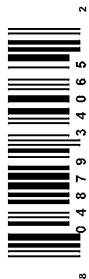

Council to Choose Task Force Member for Public Safety Coalition

This Wednesday, November 4, a special meeting of the Town Council will be held to, among other things, choose a person to join me on the Task Force set up by the towns of Kearny, Hayden, Winkelman, and Mammoth to work on a proposal for a common police force. As I said last week, the initial proposal is that there would be a governing board of the new police force composed from people of all four towns and accountable to all four Town Councils. There would be one police chief, three sergeants to serve Kearny, Hayden/Winkelman, and Mammoth, and a number of officers, jointly trained, who would have the towns as their “home bases.”

The task force will have the assistance of the League of Cities and Towns, the Central Arizona Governments, financial consultant Pat Walker, and the Arizona Department of Public Safety. The first meeting of the group is on Tuesday, November 10, at 9 a.m. in Mammoth.

On a totally different note, I apologize that the town has been unable to remove the garbage on Jamestown Road which has been there for two weeks now. The amount of trash collected during Journey for a Clean Kearny simply overwhelmed our containers. Then a series of events, beginning with the flooding of the Town Hall, a “burp” in the water system, and scheduled vacations of some of our employees, has kept the Town from cleaning it all up in a prompt manner.

I did take lemons and make lemonade, however, when several people from other towns came here to attend various meetings. I took them to look at our garbage and brag about how all our volunteers had managed to collect so much in a very short time. One person said, “I don’t normally say this about garbage, but it’s a beautiful sight.” I might have felt better about the comment if I hadn’t been busy shooing away youngsters from their scavenging. I do thank you for your patience.

Flu season is around the corner; schedule flu shots now

FLORENCE - The Pinal County Public Health Services District will begin providing flu vaccine to the public on October 26, 2015. Adults can receive a flu shot by appointment only. We will begin scheduling appointments starting Monday, October 26th and continuing through November 6, 2015. Children can receive a flu shot without an appointment.

In order to schedule appointments for adults, please call toll free 1-888-431-1311, Monday through Friday between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m.

Insurance plans will be billed for those with coverage. Children's flu vaccine is free for those under the age of 19. Adult flu vaccine for those that are uninsured or under-insured is free upon verification of eligibility.

Adults that are unable to schedule an appointment, the opportunity to receive a flu shot as a "walk-in" will be available on the following days beginning Nov. 7, 2015:

- Kearny - 355 Alden Road, 3rd Wednesday of the month, 8 a.m.-6 p.m.

- Mammoth - 110 Main Street, Thursdays, 8 a.m.-6 p.m.

- Superior - 60 East Main Street, 2nd Wednesday of the month, 8 a.m. - 6 p.m.

- San Tan Valley - 36235 North Gantzel Road, Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays 8 a.m.-6 p.m.

Please be advised, all Pinal County Public Health Services District clinics will be closed

- Wednesday, November 4

- Thursday, November 26

- Friday, November 27

If you want to get a flu vaccine sooner than October 26th, there is ample vaccine available at commercial pharmacies throughout the county. Most pharmacies accept major insurance plans and Medicare Part B. In addition to pharmacies, urgent care centers also offer flu vaccine.



You may also check with your primary care physician. In addition, Flu Finder websites like <http://flushot.healthmap.org> are good sources to search for the nearest locations.

As a reminder, you should always follow these everyday steps to protect your health:

- Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze. Throw the tissue in the trash after you use it.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand gel.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth. Germs spread this way.
- Try to avoid close contact with sick people.
- If you are sick with flu-like illness, CDC recommends that you stay home for at least 24-hours after your fever is gone except to get medical care or for other necessities. Keep away from others as much as possible to keep from making others sick. Your fever should be gone without the use of a fever-reducing medicine.

Central Arizona College Aravaipa Campus will be hosting an historical talk by historian Jay Van Orden. Jay is a former Director of the Field Services Division of the Arizona Historical Society. He is also the author of Geronimo's Surrender: C.S. Fly's Photographs.

The topic will be "When No One Had a Camera: An Artist-Participant Paints the Tully and Ochoa Wagon Fight 1869." This is the story behind Edward Zinn's painting of the Aravaipa Apaches attack on an 80 mile 9 wagon train along the Cañon del Oro. The wagon train owned by merchants Tully & Ochoa was on its way to Camp Grant from Tucson when it was attacked. This battle along with other Apache attacks led to the Camp Grant Massacre.

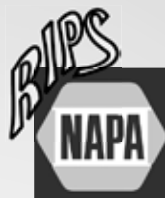

Mik Johnson: Coming Home

Although the American POWs in the Niigata prison camp had been treated somewhat better in the last weeks of the war, prior to that they had been forced to work long hours at different jobs. Many of them worked as slave laborers for private companies in mines and factories. The prison guards angered by the decimation of their homeland by American bombing raids took it out on the prisoners, often beating them. Mic Johnson's job was loading and unloading of cargo from ships in the harbor.

After the atomic bombs were dropped on Aug. 6 and 9, 1945, the Japanese military prepared for an Allied invasion. The Japanese high command had issued orders which would have had every POW executed had the invasion taken place. On Aug. 17, the prisoners learned about the dropping of the atomic bombs on Hiroshima and Nagasaki. The following day a Japanese Army Colonel informed them that Japan was surrendering to avoid further bloodshed. The prisoners awoke one morning to find that most of the guards were gone. Mic said that "the bad ones disappeared".

On Aug. 28 and 30, American B-29 planes dropped 55 gallon barrels filled with food, clothing and medical supplies by parachute on the camp. Many of the prisoners got sick from eating too much food. The POWs now knew that their rescue would be soon.

On Sept. 2, Japan signed the formal surrender on board the battleship U.S.S. Missouri in Tokyo Bay, ending World War II. In mid September, troops from the U.S. Army 1st Cavalry Division arrived and took over the prison camp. The prisoners were now free! Their repatriation back home to the United States had begun.

It took Mic a few months to get back to Spokane Washington. He traveled from Japan to Okinawa. He remembers flying in the bomb bay of a B-24 to Manila in the Philippines where he spent a month. He traveled by ship for 14 days from Manila to Vancouver, Canada then crossed the border and arrived in Seattle, Washington.

Ironically, Mic received his draft card when he returned showing he was 1A (available for unrestricted military service) status.

"It was a whole different world," Mic said about coming home. Like most of the POWs held by the Japanese, Mic was suffering from Post Traumatic Stress

Disorder (PTSD). Not much was known about PTSD following World War II. PTSD would not be added to clinical diagnoses until 1980. It would be many years before Mic and his fellow civilian POWs would begin receiving treatment.

Mic had trouble adjusting when he got back. Even seven decades later and he says, "I am still working on it." He says he sometimes has dreams that he is back in the POW camp. When asked if he had problems with drinking alcohol when he got back, he jokingly said, "Yes, I couldn't get enough." Many of the returning POWs took to hoarding food. Mic said he prized food but never hoarded.

Studies of PTSD have shown that the most traumatized group were POWs held by the Japanese during World War II. The POWs had a rate of 84 percent suffering lifetime PTSD. Nearly one out of three POWs died as the result of malnutrition, disease or brutality. The camp at Niigata was one of the worst Japanese prison camps.

In 1946 Mic was awarded the Bronze Star with the combat "V" clasp by the Commander of the Spokane naval supply depot. It was rare that a civilian received a military medal and even rarer that the combat clasp was given to one. The citation from the President said, "For heroic service as a member of the civilian construction crew on Wake Island, when Japanese forces landed on the morning of Dec. 21, 1941. Volunteering to assist the men of marine aircraft squadron 211 when they went forward to make a final stand against an overwhelming enemy landing force, Johnson fought bravely for approximately nine hours in the brush along the beach, refusing to seek security in the rear despite his lack of training for combat and the insufficiency of weapons for all." He also received the Purple Heart.

The surviving civilian POWs struggled for years with PTSD and trying to get benefits and pay they felt they were entitled to.

"Our government never did anything to help us," Mic said.

It would take until 1981 after much lobbying before the civilian Wake Island survivors would be recognized as veterans. They then became eligible for veteran's benefits including pay and medical services from the VA. Mic receives 100% disability benefits. The POWs tried to sue the Japanese government for their harsh treatment and pay for working as slave laborers but were unable to do so due to a treaty between Japan and the United

States that had been negotiated following the war. Attempts were made to sue the Japanese corporations that had used slave labor during the war. These were also unsuccessful.

Mic returned home to Rice, Washington after the war. He worked with his father and brother running a diversified farm that included a dairy. Mic and his family moved to Arizona for the health of their son who had asthma. He went to work for Kennecott in 1959 where he worked 23 years electrowinning for the company and helped start the electrowinning plant in 1968. He now lives in Kearny with his stepson Chris Postel and his wife Lucy. Mic belongs to a Wake Island survivors group that has held reunions. The numbers of survivors has dwindled over the years as they have aged and passed on. Mic, now in his 90s, says there were only two at the last reunion and there are only 10 survivors

left.

Mic Johnson is a true American hero. He did not ask to go to war, the war came to him. On this coming Veteran's Day remember all those men and women who serve in the Armed Forces and thank them for their service.

Thank you, Mic Johnson, for your service and the sacrifices you made for your country. We only wish the U.S. government had treated the Wake Island survivors with the respect they deserved.

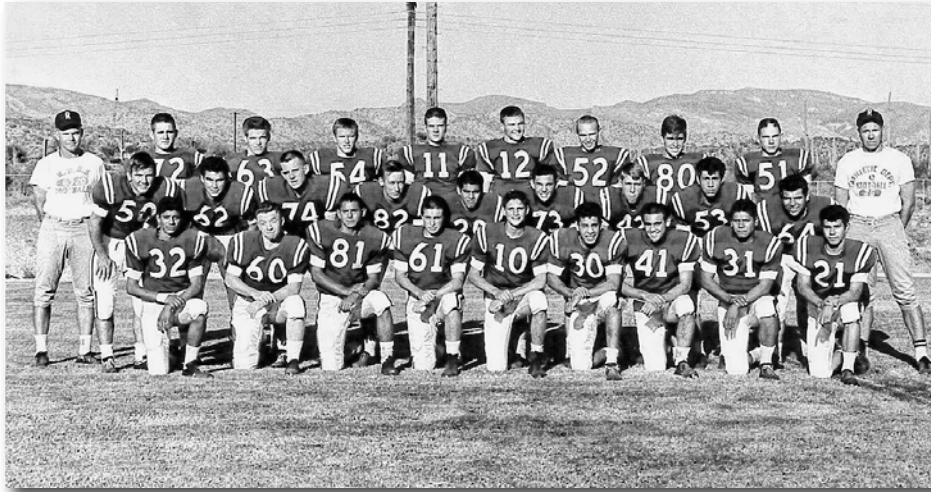

Dear Neighbor:

As you know, Asarco has been in discussions with state and federal government agencies regarding a retrofit project at the Hayden Smelter. We are pleased to share with you that we have reached an agreement that will allow for the continued operation of the smelter while maintaining a healthy environment for our employees and neighbors.

Since 1912, the Hayden Smelter has been a key component of the community. With more than 600 employees, Asarco's Hayden Operations provides over \$57 million in salaries, wages and fringe benefits to local workers, over \$4.6 million in property, sales and severance taxes, and over \$108 million in total spending on materials and other items. Each year, the smelter produces more than 300 million pounds of copper that is important in building construction, power generation and transmission, electronic product manufacturing, our national defense and the production of industrial machinery and transportation vehicles.

In 2010, Asarco undertook the design of a smelter retrofit project that would attain the new National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) for sulfur dioxide. The agreement marks the conclusion of almost four years of negotiations with the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), and provides the company the ability to retrofit the Hayden Smelter and continue operations here.

Asarco and the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ) have been working closely throughout. A permit revision for the construction and implementation of the retrofit project has been drafted and presented for public comment. Asarco completed the air dispersion modeling required to demonstrate attainment of the new sulfur dioxide NAAQS, and continues to work with ADEQ and EPA to finalize the State Implementation Plan for the Hayden area.

Throughout its operational history in Hayden, Asarco has met each regulatory challenge and has endeavored to be a constructive partner with governmental agencies and a good neighbor to the surrounding communities. Over the next several years, the company will invest over \$128 million to ensure that the Hayden Smelter is state-of-the-art and continues to process Arizona copper in our state. Keeping the Hayden Smelter operational will continue to assure Arizona is the copper capital of the U.S.

In the coming weeks, we will continue to provide information about the details of our agreement with employees, local residents and other interested parties, and be available to answer any questions you may have. Thank you for your continued support. We look forward to operations here for years to come.
