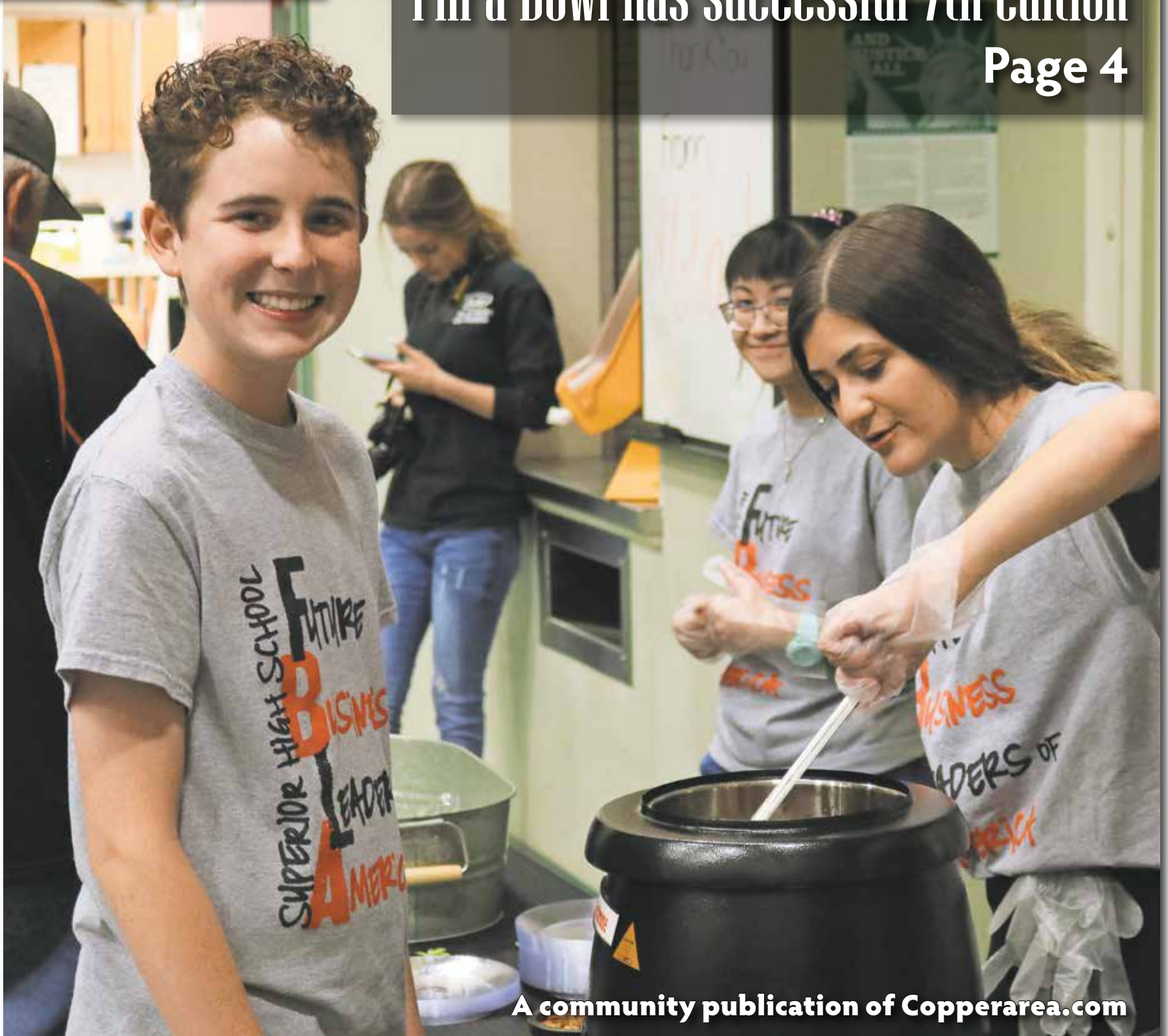

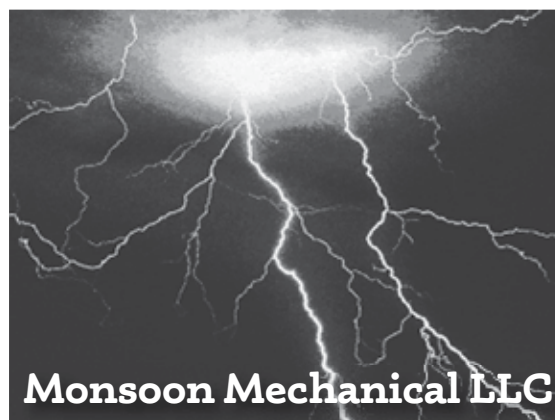

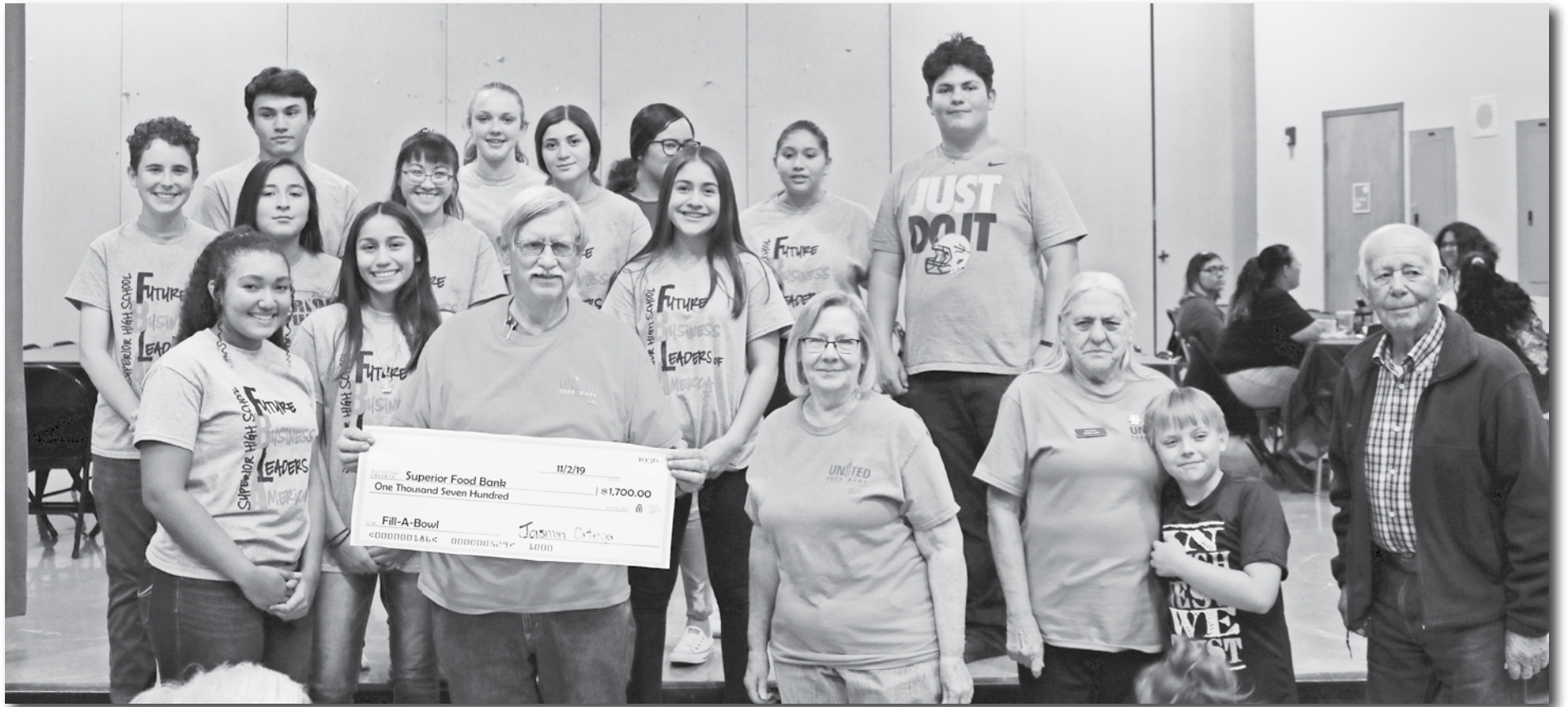

Superior High School's 7th Annual Fill a Bowl - a fulfilling success

The Superior High School chapter of the Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA) hosted the 7th Annual Fill-A-Bowl fundraiser to benefit the Superior Food Bank. This event has become a community tradition with well over a hundred people

attending. At press time, FBLA raised \$1,700 for the Superior Food Bank.

FBLA is a new career technical education (CTE) student organization. FBLA has replaced the DECA club, since FBLA focusses on preparing students for careers

in business and administration. Under the leadership of the FBLA members, students at the Superior Junior-Senior High school help to prepare for the event by decorating bowls for the event in advance.

Those attending the event were treated to an all you can eat soup and salad dinner, prepared by the students and their families at Superior Junior-Senior High School. The event is held each year in the fall.



Full closures of US 60 at Pinto Creek scheduled to begin Nov. 7

Motorists who use US 60 between Miami and Superior should expect long delays and a lengthy detour starting Thursday, Nov. 7, when the Pinto Creek Bridge closes to all traffic for rock blasting.

US 60 will be closed on Tuesdays and Thursdays between 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. for about six weeks. Crews will reopen the road prior to 1 p.m. if it is safe and passable.

All eastbound vehicles will be redirected at State Route 177 in Superior, and westbound vehicles will be redirected at the west end of Miami. Traffic will not be allowed to queue at the closure locations.

Motorists with a destination between SR 177 and Top-

of-the-World west of Pinto Creek or between Miami and Pinto Valley Mine Road east of Pinto Creek will be allowed to pass, however no vehicles will be allowed between Top-of-the-World and Pinto Valley Mine Road.

During the closures, traffic will be detoured to SR 177 in Superior and SR 77 in Globe. The detour includes a 10% grade and will significantly increase travel time.

Law enforcement officers will be stationed at the intersection of SR 77 and SR 177 in Winkelman.

Arizona Department of Transportation crews will also complete maintenance work (vegetation removal, guardrail repairs and pavement overlays) during the

closures.

Because of the potential for long delays, motorists may want to plan trips before or after the full closures.

Roll down your windows and roll up your sleeves: drive-through flu shots Nov. 8

Gila County Public Health is sponsoring a drive-through flu clinic at High Desert Middle School in Globe Friday, Nov. 8, 9 a.m. to noon.

Need more incentive to drive over and protect yourself ahead of flu season? All participants have a chance to win a grand prize 50-inch LG smart TV (thanks to a generous donation by Haven Health), with gift cards and gift certificates from other gracious donors including J & R's El Rey Cafe, Guayo's on the trail, and Guild Consulting. Three ways to win: earn one ticket just for showing up, or two tickets if you arrive with proof you've already had a flu shot, and three if you 'drive-through' and get a shot.

Influenza (the flu) is a highly contagious respiratory illness caused by viruses infecting nose, throat and lungs - infection spreads through the air when a person who has the virus sneezes, coughs, or speaks.

Flu season runs October-to-May; Gila County Public Health Department staff advise getting the flu shot as early in the season as possible. The flu can come on suddenly; symptoms include fatigue, body aches and chills, cough, sore throat and fever. The flu virus

affects animals too. An average of 5% to 20% of the U.S. population contract the virus. The flu results in 31.4 million outpatient visits and 200,000 hospitalizations every year. The 2017-2018 flu season was known as the deadliest in decades; 80,000 died from the flu, with more than 900,000 hospitalized. Sadly, 185 pediatric deaths were reported to CDC, of which 80 percent were children who did not receive the flu shot.

'Team effort' propels Superior to playoff victory

The No. 3 Superior football team will make its fifth-straight semifinals appearance in the state playoffs following a lopsided 48 – 0 victory against No. 11 Ft. Thomas last Friday. As a result of the victory, the Panthers have a chance at a third-straight State Championship game appearance with a win this Saturday.

The Panthers amassed nearly 500 yards of total offense and snatched six takeaways on defense in a dominant team performance.

"Our defense played great," Superior head coach Ryan Palmer told the *Superior Sun*. "The front four of Marc

Mendoza, Gabe Castillo, Matthew Diaz-Gonzales, and Daniel McConnell did a great job shutting down Fort Thomas' run game and containing their quarterback. The secondary of Sammy Lopez, Adam Navarrete, Andrew Martinez, and Gabe Otero covered very well. Great overall team effort from start to finish."

Lopez spearheaded all of it on both sides of the ball, catching four passes for 80 yards and a pair of touchdowns. On defense, the six-foot, 160-pound senior added three more interceptions to his state-leading total, which now stands at 10 on the season. He also recovered a fumble. Diaz-Gonzales also had a pick

What is Hyperbaric Wound Therapy?

Hyperbaric oxygen therapy involves breathing pure oxygen in a pressurized room or tube. Hyperbaric oxygen therapy is a well-established treatment for decompression sickness, a hazard of scuba diving. Other conditions treated with hyperbaric oxygen therapy include serious infections, bubbles of air in your blood vessels, and wounds that won't heal.



In a hyperbaric oxygen therapy chamber, the air pressure is increased to three times higher than normal air pressure. Under these conditions, your lungs can gather more oxygen than would be possible breathing pure oxygen at normal air pressure.

Your blood carries this oxygen throughout your body. This helps fight bacteria and stimulate the

release of substances called growth factors and stem cells, which promote healing.

Conditions for Treatment

Hyperbaric oxygen therapy is used to treat several medical conditions. And medical institutions use it in different ways. Your doctor may suggest hyperbaric oxygen therapy if you have one of the following conditions:

- Anemia, severe
- Brain abscess
- Bubbles of air in your blood vessels (arterial gas embolism)
- Burn
- Decompression sickness
- Carbon monoxide poisoning
- Crushing injury
- Deafness, sudden
- Gangrene
- Infection of skin or bone that causes tissue death
- Non-healing wounds, such as a diabetic foot ulcer
- Radiation injury
- Vascular wounds
- Skin graft or skin flap at risk of tissue death
- Wounds that won't heal

During Hyperbaric Therapy

Hyperbaric oxygen therapy typically is performed as an outpatient procedure and doesn't require hospitalization. If you're already hospitalized and require hyperbaric oxygen therapy, you'll remain in the hospital for therapy. The increased air pressure will create a temporary feeling of fullness in your ears — similar to what you might feel in an airplane or at a high elevation. You can relieve

that feeling by yawning or swallowing. For most conditions, therapy lasts approximately two hours. Members of our health care team will monitor you and the therapy unit throughout your treatment.

You may feel somewhat tired or hungry following your treatment. This doesn't limit normal activities.

and a fumble recovery in the game.

Offensively, quarterback Matthew Cruz completed 11-of-14 for 161 yards and three touchdowns. The Panthers rushed for 325 yards in the game, including a game-high 137 yards from Navarrette, who ran for two touchdowns. Diaz-Gonzales and Otero each scored a rushing touchdown.

Now the Panthers will take on No. 7 Mogollon, which upset No. 2 Bagdad, 28 – 18, last Friday. It will be the second meeting between the teams this season. Superior defeated the Mustangs on Sept. 20, 52 – 14.

“Mogollon is a well-coached team,” Palmer said. “They went into Bagdad and upset it on its home field. That is no easy task, especially in a playoff game.

“When it comes to the semifinals you can throw all the records and previous results out the window. We have improved a lot since the first time we played Mogollon, but it has improved a lot as well.”

No doubt that’s true, but it’s still difficult to beat the same team twice in a season.

“Beating a team twice is difficult, especially in football,” Palmer said. “So much of the outcome of the game is based on planning and preparation. What worked well the first time, may not the next.

“However, it is going to come down to who wants it more, and which team executes the best,” Palmer continued. “We know a trip to the championship is earned through hard work. We will be focusing on playing our best football in the biggest game of the season, so far.”

Up next: This Saturday, Nov. 9, versus No. 7 Mogollon at Coronado High School. Kickoff is scheduled for 6 p.m.

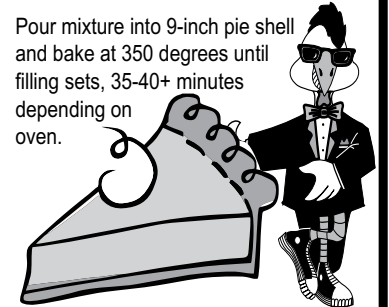
