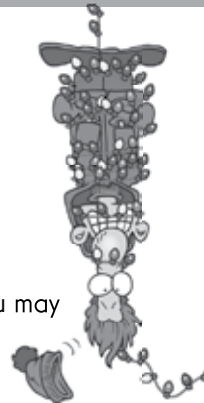

Hector and Ariel are the children of Hector and Dianella "Nini" Aparicio.

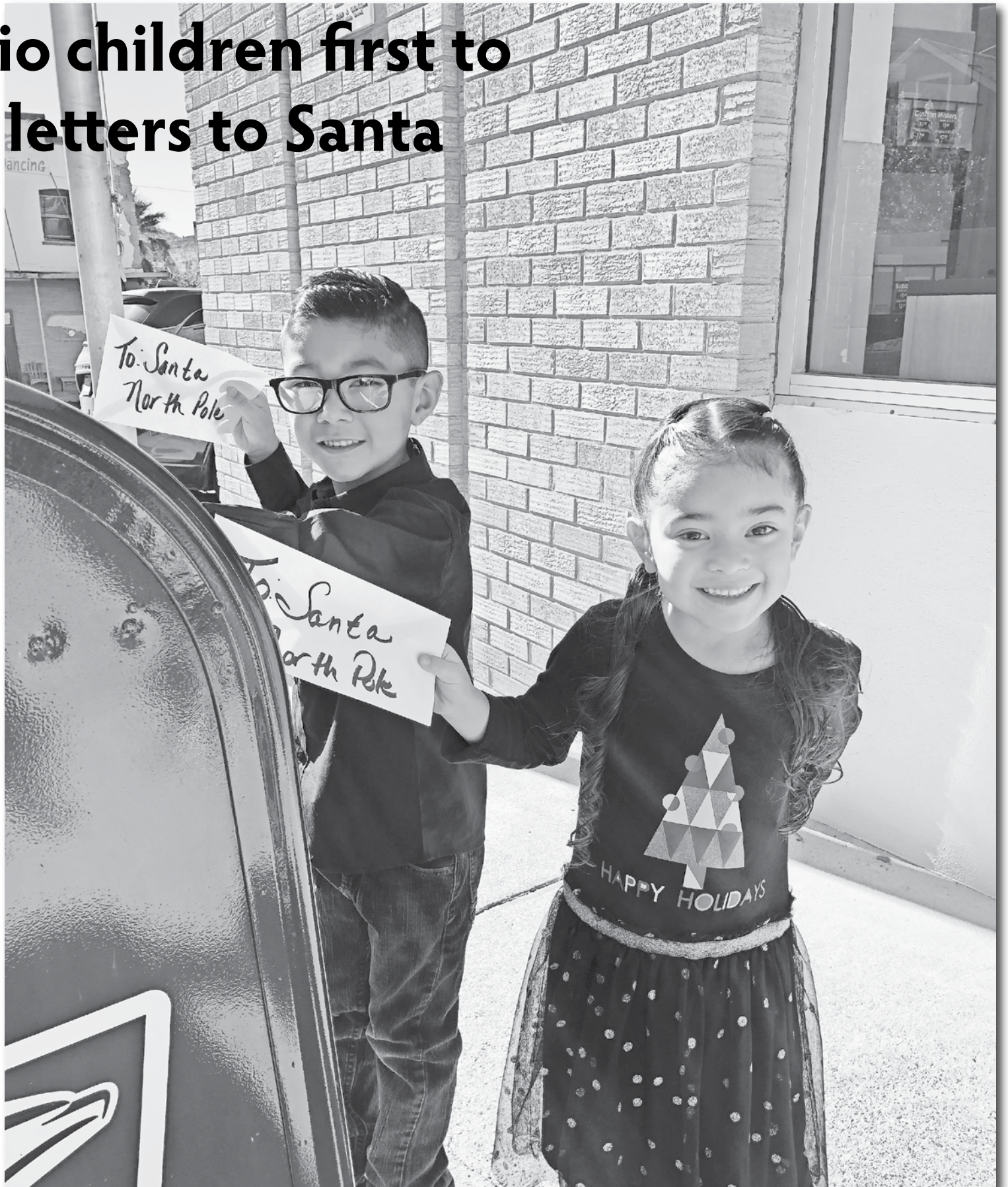
Superior children can mail their wishes to Santa in the special mailbox that can be found at Save Money Market.
