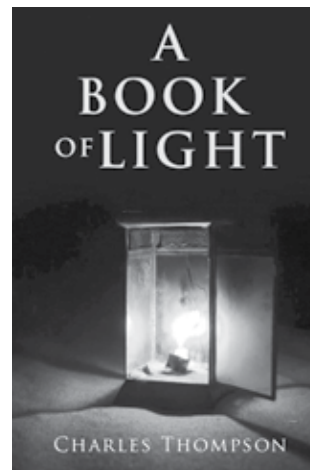

## Hayden coaches expecting great things this year

The Hayden High School boys and girls basketball teams are ready to face the 2023-24 season.

"I am excited for the start of basketball season at Hayden High School," said boys head coach Ramon Gonzales.

"We have continued to work throughout the summer with conditioning, participating in open gym and joining basketball summer leagues in Tucson and Apache Junction to help strengthen our athletes and teams. We had a good season last year, earning region champions and making it to the quarter finals," he said.

"We are short some great seniors from last season, but I feel confident in our returning seniors this year, Deondre Collier and Keiston Pool. Our juniors Paul Gaither, Joshua Manriquez, Jose Fong and Frank Contreras are ready to take the roles as upperclassmen, work hard and set the tone and provide great examples to lead the team. We have a talented group of eight sophomores that really stepped-up last season when called up and played key roles in games that included Mario Hong, Tyler Garner, and Kino Lorona."

Gonzales continued, "This year the Lobo Spirit, pride,

and hunger to excel is at an all-time high from our boys winning the Baseball State Championship in the Spring and ending the fall football season as 2023 Football State Champions. Our basketball varsity and junior varsity players and coaching staff are ready to start the season and continue to give it our all to represent our school, community, and Lobo family at every game. I encourage you to come out and watch these teams play with their Lobo Pride!"

Girls head coach Jacque Pool is just as excited.

"I look forward to this season with five returning players including only one senior, Alexis De Los Reyes," Pool said. "I have six new players to the team, majority of them freshman. We had a good summer playing in summer leagues and in a tournament. I was able to start the freshman off early and get them ready for the regular season. I am expecting a strong defense. My players need to be quick on their feet, have good court awareness, and communicate well to effectively defend against our opponents. As for offense, movement is crucial to be successful. My players need to constantly be moving, passing, and setting screens to create open shots and lanes to drive to the basket. Having a balanced offensive attack can keep the defense guessing and create more opportunities for the team to score. But perhaps the most

important factor for a winning season is teamwork. My players need to trust each other and work together to achieve their goals. This means communicating on the court, being unselfish with the ball, and supporting each other both on and off the court. When a team has a strong sense of camaraderie and unity, they can accomplish great things together."

The Lobos and Lady Lobos began their season on Friday, Nov. 17, with an away game at The Gregory School. The girls suffered a tough loss of 28-45, while the boys team also took the loss in their 44-64 game. But they undoubtedly gained some valuable experience playing as a team for the first time.

The boys and girls are scheduled to compete in the Boyd Baker Tournament at Amphi High School starting on Nov. 20.

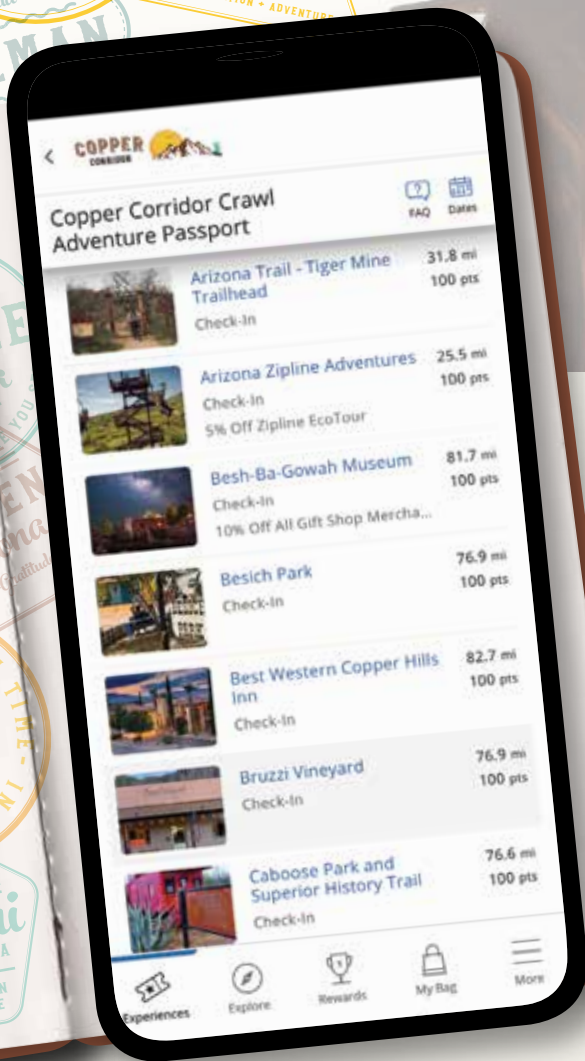
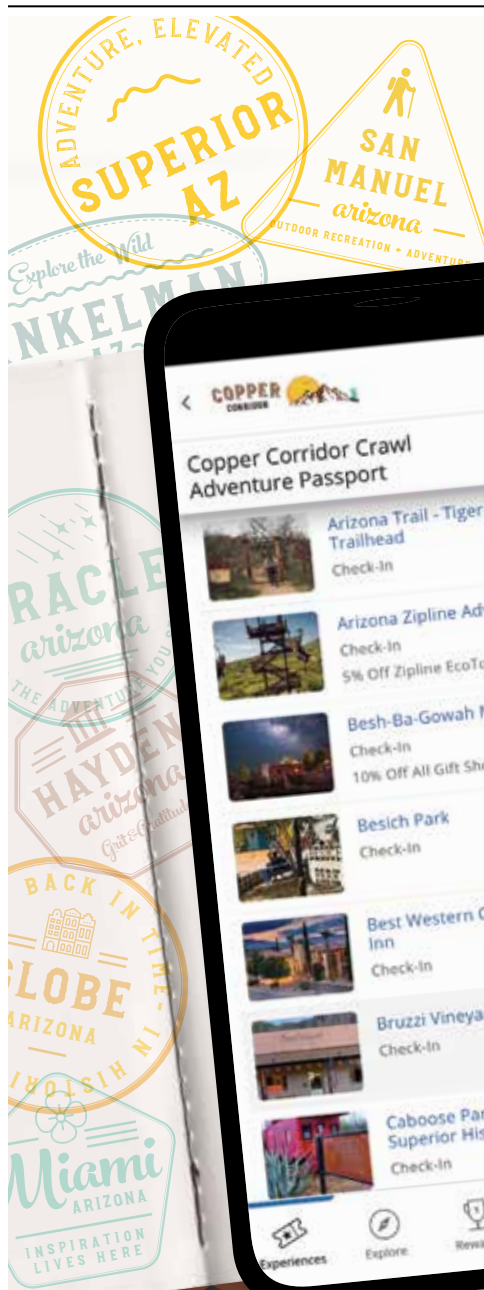

other important work, primarily as dump trucks, during our warmer weather. By late summer, crews begin to install the large plow blades and other equipment so those trucks are once again prepared as large, powerful snowplows.

Systems that measure and spread deicing agents on highways also are installed each year in the beds and on the backs of snowplows.

ADOT also held winter planning meetings in Flagstaff in early October that included hands-on training and classroom sessions for employees who will be available as snowplow operators in the coming months. Each year, ADOT has approximately 400 employees who are trained and approved to work as snowplow

operators.

ADOT reminds drivers to also prepare for traveling in winter conditions, if necessary. Helpful safety information is available at [azdot.gov/KnowSnow](http://azdot.gov/KnowSnow). ADOT also provides highway conditions all year via ADOT’s 511 Travel Information site, the AZ511 app or by calling 511. Highway information and answers are also available via ADOT’s X (formerly Twitter) feed (@ArizonaDOT) and the agency’s Facebook page ([facebook.com/AZDOT](https://www.facebook.com/AZDOT)).

During a busy 2022-23 winter season, ADOT snowplows logged more than 1.25 million miles clearing snow and ice from the state’s highways. The figure was 605,000 miles during the 2021-22 winter season. The agency’s snowplow operators

logged more than 66,000 hours working to remove snow and ice as safely and

quickly as possible from state highways last winter.
