Looking Back at the Previous Week's Happenings

The calendar usually determines the subject matter of this column. It is written well ahead of its Wednesday publication, so I try to focus on the town matter which is most important for everyone to know about.

Sometimes some important things get left by the wayside as I try to meet the deadline. Let's take a look back at some things.

Thanks to Kearny residents who contributed funds, the Rotary auction (with the strong support of the Dunn and

Misita families) ASARCO, Resolution Copper and several volunteers, our town swimming pool is now completed. It sports a new pebble finish and new gutters, wiring, and other improvements. Unlike the old pool, we do not drain this one in the winter months so we do have the added expense of some chemicals and electricity. However, it will be easier to chemically balance and maintain. Next summer will be a happier one than we had this year.

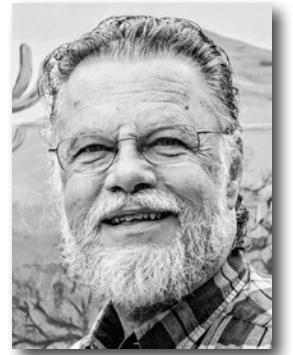
The fire truck which was given us by

the City of Tempe, along with other equipment, has been put to use. Most recently, it "stood guard" as the town crew burned the collected brush pile. That brush pile, by the way, was about the only thing which escaped the fire this summer!

The Arizona Department of Public Safety has extended its support to Kearny through January so Sergeant Dave Blue can stay on as our Interim Chief of Police. Chief Blue is also helping the Town of Hayden. The task force to develop a proposal for a single police force for the towns of Kearny, Hayden, Winkelman, and Mammoth held its first organizational meeting. It will now start its work with the help of the League of Cities, Central Arizona Governments, the Department of Public Safety, and financial analyst Pat Walker.

The Town of Kearny is working with the Arizona Water Infrastructure Finance Authority (WIFA) and the U.S. Department of Agriculture to receive a loan for water tank repair and other items. In order to receive this long-term, low-interest loan, our water rates will have to increase to cover future maintenance (as I reported in this column last week). A hearing will be held in December.

The town is noticeably cleaner since the two Journey for a Clean Kearny events this year. There has also been a notable uptick in the number of people giving greater care to their homes and yards. Beginning in December, a Yard of the Month program

will begin, spotlighting the improvements people are making.

I was recently elected to the Board of the Copper Country Economic Development Commission (CCEDC). I continue my work on the economic development committee of Central Arizona governments. Ray Federal Credit Union, focusing on the future – new branch and small business loans available

Adam Perlman the Manager for Ray Federal Credit Union set out on a mission to grow the Kearny-based credit union into more a regional financial institution. Perlman's first interactions with the branch was when he was working as an auditor that audits credit unions. When the branch

manager job opened up he applied and the board hired him.

Two of the most recent projects by the RFCU is the successful application to the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) which provides funding to local financial institutions to create a revolving loan fund small and emerging business loans. The USDA loans can be applied for at the Ray Federal Credit Union, and can be used to purchase capital expenses, equipment and in some cases operating expenses. These loans are only available to businesses in rural Pinal and Gila Counties focusing on

the communities of the Copper Corridor. In other areas of the country these loans are used to help a business grow or get off the ground; with low interest rates and flexibility these loans often to help fill a niche that other financial institutions can not meet. Businesses are still required to have solid business plans in their loan application process.

The other major project is the opening of a new branch

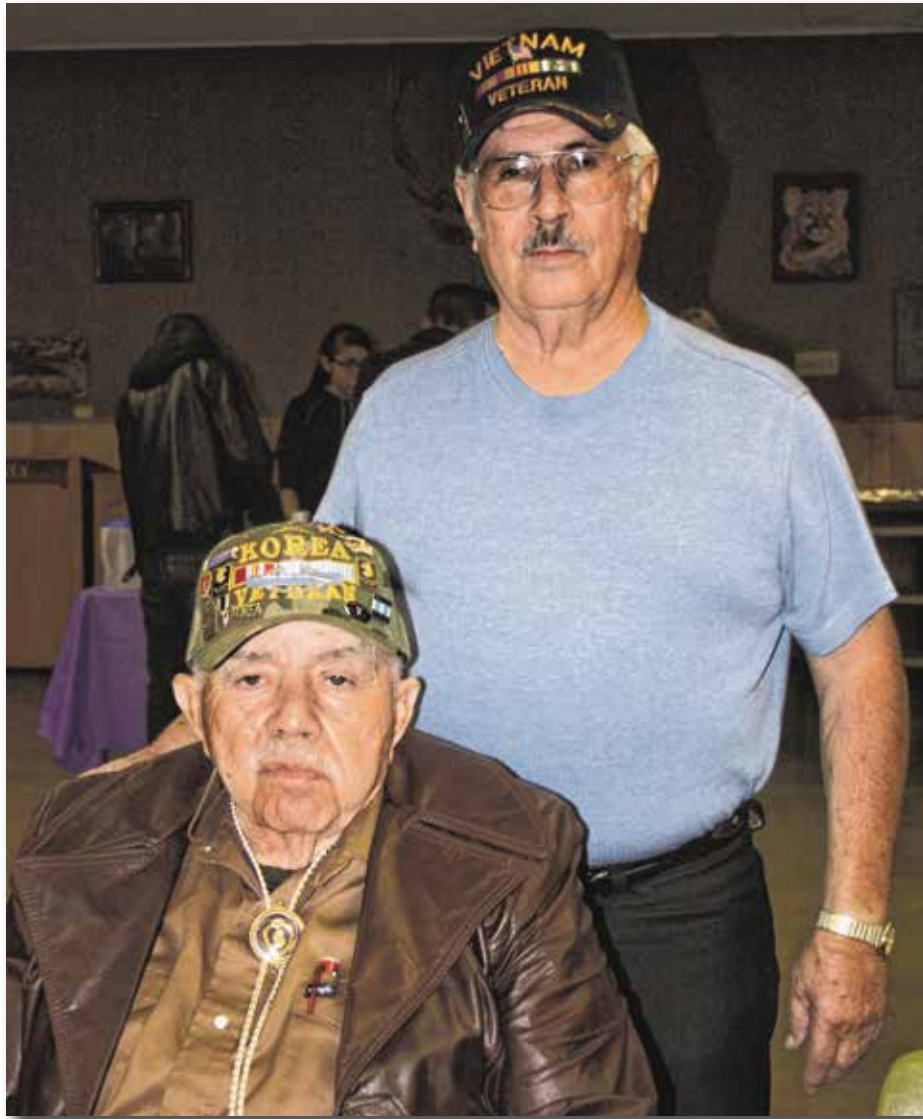

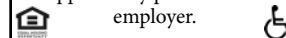
