

# Superior's Season ends

The season wasn't supposed to end this way for the second-ranked Superior football team.

But it did, and it hurts.

For the second year in a row, the Panthers' dreams of taking a state title back to Superior ended in a semifinals loss at Maricopa High School, the most recent a 42 – 40 overtime loss to No. 3 Williams last Saturday.

"First of all, Williams deserves a lot of credit," Panthers' head coach Ryan Palmer told the Superior Sun. "Their players made some big plays in big moments. I know that our kids played their hearts out, but we did not have enough to put the game the away when we needed to."

After Williams erased a 14-point fourthquarter deficit, the Panthers still had a chance to continue chasing their dreams, facing a first-and-goal from the four-yard line with less than a minute to play and the game tied, 34 - 34. But the Vikings came up with a goal-line stand, stopping the Panthers on four-straight plays to force overtime.

Superior won the toss in OT and chose to play defense first. Williams' Martin Soria scored on the second play from five yards out and his pass to Daniel Lopez converted the two-point PAT.

The Panthers need to score a touchdown and convert a two-point PAT to force a second overtime. The first part was easy enough with quarterback Nicolaus Cruz finding Steven Ybarra on the first play for a 10-yard touchdown. It was the second part that proved to be difficult as the conversion attempt failed, and with that the Panthers' season ended.

"We had many opportunities to win that game, but we just could not get it done," Palmer said. Palmer told his team at midfield after the game that the loss hurts because the players, coaches and community cared so much.

That's undoubtedly true. But it also hurts because the Panthers

had opportunities to win the game, despite being outnumbered and out of gas. The Vikings' roster listed 37 players, more than twice as many as the Panthers.

"Some of our key players were exhausted after the first quarter," said Palmer.
"Williams had half their team playing one way, and on a hot afternoon, on a draining field that was the difference."

It hurts because arguably the school's greatest collection of seniors, who have been playing together since elementary school, along with a group of talented

underclassmen deserved to go out as champions.

But football is known to teach life-long lessons and the Panthers' players learned a hard one on Saturday.

"Even when you work so hard to achieve something you can still fail, but it is not always about winning or losing," Palmer said. "It is about the value of hard work and a commitment to team, school, and community."

In that sense, it's impossible to view the Panthers' season as anything other than a success. They were committed to working hard and they did, like they never had before in the offseason, according to Palmer

They represented their town and school with class.

And they were dynamic; a fun team to watch every Friday night and one Saturday afternoon, even in defeat.

"Even though we fell short of our ultimate goal, these young men have learned more about the values of discipline, desire, dedication, and selfrespect in a single season that some ever will," Palmer said. "Football doesn't only build character, it reveals it, and I am honored to have coached such a high-character group of young men."

Before the season, senior running back Edgar Galindo, in a season-preview video, said that it was time for the Panthers to "put up or shut up."

After the game last Saturday, there were no words.

Just tears.

That hurts.



Superior Head Start had its open house on Thursday, Nov. 3. There were 14 kids in attendance that day. A few parents came to visit along with some Superior Town Employees.

Toni Solis from the library dropped by and talked to the kids about Geography. He pointed out to them where the State of Arizona was on the map and talked about some of the different states and what they are known for such as Wisconsin and their

Mayor Mila Besich-Lira told the kids all about her job and her responsibilities as Town Mayor. She emphasized how important it was to be a good citizen and how the kids could start down that track by following the rules, listening to their teachers, and helping others. And since it's almost election time she did a story time and read the book CLIFFORD RUNS FOR PRESIDENT.

Town Manager Todd Pryor stopped by and told the kids some of the different duties he must perform throughout the day as part of his job. He told them how he has many meetings during the day and he has to make sure to buy whatever each department needs to keep running. And a very important job he has is to make sure things like the garbage trucks pick up the trash.

The Fire Department showed up to help the children practice running a fire drill. The Firefighters also passed out stickers and made sure the kids were both comfortable around the fire trucks, the ambulance, and a firefighter in full gear.

Officer Bryan Lawrence and K9 Ace were

a big hit with the kids. The Officer told them all about K9 Ace. The young pit bull is a very gentle dog and seemed to adore being around the kids.

The Head Start Pre-school program focuses on literacy and school readiness, preparing the children socially and emotionally. They teach the kids manners and do activities to help their fine motor skills, such as holding a pencil. There is a daily health check because the program believes that if a child is healthy they are more apt to learn. They also provide the kids with two meals and talk to the kids about healthy eating. There is a daily classroom routine and each child has a job they must do for two weeks – breakfast helper, playground helper, calendar helper, table washer. The children rotate through each job and by doing these jobs build self-esteem, confidence, independence and responsibility.

# he Town of Superior was incorporated in 1976 and has seen the community change and evolve over the years. The reason a community incorporates is to allow the residents of those incorporated boundaries to elect their Mayor and Town Council. That Mayor and Town Council then represent the people of the community and decide on policy and set the budget for the community.

The Council is also responsible for hiring of a town manager and police chief. Other key department heads are managed and hired by the Town Manager. Superior hired Todd Pryor as the Town Manager in the Spring of 2016. In his term as Manager, he has helped to develop processes and procedures for the financial

department, worked out a plan for the re-opening of the transfer station, among other things.

In the coming months, there will be more information provided to the public on the completion of the pavement study that will help to determine the priorities for local road improvement. The wastewater treatment rate study is now complete and that will help the council to determine an adequate and reasonable rate for sewer services. This will allow the town to apply for grants to help with much needed improvements to the wastewater treatment plant. And in addition, the Arizona Department of Transportation has awarded the Town a \$247,000 grant to conduct a master plan for the airport on the western edge of the town limits.

A good portion of the revenues raised to operate the town comes from sales tax and property taxes. Shopping local and supporting the local businesses is a great way to support your community as a whole. The Town of Superior is a member of the Superior Chamber of Commerce



and is looking forward to growing a strong relationship with the Chamber to continue to support the community as a whole.

The next meeting of the Town of Superior Community Working Group (CWG) will be held Wednesday, Nov. 9, 2016 at 6 p.m. in the Superior Chamber of Commerce meeting room. Tonto National Forest representatives will discuss goals and schedule for preparing a new management plan for the area around Apache Leap.

The CWG includes residents and stakeholders from the Town of Superior, Queen Valley, Hewitt Station, Globe, the San Carlos Community and around the area. The group deals with the social and environmental issues, science and policy, and the pros and cons of the proposed Resolution Copper Project. Topics include environmental impacts, health, safety, natural resource issues, engineering, water quantity and quality, geology, economics, air quality, community investments, recreational changes and other related subjects.

Meetings are held at the Superior Chamber of Commerce at 165 West Main in Superior from 6-8 p.m., most often

on the second Wednesday of each month. The public is welcome and time is reserved on the agenda for everyone's comments, questions, and discussion.
