For those who have not heard, or who need a refresher course, STEM schools are specifically focused on science, technology, engineering and math. STEAM schools are focused on these and also art. There are


Kearny has 'Good Bones'

ighteen years ago, when my wife and I were considering moving to Kearny, we were impressed with the layout of the town. Kearny was built at the same time that many subdivisions came about in the Valley of the Sun. But, unlike the flat landscapes of Phoenix, Kearny's homes were arranged on curving streets, cascading down the elevated areas to the Gila River land below. As a result, the pitch provides most of the homes with a view of the mountains and the Gila River basin.

We have been thankful ever since for the beauty of Kearny, which is in the best part of the Sonoran Desert. Most of the homes are modest and well-built. Over the years, remodelings have changed the cookiecutter layout of the houses resulting in charming variations of our rather typical ranch-style residences. The engineers of the town provided four main arteries down the slope, and chose to use a v-shaped top surface to provide good drainage for the town. This has worked well, and except for a few problem areas (notably in our Uptown and in the mixed-use area across the railroad tracks), flooding has not been a problem.

I have been thinking about these things before Thanksgiving Day. This town has "good bones." It has served us well, and will continue to do so for a long time.

I also have been thinking about the "good bones" of the people who live here, hardworking families, retirees, and our winter residents too. I am thankful for the people who give of their time and substance to make Kearny a great place to live. Just for a minute, join me in giving thanks for our volunteer fire department, our ambulance corps, and our police department. They have been making many changes to streamline and improve their work. Did you know that this year our Emergency Medical Services team has managed to cut

its response time by several minutes? You may be aware that, early this coming year, arrangements are being made for another fire truck and, as a result, our fire insurance rating will be upgraded. Our police department now has more full-time officers, and soon we will have a new Chief of Police. In recent time, the Copper Basin Health Care Foundation (which owns and operates the old hospital basin) worked in coordination with the hospital in Globe to provide our fine clinic. At the same time, the helipad was built and Kearny is a center for emergency air response. The Copper Basin Health volunteers, who run the Hand Me Up shop, have provided many thousands of dollars to provide training for medical workers and to help the Health Care Foundation maintain the hospital building.

Yes, I wish our economy could be stronger. Let's take our "good bones" and flesh them out in the months and years ahead. All in all. I thank God for who and what we are.

also e-STEM schools, where the primary focus is on the environmental sciences. According to information provided by Mr. Nebeker, the Klein Independent School District Education Foundation (the Foundation), in celebration of Klein ISD's 75th anniversary, has commissioned a trailer to be transformed into a mobile learning laboratory classroom that will travel throughout the district offering lessons This is an idea which stems (no pun intended) from mobile book programs, including Klein ISD's own Reading Express, which was funded in 2010.

The STEAM Express, which hit the streets at the beginning of this month, is a 48-foot long trailer, equipped with heating and cooling, the internet, video streaming capabilities, portable tables, touchscreen learning stations with touch screen computers, a wheelchair lift and ramp, and a fold down stage with awning. It will hold up to 15 students at a time, giving them the opportunity for hands-on experiences on subjects related to science, technology, engineering, art, and/or mathematics.

The Foundation raised over \$250,000 to make this project happen, as well as having received generous donations from district vendors, such as a 55-foot monitor that will be used to make sure students in the audience can clearly see the instructor's presentation.

Program coordinator Bill Nebeker, in his role as a full-time instructor, will be in charge of creating programs and activities. "I find myself to be the luckiest guy in the world,"said Bill. "I want to find different ways to teach concepts, something that engages students. This is right up my alley."

He continued, ""The STEAM Express is going to get students minds moving faster. We get to ask them, 'What are you able to do?' Not just say, 'Here's a lesson, do this.". We want students to go beyond today, and think of what they can do tomorrow, how they can change the world," he said.

The mission of the Klein ISD Education Foundation is to help teachers and schools realize their dreams for their classrooms. The STEAM Express is one example of Continued on page 4

Resolution Copper Mining completes deepest single lift shaft in America

Superior, Ariz. - Last week the Resolution Copper Project accomplished a key milestone completing construction of 28 foot diameter shaft 10 to final depth of 6,943 feet (2116.2m). The company has used this project to gather geotechnical information needed to design a mine that is expected to produce 25 percent of the nation's copper demand. Construction of the shaft began in 2008.

"The completion of this 1.3 mile deep vertical shaft is truly unprecedented in North America," said Tom Goodell, General Manager of Shaft Development for the Resolution project. "The safe completion of the project represents a great engineering achievement, and I am particularly proud of the team – made up mostly of miners from this area - who made it happen."

Cementation, a contract company with expertise in safe underground mine development, supported the project, using a largely local workforce.

Mike Nadon, senior executive with

Cementation said, "Cementation is extremely proud of our site team who showed total commitment to the goals throughout the project. Their hard work, perseverance, and commitment to safety has put them in a class of their own." The completion of shaft sinking is a key milestone in developing what could be one

of the world's leading copper mines. "Resolution Copper is one of the most attractive, undeveloped copper deposits in

the world. It will bring jobs and meaningful economic and community benefits to the entire region," said project director Andrew Taplin. "We have invested more than \$1 billion to date in the project and most of that investment has been used to sink the exploratory shaft to full depth. Now, we are focused on working with regulators and the community to finalize our plan of operation and earn the permits we need to responsibly and safely develop and operate a world class copper mine." **Project Quick Facts**

Pinal County residents urged to take survey

FLORENCE - Pinal County leaders want to know: "How are we doing?"

The County is conducting a Citizen Satisfaction Survey that began on Tuesday, November 18. The survey will run until Friday, Jan. 23, 2015.

"We ran a Citizen Satisfaction Survey in 2010," said County Manager Greg Stanley. "We contracted with National Research Center to conduct the survey. They mailed out 3,000 surveys to residential addresses within the county."

Stanley added that the response rate was 35 percent.

"What we are doing this time is going online," the County Manager stated. "This will allow us to reach more residents and it is much cheaper than hiring a firm to do the survey for us."

The county is going through Survey Monkey to conduct the poll. Residents can access the survey at: http:// www.surveymonkey.com/s/pinalcounty. There are a total of 40 questions in the survey ranging from rating county services to getting an opinion on county taxes versus services offered.

"These are virtually the same questions that were asked in 2010," Stanley said. "We have the baseline numbers, this next survey will tell us if we have improved or regressed as a provider of mandated services." **Frequently asked questions about the survey:**

• Is the survey available in Spanish? We are working on that now and anticipate having a Spanish version available soon.


• I'm a winter/temporary resident, should I/can I complete the survey? Yes, we encourage that.



Pretty good huh?..so any way as the story goes...just in case your kid or grandkids ask.

Long ago, in the early 1600s, a group of people in England wanted to pray and worship God in their own way. The King controlled the Church of England, and everyone was ordered to go to the same type of church. Anyone who dared to disobey would be sent to jail.

T he group of people who wanted to free the Church of England from the King's rule, making it "pure" were known as the Puritans. To escape the rule of the King and his church, around 100 men, women and children left their homeland, with their dream of religious freedom. They sailed on a ship, the Mayflower—on a pilgrimage to the New World.

These brave travelers—the Pilgrims—landed in Plymouth after their long six-week journey. It was December 11, 1620. The cold winter had set in. The land was strange to them, and nothing seemed familiar.

The winter was long, cold, and very hard for the Pilgrims. Luckily, Native Americans helped by supplying them with seeds and food, teaching them about their new home, and giving them the skills needed to survive in a strange, new







land.

The first year in their new home was hard for the Pilgrims. Many died. With seeds and plants received from the Native Americans, the Pilgrims planted crops. The fall harvest was a good one. To celebrate their good fortune, the Pilgrims had a feast of thanksgiving.

Many foods were cooked for the feast - wild turkey, duck, and venison were probably served, along with fish, pumpkins, squash, corn, sweet potatoes, and cranberries. Captain Miles Standish, the leader of the Pilgrims invited all of the Native Americans who had helped them so much during their first year. Everyone had a good day of thanksgiving. The feast lasted for three days!

This harvest feast in 1621 is often called the "First Thanksgiving." Over the years, the day we now celebrate as Thanksgiving became an important tradition in the United States—a day of giving thanks for all that we have. In 1941 President Franklin Roosevelt made Thanksgiving a national holiday. There you have it:


