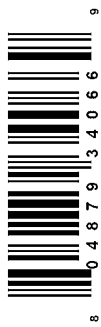

William Jackson Byrd

William Jackson Byrd, also known to his family and friends as "Jack," passed away at home at age 75.

Jack was known to his three children as "papa-bear" and "papa" to his two grandchildren as well as "McGuyver" to his wife.

Jack was born in Mena, Arkansas on Dec. 6, 1944, to Verna Jackson and Ethel Mae Byrd. A couple of years later his family relocated and settled in the small mining town of Superior, Arizona in 1947. This is where Jack remained until his death, on Oct. 28, 2020. Jack was educated in Superior schools and later as a young man found work in the Prescott and Phoenix areas

after which he later returned home to Superior and got a job at Clayton Motors.

In August of 1965, he enlisted in the U.S. Army, and in August of 1971, Jack was honorably discharged and returned to Superior after serving overseas in Okinawa.

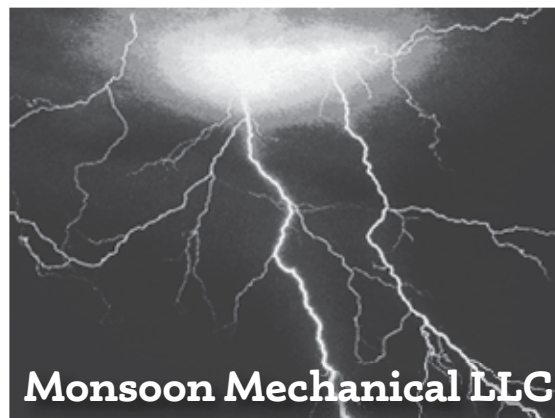
In 1972, he met and married Sandra (Sandy) Lee Bergman and the couple decided to build lives together in the town of Superior to which they fondly referred to as the "Pearl of the Pinalis" where they built their home and raised three daughters. Jack found employment with the Magma Copper Company and worked as a heavy equipment operator until the company shut down in 1983. In December of 1983, he went to work at the Arizona Department of Corrections as a Corrections Officer for 20 years until his retirement in 2004.

Jack was known as an avid outdoorsman and early on was a member of the Saddle Club and Sportsmans Club. Jack always had an admiration for the great outdoors, shooting, hunting and fishing, as well as spending time exploring Arizona and all its beauty, either with his old horse, Bonehead, or four-wheeling with family and friends. Jack was a "dog lover," raising and training Weimaraners over his lifetime. Jack was a devoted family man who was more than a wonderful provider for his family and a loving husband to his wife Sandy for over 48 years.

Jack was preceded in death by his parents and his brothers, Robert Leon Byrd and Jerry Dean Byrd.

Jack was survived by his wife Sandra; daughters, Susan Byrd, Carol Soto (Hector), and Amy Byrd (Curtis); his brother, John G. Byrd (Sheila) of Buena Park, California; sister, Rose Bingochea (Joe); and brother-in-law, John Bergman who he considered like a son. Jack is also survived by his grandchildren, Alejandro and Aliyah Soto along with multiple cousins, nephews, and nieces.

As per his wishes no funeral will be planned, but a memorial service will be held at a later date.

Turkey shoot planned as benefit for Jax Formo

Jax Formo is six months old, with all the usual attributes of a baby of similar age. He has fingers, toes, eyes and nose, a smattering of head hair and adults concerned for his welfare – many, many adults, more than some babies, because he also, unfortunately, has William's syndrome.

On a flyer you may have seen around, there is a very simple message: "JAX FORMO is 6 months old and has Williams syndrome which is an artery defect. He is currently in the hospital dealing with side effects from a heart transplant. We would like to help him and his family."

William's syndrome is more than an artery defect, but flyers are not the place to go into serious detail. It is a genetic condition caused by a particular chromosome

that is missing some of its genes, which cannot perform its necessary function of creating elastin for the arteries, lungs, skin, tendons and ligaments in the body, to give structure and support as well as elasticity which allows them to be shaped, moved and function correctly.

Children with this syndrome can be born with severe heart and artery problems requiring pulmonary artery reconstruction, or develop them later. It affects every aspect of their life, from their features to their personality traits, as well as their physical and mental development. Jax needed and received a heart transplant.

Jax is currently at Phoenix Children's Hospital being treated for respiratory distress. Since his heart transplant on July 23, the right side of his heart is still having trouble and his pulmonary arteries are small, which is causing restricted blood flow. On Oct. 29, doctors successfully placed a stent in his right pulmonary artery in hopes of allowing more blood flow. The hope is that this will be enough for Jax to breathe without high support.

Copper Area News is committed to providing our readers with as much information as possible. We post a daily update on our Facebook page with the total positive COVID-19 Data. This graph shows the daily counts of positive cases for the past week as of press time on Nov. 3, 2020.

There are a few points we would like our readers to consider when following this data.

1. This will continue to be a rolling total of positive cases. It does not reflect recoveries or deaths. The Arizona Department of Health Services does not break out this data.
2. If you see a reduction in numbers from day to day it is most likely due to a data entry error or mis-coding of a zip code (at the state level).
3. This is all zip code based data; most of our zip codes include unincorporated areas. There is no way to track exactly which areas each of the positive cases are. Example, Kearny and Winkelman each have small communities in their zip code that are not in the Town's incorporated boundaries.
4. If you live in Gila County, please follow the Gila County Health and Emergency Management, Facebook. They have maintained their data on recoveries and current positive cases.
5. You can follow other data such as ICU bed use, Ventilator use and hospital capacity online: <https://bit.ly/3inh280>

Working together, we can slow the spread of the virus across the Copper Corridor. Wear a mask in public, remain physically distant (6 feet apart or more), practice good hygiene (wash your hands frequently, sanitize high touch areas) and stay home if you are not feeling well.

Grandma Gertie's Pumpkin Pie

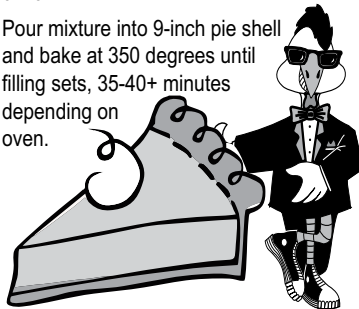
Ingredients

Navarette's 6 TDs help Superior remain unbeaten

Superior senior Adam Navarette threw for three touchdowns, runs for two more, and added another on a 70-yard punt return in the second-ranked Panthers 56 – 12 victory against visiting Desert Heights Prep last Friday night.

Navarratte, who started at quarterback in place of the injured Matthew Cruz, totaled 309 all-purpose yards in addition to 168 passing yards. He now has 11 touchdowns in five games this season, including four each rushing and receiving, and three more on punt returns.

The Panthers left little doubt about the outcome early in the game, leading 48 – 6 at

halftime.

“We had a couple key starters out with injuries,” said Panthers’ head coach Ryan Palmer, referring to the aforementioned Cruz as well as sophomore Zach Duarte. “We were able to adapt and play a balanced game. I thought overall we executed well.”

Senior Matthew Diaz-Gonzalez rushed for two touchdowns and senior receivers Josh Marquez, Nathan Duarte, and Marc Mendoza each had touchdown receptions.

The Panthers’ defense was stifling again, coming up with five sacks and three interceptions. Josh Marques had two sacks while Diaz-Gonzalez, who had a game-high 11 tackles, and Marc

Mendoza each finished with one-and-a-half sacks. Senior Matthew Perez picked off two Coyotes’ passes, and Duarte added another.

Superior enters this Friday’s regular-season finale against San Manuel without many of its starters having yet to play all four quarters in a game. Three of the Panthers opponents have only one win apiece, so far, and Desert Heights Preps is winless. Only San Manuel, which lost 58 – 0 to St. David last week, and Tempe Prep, a team the Panthers defeated 54 – 7, have winning records.

Does Palmer have any concern that his starters haven’t played a full game yet? “Iron sharpens iron,” he responded. “You never really know what type team you

have until they are faced with adversity.

“However, these guys have championship experience and know what it takes to finish strong. We are working hard on improving our conditioning. We haven’t played to our full potential

yet.”

Perhaps the Panthers will face their toughest opponent to date in the ninth-ranked Miners, a team that was unbeaten before last Friday. San Manuel, a 2A team a year ago, has some depth, which could force Palmer to use his starters after halftime form the first time in a while.

“San Manuel is a top-ten

team and (could) be a playoff team as well,” Palmer said. “It should be a great game. We are looking forward to the challenge and another opportunity to grow as a team.”

Up next: Friday, Nov. 6, vs. San Manuel. Kickoff is scheduled for 6 p.m.
