BLM comments on Final Environmental Impact Statement to be discussed at upcoming Community Working Group meeting

The next Community Working Group (CWG) meeting for the Resolution Copper mining project, located near Superior, Arizona, will be Wednesday, Dec. 14, 2022, starting at 6 p.m. Monthly meetings of the group have been moved from the Superior Chamber of Commerce to: Town of Superior Offices, Library Room at 199 N. Lobb Avenue, Superior

Vicky Peacey, Chief of Staff to the Chief Operating Officer for Rio Tinto, will answer questions and discuss review comments made by the Bureau of Land Management

(BLM) about the Final Environmental Impact Statement (FEIS) developed by the U.S. Forest Service for the proposed Resolution Copper project. In 2021 USDA directed the Forest Service to withdraw the Notice of Availability and rescind the FEIS and draft Record of Decision. USDA took this step to allow the agency to conduct a thorough review, to ensure regulatory compliance of environmental, cultural, and archaeological analyses, and to provide time for the Forest Service to fully understand concerns raised by Tribes and the public

and the project's impact to these important resources.

About the Community Working Group

The CWG focuses on potential environmental impact issues, science and policy, economic development and growth, and the pros and cons of the proposed development of the Resolution Copper mine, which could become one of the world's largest copper mining ventures. Members include residents and stakeholders from the Town of Superior, Queen Valley, and nearby communities.

Monthly meetings of the group are now held in the Town of Superior office complex library at 199 N. Lobb Avenue in Superior. Topics include environmental stewardship, transportation, education, health, safety, natural resource issues, air quality, community investments, recreational

changes and other related subjects.

About Resolution Copper

The Resolution Copper project is a proposed underground mine 60 miles east of Phoenix, Arizona, near the town of Superior. The project is a joint venture owned by Rio Tinto (55%) and BHP (45%). The ore deposit lies nearly 7,000 feet below the earth's surface. It represents one of the most significant untapped copper deposits today. The mine has the potential to supply nearly 25% of US copper demand.

ADOT announces Name-A-Snowplow contest winners; 'Snowguaro' heads to Superior

The results of the Arizona Department of Transportation Name-A-Snowplow contest are in and Arizonans have chosen three pun-tastic names for ADOT snowplows.

After tabulating nearly 7,000 votes, the winning snowplow names are:

- "Alice Scooper"
- "Snowguaro"
- "Frost Responder"

These three winning names beat out 12 other finalists in ADOT's first Name-A-Snowplow contest. The names will be affixed to the driver- and passenger-side doors of the truck cab so the snowplows can be identified by name.

"Alice Scooper" will be stationed at an ADOT maintenance yard in Flagstaff, "Snowguaro" will patrol highways near Superior, Ariz., and "Frost Responder" will, uh, respond to winter weather from its soon-to-be-home in Page, Ariz.

In October, Arizonans submitted nearly 4,700 names in the first phase of ADOT's Name-A-Snowplow contest. For the winning names, "Alice Scooper" was submitted by 25 people, "Snowguaro" was submitted by six people and "Frost Responder" was submitted by two people.

ADOT has 200 snowplows and nearly 500 trained snowplow operators at highway maintenance yards across the state, ready to deploy when snow falls. Arizona's high country can receive a tremendous amount of snowfall – Flagstaff, in fact, is one of the snowiest



cities in the country. These snowplows and their skilled operators play major roles in clearing highways during and after winter storms, laying down deicer prior to storms and are even put to work during the spring, summer and fall to push mud, boulders and debris off highways after rainstorms.

Already in November, snow has fallen in Arizona's high country. ADOT encourages motorists to make safe and smart decisions when inclement weather hits. For real-time highway conditions, including views from ADOT's statewide network of highway cameras, visit az511.gov or download the AZ511 app from Apple's App Store® or Google Play™.

Public Hearing Regarding Use of CDBG Funds

The Town of Kearny is expected to receive approximately \$196,590 in FY22 federal CDBG funds from the Arizona Department of Housing Regional Account (RA). - 4) Public services (e.g., paying the salary of an additional staff person to expand a Head Start program, purchasing a van to transport persons with disabilities, equipment and rent to start a new job training program).

Pinal County confirms first pediatric flu death in Arizona; Health officials ask the public to get their flu shot to help slow the spread of the flu

Pinal County Public Health Services District is saddened to confirm the death of a young child due to influenza. This is the first pediatric flu death in the state of Arizona this flu season.

"This tragic situation, unfortunately, reminds us that flu can cause serious illness and death," said Dr. Tascha Spears, Health Director for the Pinal County Public Health Services District. "Our deepest sympathy goes out to this child's family."

This year's flu season has started earlier, and hospitals are significantly impacted by the number of cases presenting in emergency departments. Since the start of the flu season, there has been a total of 172 lab-confirmed influenza cases reported in Pinal County, and 4,552 cases

total in the state of Arizona.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends that everyone six months and older get the flu vaccine. The vaccine provides protection from hospitalization and death even if you get the flu. It's important to get the vaccine as soon as possible because it takes your immune system two weeks to build a defense against the flu.

In addition to vaccine, protect yourself and others from getting the flu by being vigilant in good hygiene: avoid touching your mouth and nose, wash your hands frequently, cover your cough in your sleeve and stay home when you are sick.

Flu symptoms usually come on suddenly. People who

have flu often feel some or all of these symptoms:

- Fever* or feeling feverish/chills
- Cough
- Sore throat
- Runny or stuffy nose
- Muscle or body aches
- Headaches
- Fatigue (tiredness)
- Some people may have vomiting and diarrhea, though this is more common in children than adults.

*It's important to note that not everyone with flu will have a fever.

Not only is flu circulating throughout the United States, including Pinal County, but RSV (Respiratory Syncytial Virus) and COVID-19 cases are significantly increasing. All three of these respiratory illnesses have similar signs and symptoms. It should be noted that both influenza and RSV were contributing factors in this child's death.

Those who think they may have the flu or any other


