OBITUARY

Mary Louise Eck

Mary Louise Eck, 93, went to see the Lord on Saturday, Nov. 7, 2020. She passed away due to complications brought on by COVID-19.

Born to the Reverend Jacob E. Dale and Mary A. Dale on June 20, 1927 in Wheeling, WV, she experienced a long life of service to her family, her church and her beloved community of Kearny. Mary Louise and husband Bob (who preceded her in death in 1995) operated Bob's Drive-In from the early 1960s until the mid-1980s where their children learned the valuable lesson of work ethic. After retiring from the Drive-In, Mary Louise never slowed down. She returned to university to complete what she started in her younger years and achieved a degree in Early Childhood Development. Soon after, she received the position of Town Librarian. As an avid reader, she loved to work with young people to promote the idea of "reading is fundamental" to success in learning. She especially enjoyed the children and the Story Hour for the young ones just learning how to read. Other interests included babysitting many of the local kids who, by now, have grandkids of their own. She also proofread for the Copper Basin News, Superior Sun and San Manuel Miner for several years.

Mary Louise believed that service to community was important and served in many organizations, including being a member of the Board of ARC, a member of P.E.O., the Board of the Copper Basin Community Health Care Foundation, the Library Board and Friends of the Library, and was named Kearny Citizen of the Year a few years back. Mary Louise was a member of a team of dedicated, concerned citizens that believed that maintaining health

services in this area was essential. As a means of supporting the clinic, the team started the Hand-Me-Up Shop whose volunteers continue to serve the community today.

Being a daughter of a Lutheran minister, Mary Louise was deeply rooted in her faith. Along with a couple of other believers, they were instrumental in starting a mission Lutheran



Church that met in the former Episcopal Church which eventually became the Hosler's home. After several years the congregational members dwindled and services were closed, so she found a new church home at the Church of the Good Shepherd (Methodist) where she was a member of the Leadership Team, sang in the choir and participated fully in all events and many Bible studies.

Mary Louise is survived by her four children, Richard (Linda) of Tyler, Texas, Cynthia Parker (Neil) of Chandler, George (Julie) of Mesa and Robert "R.E." of Apache Junction. She was blessed with 10 grandchildren and 15 great-grandchildren, all of whom, along with many other relatives and friends, will miss her, but realize she's now where she wanted to be.

Sam Hosler summarized Mary Louise's life best in an article he wrote about her in 2014 when he quoted Jesus. Jesus said, "I came not to be served, but to serve."

No immediate services are planned at present due to COVID-19, but a "Celebration of Life" service is planned after the pandemic has subsided.



CAC celebrates Arizona Apprenticeship Week, recognizing successful business partnerships

Central Arizona College is celebrating Arizona Apprenticeship Week, Nov. 15-21, 2020. CAC is providing innovative training and opportunities for companies to upskill their employees to ensure that Pinal County has a strong workforce.

Oracle Community Learning Garden Engineer for a Day: All aboard who's coming aboard!

An opportunity has pulled into the station! Families from all over are being offered the opportunity to make an appointment on any offered Saturday to run trains at the Oracle Community Learning Garden (OCLG) during November and December.

It was in July of last year that the model train railroad became an active part of the OCLG, thanks in large part to the efforts of Craig Anderson, who has been enjoying model railroading for over 40 years. Craig is a member of the Gadsen-Pacific Toy Railroad Museum, Tucson Garden Railroad Society and the Arizona Model Railroading Association, all of which helped in this project, joining many others who donated train and track parts and volunteered their labor.

The purpose of the OCLG model railroad has always been two-fold, as a further attraction to the garden and as a means of investing children with a desire to explore the subjects of robotics, remotes and model railroads. Times have changed, but the purpose remains. With a few added safety

precautions, it is possible to spend time at the OCLG, learning and having fun still.

These free Kid's Railroad operating sessions at the OCLG began Saturday, Nov. 14, and will continue through the holidays. Each operating session will be 45 minutes in length. The public, donors and supporters may schedule an appointment to operate "G" scale model trains at OCLG.

The dates available are Saturday, Nov. 21 and 28; Dec. 5, 12 and 19; and Jan. 2. For each Saturday, there are four morning sessions: 8 a.m. - 8:45 a.m., 9 a.m. - 9:45 a.m., 10 a.m. - 10:45 a.m. and 11 a.m. - 11:45 a.m. To schedule an appointment, call Craig Anderson at 602-657-4535.

For safety's sake, only one family can be on site at a time, so it is imperative that you arrive at your specific time. The equipment will be sanitized after each appointment and masks will be required for all in attendance. Visitors may bring chairs, refreshments, hats and cameras. A restroom will be available

A mare motel? Not for horses but for cows

Mammoth-San Manuel PreK-12 continues to add to its Agriculture Program with a mare motel, not for horses, but for students' cows.

David Aronson Jr., Vice-President of the Mammoth San Manuel School Board, a Pinal County State Trooper and his wife, as well as Tim Scott and student, Samuel Scott volunteered their time last week to finish putting the roof on the structure.

The mare motel was purchased with CTE grant funds. It is the district's JTED and CTE grant funds that continue to supply students with the equipment they need to continue the school's various programs: autos, welding, construction, cabinet making, digital photography, agriculture and early childhood education. Having these programs available to students allows them the opportunity to receive industry certifications leading to jobs after high school graduation. The Agriculture Program is in its third year and has had many successes. San Manuel's FFA chapter qualified as a two-star National Champion (out of three stars which is difficult to achieve). Our CDE Poultry team became a nationally qualified team this year. One of San Manuel's graduates, Connor Sawyer achieved his American FFA degree, something that takes commitment over all four high school years to obtain. Administrator Julie Dale-Scott received FFA State Administrator of the Year for her commitment to the FFA program.

All of the district's JTED and Career Technical Education Programs give students hands on training for the real world, open up opportunities for jobs, allow for dual credit while in high school (which means early college credits), and the opportunity to learn a new trade.

"We are very lucky to have volunteers in the community like Bino Sanchez help us in our construction class with

his expertise. Once we are able to go back to school and things are safer we hope more experts will volunteer to help with these programs," Dale-Scott said.

In past years SaddleBrooke Community Outreach has also afforded transportation for students to travel to JTED

locations offering specific programs like Cosmetology, Culinary Arts, Graphic/Web Design, Nursing, and Fire Science, etc. (https://pimajted.org/programs/)

"Opportunities are surrounding our students, they just have to take advantage of them," Dale-Scott said.



Florence Prison and the Mexican Revolution

Copper Area News has received some articles from a former corrections officer from Arizona State Prison. This retired officer spent 25 years with the Arizona Department of Corrections working all custody levels from juvenile detention units to Death Row. The author wishes to remain anonymous. He hopes to provide the readers with a view of what it is like working with inmates and what life is like behind prison walls.

INTRODUCTION

ike many former Arizona Department of Corrections employees and citizens of the town of Florence, I was shocked and saddened to hear that the original Florence prison yard was going to be shut down by the state. The old prison opened in 1908. For me it holds a lot of memories and an enthralling history. Many interesting characters including inmates and staff have passed through the gates. Even Hollywood celebrities have visited the prison. With that in mind, a few stories about the history of the Florence Prison seem appropriate.

The job of a corrections officer is not easy. The nature of the job, working with men or women behind bars can be stressful. Working in high custody units can add to the stress. The Arizona Department of Corrections has a high staff turnover rate. One in five staff members quit within the first couple of years of being hired or use the training and experience they receive to transfer to Sheriff departments or Federal corrections. Maximum custody inmates are either there because they are doing

You may wonder, what does the prison at Florence, Arizona and the Mexican Revolution have in common? But, did you know that three important people involved in the Mexican Revolution of 1910 - 1920 were once inmates at the Florence Territorial Prison. These inmates were Ricardo Flores Magon, Antonio I. Villareal and Librado Rivera. Not much is known of their stay at the prison but they continued to espouse their political ideas and advocate for the revolution while in prison and upon their release. Thomas Rynning was the first Warden of the Territorial

long sentences, are convicted of violent crimes or they are problem inmates while in prison. Inmates on Death Row are under a sentence of death and have nothing to lose by acting out against staff or other inmates. Officers must always be on the alert to prevent these inmates from harming other inmates or staff. To understand the type of inmates that are housed on Death Row, I will provide you with a few of their stories, the crimes they committed and some of their prison life.

Prison at Florence. He also played a part in the history of the Mexican Revolution in an incident that is considered to be a spark that may have ignited the revolution.

Ricardo Flores Magon is not a well known name in the United States but in the country of Mexico he is revered as one of the most important figures in the Mexican Revolution. Using his newspaper "Regeneracion" and his organizing of the workers for the Industrial Workers of the World (IWW), he boldly criticized the injustices of Mexico's military dictatorship led by Porfirio Diaz. Magon was an anarchist and one of the founders of the Parrido Liberal Mexicano (Mexican Liberal Party). He worked to build the revolutionary movement that would eventually overthrow Diaz. In 1904, due to his political alliances and his criticism of the Diaz government, he was threatened with death and forced to leave Mexico, fleeing to the United states.

In the United States, Magon and his associates continued to publish their newspaper and agitate for a revolution in Mexico. The Mexican and United States

governments then began to repress him and his movement. His association with the Industrial Workers of the World or Wobblies as they were commonly known was seen as a threat to capitalism in the United States.

In 1907, Magon along with Librado Rivera and Antonio I. Villareal were arrested in Los Angeles, California for alleged violations of the U.S. neutrality laws. They were held in jail for 20 months without a trial. In March 1909, they were moved to Tombstone, Arizona for trial. They were convicted of "Conspiring to Commit an Offense Against the United States" and sentenced to serve 18 months in the Territorial Prison in Yuma.

They were moved to the newly built Territorial Prison in Florence, Arizona where they were held incommunicado. They were not allowed to have any writing published nor could they write letters. It is known that Magon was able to smuggle out letters through his attorney. He would also sew articles and letters into his underwear. An inmate laundry worker sympathetic

Copper Area News is committed to providing our readers with as much information as possible. We post a daily update on our Facebook page with the total positive COVID-19 Data. This graph shows the daily counts of positive cases for the past week as of press time on Nov. 17, 2020.

There are a few points we would like our readers to consider when following this data.

- 1. This will continue to be a rolling total of positive cases. It does not reflect recoveries or deaths. The Arizona Department of Health Services does not break out this data.
- 2. If you see a reduction in numbers from day to day it is most likely due to a data entry error or mis-coding of a zip code (at the state level).
- 3. This is all zip code based data; most of our zip codes include unincorporated areas. There is no way to track exactly which areas each of the positive cases are. Example, Kearny and Winkelman each have small communities in their zip code that are not in the Town's incorporated boundaries.
- 4. If you live in Gila County, please follow the Gila County Health and Emergency Management, Facebook. They have maintained their data on recoveries and current positive
- 5. You can follow other data such as ICU bed use, Ventilator use and hospital capacity online: https://bit.ly/3inh280


