long term goals. As a Junior, I know he has bigger goals, and I am excited about what the future holds for him.”

an Override Continuation and a Bond election. Both requests were approved with a wide margin: 59.24% of the voters approved the override continuation, 40.76% voted against the ballot measure. A total of 6,961 votes were cast in this election. The voters also approved a bond with 60.82% of the voters voting yes and 39.18% voting no. There were a

total of 6,763 ballots cast in this election. The bonds will be used to improve school facilities and technology.

Other Pinal County school districts were not as fortunate in their requests to the voters. Voters in the Apache Junction, Florence, Maricopa and Santa Cruz school districts voted no on bond and ballot measures.
