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# Oracle group collects donations for homeless vets

Oracle, Arizona- Recently, the Oracle Neighborhood Watch (ONWA) delivered the first of what is hoped to be many truck loads of food, clothing and hygiene supplies to the homeless veterans of American Armed Forces, who dwell in a camp near Santa Rita Park in Tucson.

Said a representative of ONWA: "The only thing that we forgot was to take a camera to get photos of our unloading the phenomenal amount of donations that were contributed by many of Oracle's finest residents.

"The looks on the faces of those vets and staff when we started unloading the supplies can only be described as complete astonishment. ... It was quite obvious that the idea of fellow citizens from a small town like Oracle, could be so generous, to take the time and sacrifice so much, was worth every effort made and we should all take great pride, knowing that we did a little to help these former warriors and to acknowledge their own sacrifice."

After arriving in the camp and unloading supplies, three ONWA participants relieved some of the camp staff to allow them a few hours of sleep. The camp is staffed solely by volunteers, many of whom are averaging three to four hours of sleep per night. This includes one woman, name currently unknown, who is a mother of four and a full-time Department of Justice agent, who works five or six nights a week on security patrol and the gang-ridden Santa Rita Park and the base. She also takes food and supplies to veterans living outside the base.

Another woman, a Captain from Davis Monthan Air Force Base, donates her time to go out and do the same. Then, there are the two patriots who drive all the way from southern California to assist at the camps.

An ONWA representative stated; "Tonight, what we saw, was true patriotism in action and the self sacrifice of several concerned citizens, trying to give back to other citizens that have sacrificed much, to allow us the freedoms that we enjoy today."

Sue and Jerry Parra, of Sue and Jerry's Trading Post

on American Avenue in Oracle, are also volunteers, in allowing their store to be used as a collection point for donated items. If you have clothing, personal hygiene items, food, or other items that could help help these veterans, donations can be dropped off at Sue and Jerry's Trading Post during regular business hours. The donation drive will extend through the holiday, and donations will be transported to the camp by ONWA members.

Camp Bravo, set up by Veterans On Patrol (VOP) is located on private property at 20th Street and Jacobus Avenue near Santa Rita Park. The VOP is based in the Phoenix /Tucson area. They also have "Camp Alpha"

located in the Phoenix area. These camps provides shelter, food, personal hygiene items, and all-volunteer staff to provide support with case management, safety and general welfare for the veterans. This includes securing counseling, when needed.

Lewis Arthur, founder of Veterans on Patrol stated: "You don't get paid but you get to see that person get to a home and that's better than any paycheck I could write anybody, to be honest with you,"

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## Flu season is around the corner; schedule flu shots now

FLORENCE - The Pinal County Public Health Services District will begin providing flu vaccine to the public on October 26, 2015. Adults can receive a flu shot by appointment only. We will begin scheduling appointments starting Monday, October 26th and continuing through November 6, 2015. Children can receive a flu shot without an appointment.

In order to schedule appointments for adults, please call toll free 1-888-431-1311, Monday through Friday between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m.

Insurance plans will be billed for those with coverage. Children's flu vaccine is free for those under the age of 19. Adult flu vaccine for those that are uninsured or under-insured is free upon verification of eligibility.

Adults that are unable to schedule an appointment, the opportunity to receive a flu shot as a "walk-in" will be available on the following days beginning Nov. 7, 2015:

If you want to get a flu vaccine sooner than October 26th, there is ample vaccine available at commercial pharmacies throughout the county. Most pharmacies accept major



insurance plans and Medicare Part B. In addition to pharmacies, urgent care centers also offer flu vaccine. You may also check with your primary care physician. In addition, Flu Finder websites like <http://flushot.healthmap.org> are good sources to search for the nearest locations.

As a reminder, you should always follow these everyday steps to protect your health:

- Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze. Throw the tissue in the trash after you use it.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand gel.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth. Germs spread this way.
- Try to avoid close contact with sick people.
- If you are sick with flu-like illness, CDC recommends that you stay home for at least 24-hours after your fever is gone except to get medical care or for other necessities. Keep away from others as much as possible to keep from making others sick. Your fever should be gone without the use of a fever-reducing medicine.

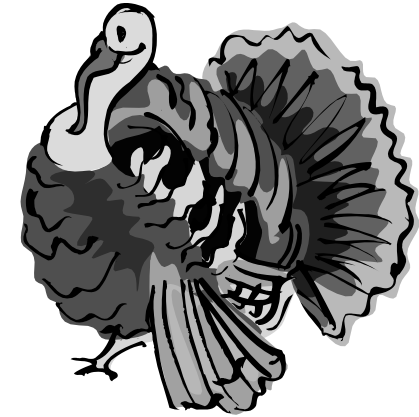

The Miners' can expect to reap the rewards of getting those players invaluable varsity experience beginning in 2016.




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
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# Miner swimmers finish fourth at regional swim meet

Miner Swimmers competed in the Southern Arizona Regional Qualifier Swim Meet in Oro Valley on Oct. 30-31. It was the final opportunity for the 24 teams from Southern Arizona to achieve qualifying times for the State Championship Meet to be held Nov. 6-7. Miner Swimmers looked sharp against the best swimmers in Southern Arizona.

The Girls finished in 10th place with 80 points and the Boys finished in 3rd place with 180 points. In the overall combined (Boys and Girls) team standings, the Miners finished in 4th place behind Catalina Foothills, Salpointe Catholic and Ironwood Ridge. Coaches were proud of the long list of teams that the Miners finished ahead of that included: Canyon Del Oro, Cienega, Tanque Verde, Pusch Ridge, Buena, Tucson, Sabino, Cholla, Sahuaro, Mountain View, Walden Grove, Rincon, Flowing Wells, Douglas, Sunnyside, St. Augustine, Sahuarita, Desert View, and Palo Verde.

Although the cold and rainy weather for preliminaries on Friday made conditions less than ideal, the Miners rose to the occasion and swam fast enough to qualify for 12 Championship Finals (top 8) and 10 Consolation Finals (9-16th place). With 24 teams present, earning a spot in the top 16 in any event is big accomplishment. As it has been all year, the strength of this team continues to show in the relays. In every relay event, the Miners advanced their A relay to the finals, and impressively in the Boys 200 Free Relay, both the A and B relays advanced.

On Saturday morning, Miners started things off with 9th place finish in the Girls Medley Relay followed by a 13th place finish in the Boys Medley Relay.

In the 200 Freestyle, 3 Miners finished in the top 16. Senior Taylor Woods finished 7th followed by fellow Senior Jacob Christian in 11th place and Junior Robert Sweeney in 16th place.

In the 200 Individual Medley (IM), two Freshman showed great potential in the all-around event. Gianna Sweeney finished 7th in the Girls 200 IM and Michael Primero-Predgo finished in 16th place in the Boys 200 IM.

In the 50 Freestyle, Junior Colbey Stratton showed some great speed on his way to 8th place finish.

In the Girls 100 Butterfly, Freshman Darien Apuron swam a sizzling time of 1:05.54 to shave a tenth of a second off the School Record on her way to a 4th place finish. In the Boys 100 Butterfly, Sophomore Will Newman won the event with a time of 53.81 which bettered the School Record by half a second while Colbey Stratton finished in 10th place.

Senior Taylor Woods finished 5th in the 100 Freestyle with some great closing speed.

It was the Boys 500 Freestyle that had two Miners in the Championship Finals. Jacob Christian and Robert Sweeney finished 6th and 8th respectively in the longest event in High School Swimming.

In the 200 Freestyle Relay, the Miner Girls team of Gianna Sweeney, Sophomore Raya Woods, Senior Rebekah Head, and Darien Apuron set new a School Record with a time of 1:56.11 beating the record previously held by Cierra Austin, Amara Apuron, Theresa Sweeney, and Nicole Primero-Predgo in 2012. The Girls Relay finished 13th. The Boys B relay team of Michael Primero-Predgo, Senior Alec Newman, Junior Michael Garcia, and Robert Sweeney finished a respectable 15th place. The Boys A Relay team of Colbey Stratton, Taylor Woods, Jacob Christian, and Will Newman swam the fastest relay in school history bettering the school record by nearly a second on the way to a 3rd place finish.

Darien Apuron swam a great 100 Backstroke to finish in 10th

place. Will Newman won the 100 Backstroke in a school record time of 55.05, and looks ready to make his mark at the State Championship meet this upcoming weekend.

Gianna Sweeney looked in great form in the 100 Breaststroke on her way to a 7th place finish.

The Girls 400 Freestyle Relay team of Rebekah Head, Senior Mariela Canisales, Sophomore Elyssia Aguilar, and Senior Stephanie Morris all swam personal best relay legs to finish in 12th place. The Boys 400 Free Relay team of Stratton, Woods, Christian and Newman swam a outstanding race to finish 3rd (behind Catalina Foothills and Salpointe) to wrap up the competition for the weekend.

San Manuel High School was one of the smallest schools at the meet, in both size of school and number of swimmers, but the awesome performances puts them as one of the best teams in Southern Arizona. The 4th place combined team finish is a very impressive result and the 3rd place team score by the boys team is remarkable.

With 5 new school records, and some great individual and relay swims, the Miners look ready to compete in the Division II State Championship Meet. Will Newman is scheduled to compete with Automatic Qualifying Times in the 200 Individual Medley and 100 Backstroke. Additionally, several individuals have provisional qualifying times; Darien Apuron (100 Fly, 500 Free), Gianna Sweeney (200 IM, 100 Breaststroke); Jacob Christian (200 Free, 500 Free), Colbey Stratton (50 Free, 100 Fly), and Taylor Woods (100 Free, 200 Free). These swimmers will have to wait until seeding is done later in the week to determine if they made the cut. Unfortunately, the Girls Relays just narrowly missed the cut. However, all three of the Boys Relays will be competing. The Division II Swim Championship will be held at Skyline Aquatic Center in Mesa - Preliminaries begin at 9:30 a.m. on Friday, Nov. 6, and Finals begin at 9:30 a.m. on Saturday.

## Miners' Waddell chooses Western New Mexico

San Manuel's Lyana Waddell, a member the two-time state champion Miners' softball team, announced she has accepted a scholarship offer to Western New Mexico University, located in Silver City, New Mexico.

Waddell, a three-time All-Division IV selection as a pitcher, chose WNMU because of its commitment to academics and the academic support the school provides to ensure success in the classroom for its student-athletes.

Her plans include earning a degree in Criminal Justice.

"(My decision) wasn't only about softball," Waddell recently told the *San Manuel Miner*. "As long as I have my education and my grades are good that's the only way I'm going to be able to play."

"The education program at WNMU is really helpful," she continued. "(Staff members) will be able to help me with my grades and I'll be able to understand them better. My grades are important."

Waddell also acknowledged the school was geographically friendly, which would allow her to make frequent trips home on weekends and her family to make the short four-hour trip to watch her play.

Miners' softball head coach Deanne Brewer was asked what attributes her star pitcher possesses that will help her succeed at the next level.

"(Lyana) maintains her composure," Brewer responded. "She also had really good focus."

Waddell was asked about the experience of playing for one of the state's premiere softball programs and how that will help her at WNMU.

"No matter what we do – at practice or in games – we (are) always competitive," she answered. "I think that will help all of us in college because we have to compete to earn a starting position. Coach Brewer is serious about us being competitive."

Waddell, one of the top pitchers in the state, said the coaches at WNMU have told her they plan to use her in the same role when she officially becomes a member of the Mustangs next fall.
