# High school creates Virtual Vietnam Memorial Project

A high school in Austin, Texas has created a remarkable program honoring those killed in the Vietnam War.

Westlake High School in the Eanes Independent School District is the creator of the project. The Virtual Vietnam Memorial Project is part of an ongoing project assignment for students in the English III AP an Advanced Placement Language and Composition (College Board) upper level class for 11th graders. It began in the 1990s and was the idea of two teachers, Sandra Coker (now retired) and Rebecka Stucky (still teaching at Westlake).

The program started as a companion project to the book, *The Things They Carried* by Tim O'Brien. This book is about the Vietnam War written by a Vietnam Veteran. Although it is fiction it is based on many of O'Brien's experiences in Nam. Tim O'Brien also wrote the classic, *If I Die in a Combat Zone*, his memoir of his year spent as a foot soldier in Vietnam in 1969. Usually each student is assigned a name off of the Vietnam Memorial Wall but the student can choose a name if a memorial has not been done for that name. They then research and gather information about the soldier and create a video presentation honoring the individual's life and the time in which they lived. When the project first started, they were creating posters of the soldiers' lives. In the early or mid-2000s, they began creating the video memorials.

I found out about this program when I was contacted by a Westlake student in 2018 who was doing a presentation on Allen Ingram who was from San Manuel and was killed in Vietnam in 1968. The student, Alanna Alejandro, told me about the program and provided me with the links to the Westlake High School and Virtual Vietnam Memorial Project. I was able to gather some

articles about Allen from the San Manuel Miner newspaper archives and was able to put her in touch with a couple of his friends. I also gave her some personal anecdotes as I knew Allen while growing up in San Manuel. I was able to view her

## Grandma Gertie's Pumpkin Pie


### Ingredients

# San Manuel seniors go out in style

The San Manuel football team traveled to San Carlos last Friday and the Miners celebrated the players strapping on helmets for perhaps the final time of their high school careers, if not their lives, with a lopsided 48 – 8 victory.

“The game was a good win for the team and the seniors last high school game,” San Manuel head coach Ernie Ivy told the *Miner*.

The Miners’ seniors did most, if not all, of the heavy lifting in Friday’s game.

Senior quarterback Caleb Quintero threw five touchdown passes for the third time this season, completing 15-of-23 passes for 237 yards. He also rushed for 72 yards and a score and had an interception on defense. The 6-foot-2 signal caller finished the season with 23 touchdown passes, six times throwing at least two in a game. He added five rushing scores on 349 yards.

Senior Jose Moreno had 120 total yards in the win three touchdowns – two receiving and one rushing. He starred on defense as well, finishing with 10 tackles, a fumble recovery and a partial sack.

Elijah Davis and Benny Laguna, both seniors, each

posted receiving touchdowns against the Braves. Laguna, who had six tackles in his final high school game, also had three interceptions and a partial sack.

Another senior, Santiago Salazar, had 1.5 sacks to go along with seven tackles. Abel Aguirre, also a senior, had a team-high 11 tackles in the game.

As the Miners look forward to next season, the returning players can look at Friday’s game as an example of what it takes to perform at a level the seniors did.

“We will focus on hitting the weight room and preparing the younger players for the 2020 season,” Ivy said.

The Miners will move down a conference to 1A in 2020.

## Miners swim well at Southern Regional Meet; Evan Apuron wins 50 Free and 100 Butterfly.

Twenty-six high school swim teams competed at the Southern Arizona Regional Qualifier Swim Meet in Oro Valley on Nov. 1-2. It was the final opportunity for the teams from Southern Arizona to achieve qualifying times for the State Championship Meet this weekend.

The preliminary session was held on Friday. The goal in prelims was to advance to the finals held on Saturday. With 26

teams at the meet, achieving a top 16 finish was a tough challenge. Evan Apuron was the only Miner to earn a spot in Finals.

Senior Bailee Hill swam her lifetime fastest 200 Freestyle to finish in 43rd Place. Later in the Meet Bialec finished 44th in the 100 Backstroke.

Junior Alyssa Riekofski swam a good 50 Free to finish in 71st place and also finished 53rd in the 100 Backstroke.

Sophomore Marialena Molina finished her first season of competitive swimming with her best swims ever; she finished 37th in the 50 Free and 38th in the 100 Free.

Sophomore Hunter Hill had some very good swims, earning a 52nd place in the 50 Free and 35th place in the 100 Backstroke.

Junior Evan Apuron won both the 50 Free and 100 Butterfly. He is swimming very well as we approach the State

Championship Meet. Evan will be defending his 2018 Championship Title in the 100 Butterfly against some very good competition..

The Division III State Swim Championship will be held at Phoenix Country Day Aquatic Center in Paradise Valley beginning on Thursday, Nov. 7, at 3:30 p.m., with Finals scheduled for Friday. Go Miners!

These presentations use music of the times, still photographs, news video, film and comments of family and friends to honor those that gave their lives in Vietnam. 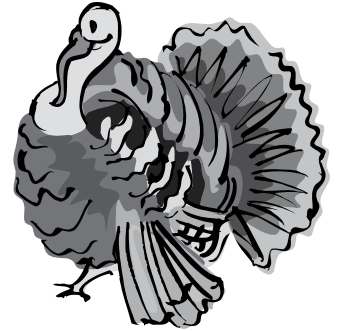
