

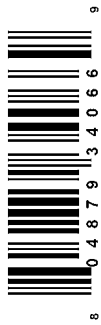

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# Small town girl heads Arizona Democratic Party, to cast electoral vote for president

Alexis Tameron, the first female Hispanic State Chair of the Arizona Democratic Party, has not forgotten her small-town roots.

Alexis was born and raised in the town of Superior, Arizona. Alexis was interested in politics from a young

age. While in school she served on the student council and after graduating from Superior High school she moved to the Valley and attended Mesa Community College. From Mesa Community College she went on to graduate with a Bachelor Degree in Political Science from Arizona State University. Education was her main focus, and she thought she would become a Social Studies and History teacher. It was in college where Alexis became a member of the Young Democrats, and she realized she could make more of an impact and a difference working in politics. Alexis says, "having grown up in Superior and gone to Superior schools I know what we didn't get in proportion to other schools." That experience ignited her passion for investing in Education.

In January of 2015, Alexis became the State Chair of the Democratic Party of Arizona and this election year she

has the honor of being one of the Democratic Electors. If the voters of Arizona decide they want Hillary Clinton for President, Alexis and the 10 other Electors will cast the official votes for the state of Arizona.

The inner workings of the American political system can sometimes be confusing. According to the Constitution, it is the votes of the Electoral College that elect the President and Vice President, and the popular vote determines which candidate gets all of these Electoral College votes for each state. The number of Electors each state has are based on the State's congressional seats. Arizona has nine House seats and two Senate seats which means we have a total of 11 electoral votes. During an election year, each party nominates and picks electoral members. Those individuals get the honor of casting the official vote for whatever party the population of a state deems worthy of being President and Vice President.

"If the Democrats win Arizona, after the election and after the election is certified by the Secretary of State, we'll end up going to probably the Secretary of State's office and essential casting our ballots for our candidate which will then be sent to the US House of Representatives," Alexis explained.

As party Chair, Alexis gets to hand pick the Democratic Electors for Arizona. Because the United States has the first female presidential candidate in this election, Alexis says she was looking for people who represented firsts or trailblazers. For instance, Alexis is the first Hispanic Chair and the first Female Chair of the Arizona Democratic Party. Another Elector Corey Woods is the first African American elected to the Tempe City Council. Peterson Zah is the first President of the Navajo Nation. Alexis wanted not only diversity in terms of ethnic backgrounds in the members of the Democratic Electors, but she also wanted regional diversity. Roberto Reveles is from Gold Canyon, and there are other Electors from across the state including Tucson and Flagstaff.

Alexis will serve as the Chair for two years. When asked if she would ever run for office Alexis says no. "I care more about helping other people who will take that leap, make that sacrifice and help them accomplish great things because I also know it takes a whole lot of people to make other people successful. I would rather be behind the scenes than up close in front of the spotlight."

Alexis has never forgotten her time growing up in a small town. She talks with pride about Superior and going to school there. The advice she would give to the students of Superior, "If you have dreams, follow through on them. Anything is possible." She says it's important

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# Panthers

The No. 2-ranked Superior football team advanced to the semifinals of the 2016 AIA 1A State Playoffs following a lopsided 52 – 21 victory against No. 7 Joseph City last Friday night in Superior.

Senior quarterback Nicolaus Cruz threw for three touchdowns and rushed for three more to lead the way for the Panthers. Senior teammate Edgar Galindo ran for a score and threw a 26-yard touchdown pass to junior receiver Marcos Bueno in the closing seconds of the first half, giving the Panthers a comfortable 34 – 6 lead at halftime.

“We haven’t played our best football yet,” Superior head coach Ryan Palmer said following the win. “Our effort and intensity was much better than the previous few weeks, but we still need to continue to build towards improving all aspects of the game.”

Collectively, the Panthers didn’t believe their performance during the last couple of games leading into last week’s playoff game was up to their standards. And though they acknowledge there is still room for improvement, Friday’s result was a lot closer to what’s expected.

“Having the bye week helped getting us back to clicking on all cylinders,” said Cruz, who continued to enhance his Player of the Year candidacy with 265 passing yards, 141 rushing yards and six touchdowns. “We were able to execute and when we do, we are very dangerous.”

Galindo finished the game with 104 rushing yards. Bueno and Dominic Perea each surpassed 100 receiving yards – Bueno with 161 yards on seven receptions and Perea with 104 on two catches. Perea’s numbers include a 69-yard touchdown reception on the game’s second play from scrimmage.

The Panthers reached the semifinals of last year’s playoffs, where they were knocked out by Valley Union, despite possessing one of the state’s most prolific offenses. Undoubtedly the difference between last year’s team and this year’s is the defense.

Superior has posted three shutouts this season, which is no small accomplishment in 8-man football, and has not surrendered more than 26 points in a game, most of them coming when the game was no longer in doubt.

“It all comes down to execution and fundamentals,”

Palmer said about his team's improved defensive play. "If we play assignment football and tackle well, we are tough to move the ball on."

"A lot of the confidence comes from the work these kids put in the off season," he added. "They have been working hard all year to be in this position."

The Panthers came up with three turnovers during Friday's game, an interception by Joseph Diaz-Gonzales and fumble recoveries by Galindo and Austin Navarrette. Bueno (2), Galindo and Steven Ybarra combined for four

sacks against the Wildcats. Galindo and Navarrette each totaled a team-high 12 tackles in the win.

Next up for the Panthers is No. 3-ranked Williams at Maricopa High School this Saturday. The Vikings enter the semifinal playoff game with a record of 8 - 1, which includes going undefeated in their region and finishing a game ahead of Joseph City in the final standings.

Williams' only loss of the season came against No. 1-ranked Bagdad on Sept. 2, 56 - 22.

"Williams is a big, physical team with some very talented

athletes," Palmer said, looking ahead to this week's game. "Their speed is better than any team we have faced this year, and they are bigger and stronger than any team we have played so far."

"We have to have a great week of preparation and play our best game of the year to advance," he continued. "This will be the toughest test so far, as it should be."

Kickoff for Saturday's game is scheduled for 2:30 p.m. The game is set to be played at Maricopa High School, 45012 W. Honeycutt Rd., Maricopa.

## Jr. Panthers repeat as CJHL football champs

If you believe life is about making memories, then you'll agree the players on the Superior Junior High football team created one of the best of their young lives last Tuesday, defeating Ray 38 - 6 to win back-to-back Central Junior High League Championships.

The Panthers went a perfect 17 - 0 during their consecutive championship runs, including 8 - 0 this season, their first playing in the 8-man format.

"I can't say enough about these young men and their accomplishments," said head coach Martin Navarrette, who guided the team to both championships. "Regardless at what level you are playing at or what sport you are playing, it is very difficult to have back-to-back undefeated seasons."

"The coaching staff is very proud of these young men and are very happy to have had the opportunity to coach them," he continued. "Thanks for the memories."

The game wasn't easy from the start for Superior, which overcame five first-half turnovers and held a slim 8 - 6 lead at the half. The Panthers' lone touchdown came on a trick play.

"Ray came to play in the first half," said Navarrette, adding that he expected that type of performance from the Bearcats. "We were very fortunate to hold them to just six points."

Superior's defense stepped up in a big way, limiting Ray's top offensive threat and forcing six turnovers. Ray's offense was ineffective in the second half, likely the result of the punishment dished out by the Panthers.

A few halftime adjustments and a "productive" pep talk ignited the Panthers' offense in the second half, leading them to outscore Ray 30 - 0 after the break, despite a collarbone injury to their quarterback in the fourth quarter.

"We came out firing on all cylinders," Navarrette said.

Indeed they did and now they have a memory for a lifetime.

# Transfer station to reopen this weekend! Free dump day Saturday!

For several years the Town of Superior Transfer Station had been closed, which has created a bottleneck of trash for residents of Superior. The station had been closed due to mismanagement which created several environmental hazards. The Town set out to develop a plan to clean up the transfer station and with the first phases of the plan complete the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality has allowed the Town to reopen the transfer station this weekend.

To celebrate this grand re-opening there will be a ceremonial ribbon cutting at 1 p.m. on Friday, Nov. 4, 2016 at the entrance to the transfer station. On Saturday, residents can bring their trash and yard waste to the transfer station at no charge starting at 7:00am until the roll offs are full. They will not be able to accept construction materials during the free dump day. Roll offs were donated by Pinal County, Salt River Project, Southwest Gas, Superior Chamber of Commerce, Republic Services and Town of Superior. The regular operating hours for the transfer station will be Tuesday and Friday 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. The transfer station will

be open on the first Saturday of every month from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m.. Residents will be required to purchase a decal for their windshield; the cost is \$20 for the first vehicle and \$10 for each additional vehicle that will be used to transfer trash. There is a fee schedule for dumping items at the transfer station and the rates vary based on cubic yard and type of material. Residents must pre-pay their dump fees prior to dumping. The Pre-Paid punch cards can be purchased at Town Hall during regular operating hours. For more information on the transfer station and the fees for dumping please contact Town Hall at 520-827-0676.
