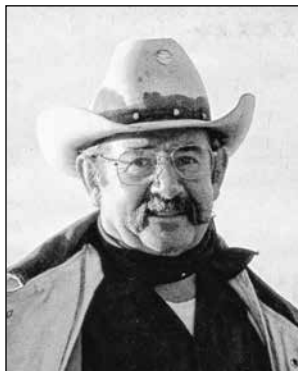

Donald Patrick McConnell, age 84, of Mesa, Arizona, passed away Monday, Oct. 28, 2013, in Mesa. He was born March 17, 1929 in Buffalo, Wyoming. He married the love of his life, Ruth Claire Shultz, on May 19, 1950, in Buffalo, Wyoming. She survives.

For 33 years, Donald worked for Ohio Oil Company, which later became Marathon Oil

Company, where he was a foreman. He loved horses and was an accomplished leather craftsman who enjoyed saddle making and leather tooling. He also made purses, belts, and various other leather goods. Donald loved anything to do with the outdoors and took his friends and children on numerous pack trips into the mountains of Wyoming. After retiring

from Marathon, he worked as an outfitter and camp cook, for hunting and fishing trips in the Yellowstone area. He greatly enjoyed cooking in these remote locations. He also cooked for the fire cleanup crews during the big fires in Yellowstone National Park.

Donald was raised as Master Mason on Nov. 22, 1957 and was past Master of Tri-Mountain

View Masonic Lodge #35 in Lovell, Wyoming. He joined Radiant Chapter #34, Eastern Star in June of 1964 and served as Worthy Patron many times. Since 1978, he was a member of Royal Arch Masons Darius Chapter #10, York Right Council of Masons, Kalif Shriners of Sheridan, WY and of the Knights Templar of Cody, WY. Donald and his wife Ruth are former members of the United Methodist Church in Lovell, WY.

PCSO, SPD investigate shooting, robbery in Superior

On Saturday, Oct. 26, 2013 at 7:16 a.m. detectives from the Pinal County Sheriff's Office were asked to assist the Superior Police Department with a shooting investigation. Detectives responded to Superior and met with their officers for a briefing.

The detectives were told, the 40-year-old male

victim had been severely beaten and had a single gunshot wound to his neck. The victim was transported to a level one trauma hospital in Phoenix. The victim immediately had to go in to surgery for the gunshot wound. The victim's truck was also found burned in the desert several miles away.

PCSO Detectives were

able to learn through interviews, the shooting victim was also the victim of a robbery several days prior. Detectives learned after the robbery, the victim was warned by the suspects involved he needed to leave town.

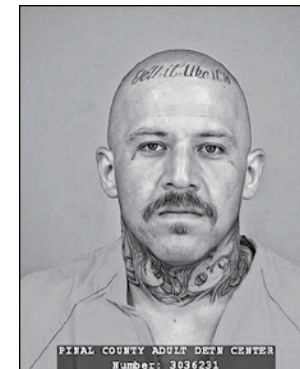
On Oct. 26 shortly before 3 a.m., two females showed up at the victim's residence and offered to sell him methamphetamines. The victim left his residence in the 1700 block of S. Quail Dr. in Superior with the two females. The victim drove his truck with the individuals to a

location in Superior. Once at the location, the victim was shot in the neck and later beaten by several of the suspects who had previously robbed him. After being beaten and shot, the suspects stole the victim's vehicle. The victim walked home and a friend called 9-1-1. The victim's truck was then burned by the suspects in the desert.

"The shooter was identified through the investigation as Robert Villalobos (age 26 of Superior). Villalobos was located by detectives and he was taken into custody,"

Sheriff Paul Babeu said. "The investigation is still ongoing as detectives are interviewing other possible witnesses. Additional arrests are pending."

Robert Villalobos was booked into the Pinal County Jail for Armed Robbery, three counts of Aggravated Assault (count one - causing a serious injury, count two - using a deadly weapon and count three - using force that causes temporary but substantial disfigurement, temporary but substantial loss or impairment of any body organ or part of a fracture of any body part),

Resolution: Community forums set stage for mine plan of operations

On Tuesday, Nov. 12, 2013 Resolution Copper will unveil the long awaited mine plan of operations. The public is invited to attend this open house and view the mine plan of operations in an open format.

The presentation will begin at 6 p.m. at the Superior Junior-Senior High School Multipurpose Room. The mine plan of operations will be submitted to the Tonto National Forest for their review and the submission of the plan will trigger the Forest Service to begin conducting the National Environmental Protect Act (NEPA) review on the entire project. Once the NEPA process begins, the public will have opportunities to comment on their concerns for the project.

During the spring and summer of 2013 Resolution Copper hosted a series of community town hall and forums on specific mine related concerns. Forums have been held to address the concerns that been brought up regarding the NEPA, water usage, tailings, the land exchange legislation and economic development. Each forum allowed those in attendance to ask questions, or make suggestions regarding the project. The mine plan of operations will also include all of these elements, which will be evaluated in the NEPA review. The NEPA will assist in projecting the environmental, cultural and economic impacts of the project and determine how impacts will be mitigated by the company.

In further efforts to involve the community Resolution Copper created a Community Working Group. This group met with an independent mediator to express their concerns and help offer solutions for tailings site selection and other environmental concerns. This group continues to meet to address these concerns.

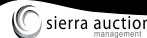



