



2022 General Election Round Up

There were many races close to home that many awaited results, with so many races too close to call and an abundance of day-of-election voters who dropped their mail in ballots at the polls, that vote tallies took several days.

The countywide sales tax increase, Proposition 469 also known as the Pinal Regional Transportation Tax, did not pass. The proposition failed by 2,464 votes. The Superior and SaddleBrooke West precincts supported the proposition, but voters across the county and in the Copper Corridor communities such as Kearny, Mammoth, Oracle and San Manuel, residents voted mostly against the sales tax increase. Had the proposition passed, the taxes generated would have allocated \$10 million for each of the smaller Towns (Kearny,


Mammoth, Superior and Eloy) while also helping to construct new north-south and east-west corridors across the county which would help ease traffic congestion between job

centers.

Voters in Kearny approved the Home Rule Option (proposition 475), which allows the town to spend above the State of Arizona expenditure

limitations. Without the approval of the home rule, the Town would not be able to spend grant funding or other funding that does not come from



Supeiror Mayor and Council sworn in;

The Superior Town Council held its last meeting for 2022 last week. The majority of the meeting was ceremonial with Mayor Besich and the Town Council recognizing Councilmember Stephen Estatico who recently retired from elected Town Council service.

Judge Ellie Brown attended the meeting to swear in

Mayor Mila Besich for her second full term serving as Mayor. Besich was elected in 2016 as Mayor and ran unopposed in 2018 and 2022. Council members Amy Byrd, Gilbert Aguilar and Michael Alonzo were also sworn in for four-year terms. Byrd is a newcomer to the council; she was elected during the August primary after

running as a write-in candidate. Aguilar and Alonzo are incumbent council members, Alonzo serves as Vice-Mayor was elected in 2013 and will serve another four-year term. Aguilar has served on the Superior Town Council for 15 years; he was also elected to a four-year term.





the State of Arizona.

Oracle voters selected Wendy O'Dell and Gary Terrell to serve on the Oracle Elementary School District Governing Board. They were the top two vote-getters. Donna Pedota and Jeri Taylor came up short.

As predicted, many of the statewide election results were not final and most races were not called for almost a week past the Nov. 8 Election Day. While many express relief that the never-ending political commercials were over, voters waited in suspense to learn who would win the statewide offices of Governor, Secretary of State, Attorney General and

Superintendent of Public Instruction. The race between Senator Mark Kelly and Blake Masters also took several days to call, with the Associated Press finally declaring Senator Kelly the winner on Saturday.

As of press time, Katie Hobbs, the Democratic candidate, won the seat of Governor against Kari Lake. On Saturday, the Associated Press also declared that Adrian Fontes won the seat for Secretary of State defeating Mark Finchem, who campaigned as an election denier. Kris Mayes remained in the lead against Abe Hamadeh for the position of Attorney

General. Kathy Hoffman and Tom Horne battled back and forth, both taking their turns being in the lead for the State Superintendent of Public Instruction. At press time Republican Tom Horne was back in the lead with a 6,556-vote lead. The Attorney General and Superintendent of Public Instruction races were still too close to call and may be forced into a recount.

Voters in the Copper Corridor will also have a new Congressman – Eli Crane who defeated incumbent Tom O'Halleran. Crane won the seat with a 25,990-lead. When the Copper Corridor was redistricted

into Congressional District 2, many predicted that the newly drawn district would be favorable to Republican candidates. O'Halleran has served the Copper Corridor area and Congressional District 1 since 2017.

At the State House, voters in the Copper Corridor will be represented by Senator Wendy Rodgers and Representatives David Cook and David Marshall. Rep. Cook a resident of Globe, also served as the representative for the area when he was elected to Legislative District 8. Following the redistricting, he was eligible to run in the newly formed Legislative District 7.
