he General Election is this coming Tuesday, Nov. 8. With the noisy presidential campaign taking so much attention, please remember that there are lots of other offices and proposals for us to vote on (including two people running for Mayor of Kearny).

I hope for Kearny's sake that we will vote for having the Ray Unified School District go with the Cobre Valley Institute of Technology (CVIT) program. The schools in Superior, Hayden/Winkelman, San Carlos, Miami and Globe are already

enrolled. For a property tax increase that amounts to \$5 a year for a single family with a \$100,000 home, our students will have multiple technical subjects and special programs made available, such as construction technology, fire science, nursing, information technology, welding, and graphic design. This will entitle our school to additional funding through the State of Arizona for equipment for programs old and new.

There's good news on the medical front. Mike Smith is the new Physician Assistant (PA) at the clinic. Mike is well known in Kearny, because he studied here a while back with Brad Chambers (who had to move to Utah, darn it!). Dr. Charles continues here, and there will be regular visits by a gynecologist. Then, to top it all off, ASARCO, Native Air, the Cobre Valley Regional Medical Center, the Community Health Center Volunteers (think "Hand Me Up"), and the Kearny Rotary Club have joined together to fund the paving of the medical center lot. The project has already

Small town girl heads Arizona Democratic Party, to cast electoral vote for president

Alexis Tameron, the first female Hispanic State Chair of the Arizona Democratic Party, has not forgotten her small-town roots.

Alexis was born and raised in the town of Superior, Arizona. Alexis was interested in politics from a young age. While in school she served on the student council and after graduating from Superior High school she moved to the Valley and attended Mesa Community College. From Mesa Community College she went on to graduate with a Bachelor Degree in Political Science from Arizona State University. Education was her main focus, and she thought she would become a Social Studies and History teacher. It was in college where Alexis became a member of the Young Democrats, and she realized she could make more of an impact and a difference working in politics. Alexis

says, "having grown up in Superior and gone to Superior schools I know what we didn't get in proportion to other schools." That experience ignited her passion for investing in Education.

In January of 2015, Alexis became the State Chair of the Democratic Party of Arizona and this election year she has the honor of being one of the Democratic Electors. If the voters of Arizona decide they want Hillary Clinton for President, Alexis and the 10 other Electors will cast the official votes for the state of Arizona.

The inner workings of the American political system can sometimes be confusing. According to the Constitution, it is the votes of the Electoral College that elect the President and Vice President, and the popular vote determines which candidate gets all of these Electoral College votes for each state. The number of Electors each state has are based on the State's congressional seats. Arizona has nine House seats and two Senate seats

which means we have a total of 11 electoral votes. During an election year, each party nominates and picks electoral members. Those individuals get the honor of casting the official vote for whatever party the population of a state deems worthy of being President and Vice President.

"If the Democrats win Arizona, after the election and after the election is certified by the Secretary of State, we'll end up going to probably the Secretary of State's office and essential casting our ballots for our candidate which will then be sent to the US House of Representatives," Alexis explained.

As party Chair, Alexis gets to hand pick the Democratic Electors for Arizona. Because the United States has the first female presidential candidate in this election, Alexis says she was looking for people who represented firsts or trailblazers. For instance, Alexis is the first Hispanic Chair and the first Female Chair of the Arizona Democratic Party. Another Elector Corey Woods is the first African American elected to the Tempe City Council. Peterson Zah is the first President of the Navajo Nation. Alexis wanted not only diversity in terms of ethnic backgrounds in the members of the Democratic Electors, but she also wanted regional diversity. Roberto Reveles is from Gold Canyon, and there are other Electors from across the state including Tucson and Flagstaff.

Alexis will serve as the Chair for two years. When asked if she would ever run for office Alexis says no. "I care more

about helping other people who will take that leap, make that sacrifice and help them accomplish great things because I also know it takes a whole lot of people to make other people successful. I would rather be behind the scenes than up close in front of the spotlight."

Alexis has never forgotten her time growing up in a small town. She talks with pride about Superior and going to school there. The advice she would give to the students of Superior, "If you have dreams, follow through on them. Anything

Hayden's playoff run ends but optimism reigns

The No. 9-ranked Hayden football team had its season ended following last Friday's 65 – 26 quarterfinal playoff loss to No. 1 Bagdad. The Lobos, who entered the game with wins in seven of their last eight games, including a victory against Mayer in the first round of this year's playoffs, figure to benefit in the future from this season's success.

"I'm optimistic it will motivate some of the underclassmen who didn't come out to play football this vear," Lobos' head coach John Estrada said. "There is plenty of talent in Hayden. We just need to get it out on the field. I hope the success of this season helps."

Bagdad came away with a convincing win, but Estrada came away convinced his team was more physical than the Sultans.

"We hit and executed well, and I can bet on Sunday morning they knew Hayden was in town," he said. "Bagdad just had a few more skilled and seasoned players. Our kids left it all on the field and I couldn't be more proud of these young men."

"Our kids represented well," Estrada added. "Not only their parents but our community and Hayden High School. They showed a lot of heart, never gave up, showed good sportsmanship, and were well disciplined."

Senior running back Brandon Cruz rushed for 154 yards and two touchdowns. He also threw a 45-yard touchdown pass to receiver Frankie Valencia, who hauled in a 52yard scoring reception from junior quarterback Mario

Mariscal finished with 145 passing yards. Valencia, a junior, totaled 176 receiving yards. Running back Ryan Donovan added 60 yards rushing in the game.

Hayden finished the season with a record of 6 - 4; the losses coming against the Nos. 1, 2, 3 and 5 teams in the state.

"That's up there with the best," Estrada said.

Estrada said his team worked hard over the summer and he was proud to see the players rewarded for their efforts.

"I challenged the seniors to work hard and end their careers as winners," he said. "I wanted them to change the culture with Hayden football. They took on that challenge and led an overachieving team to the quarterfinals of the state playoffs."

And now, hopefully, the Lobos' football program can reap the rewards of this season's accomplishment.






