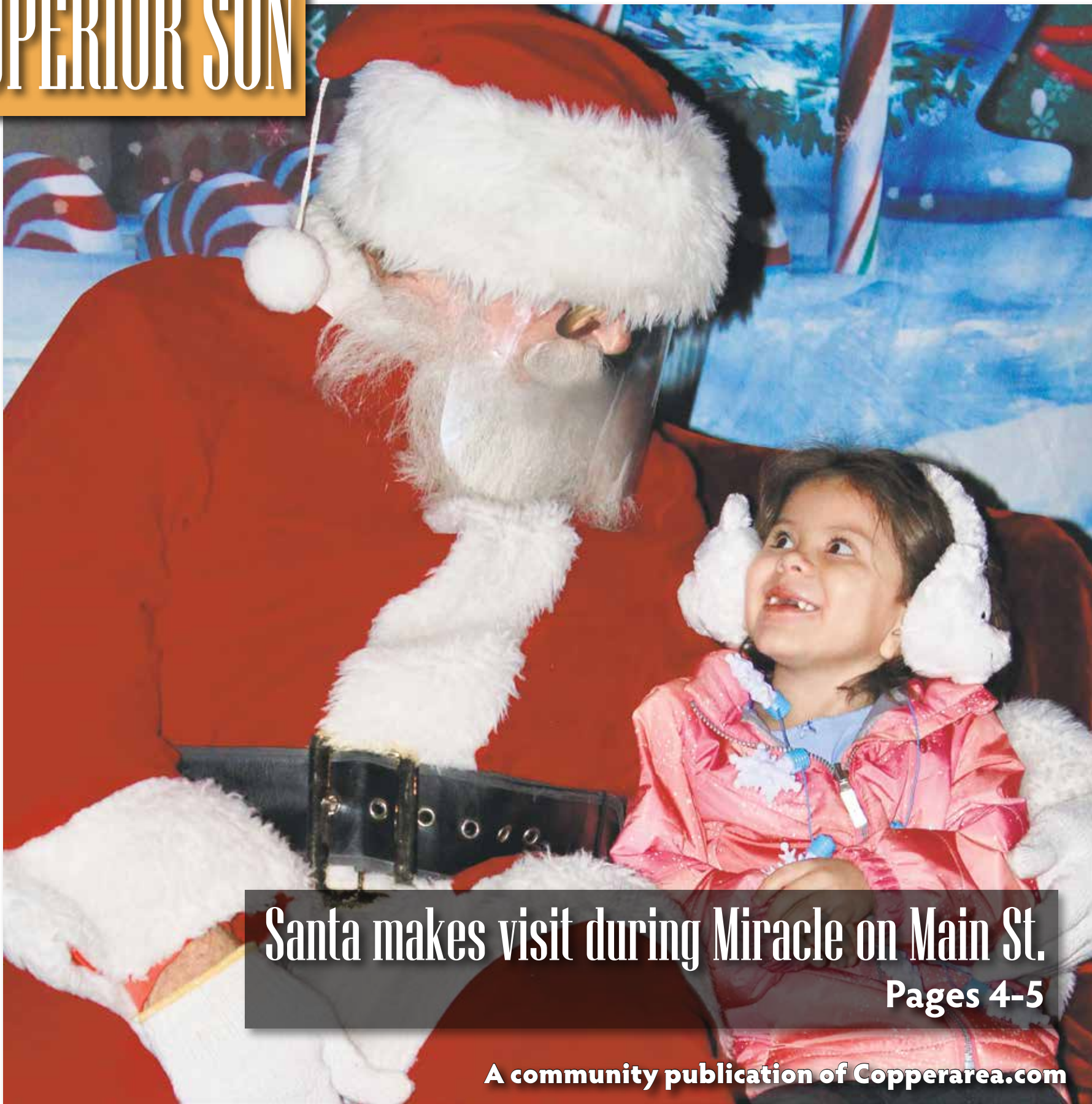

# Supervisor tours Superior, Copper Basin area

Theodora “Theo” Schiro is a Democratic Precinct Committee Person for the Kearny area. She invited Pinal County District 1 Supervisor Kevin Cavanaugh for a tour of our area on Friday, Dec. 3. The Supervisor lives in Coolidge, which has many of the same issues as our Copper Corridor.

After a meeting with the board of the Copper Corridor Economic Development Coalition (CCEDC), Supervisor Cavanaugh joined Pete Casillas and us on the beautiful patio of the Sunflour Market and Café in Superior. Willa gave us a quick history of the building. Kennedy Ivy, Kevin’s aide, took notes.

Pete gave us the latest update on the Resolution Mine amendment being debated in the Budget Reconciliation Bill in Washington. Mental health and substance abuse issues were discussed.

Cavanaugh explained his approach to making government more efficient. We talked about how small towns with limited resources needed solutions that did not involve reams of paperwork and months of red tape; we just want support so we can get the job done!

Next, we headed south on State Route 177, over “the Divide” – a mountain pass that isolates much of the Copper Basin. Where Superior sits on heavily trafficked US 60, most towns out here you need to know about before you find us.

I explained how the Ray Mine converted from underground operations to an open pit that resembles the landscape of Frank Herbert’s famous novel, “Dune.” And how Kennecott worked with the Galbraith Company out of Cleveland, Ohio to plan and build the new town of Kearny. Ours is the first community in Arizona to enact equal housing opportunity, as any family could purchase a home here.

We arrived at the world famous Old Time Pizza to meet with Judge David Orzell and Doctor Pizza himself, Gary Birkett.

Judge Orzell provided news about developments with the Cobre Valley Regional Medical Center (CVRMC) construction of a new, state-of-the-art medical facility that is in the works, and how CVRMC took over the vital

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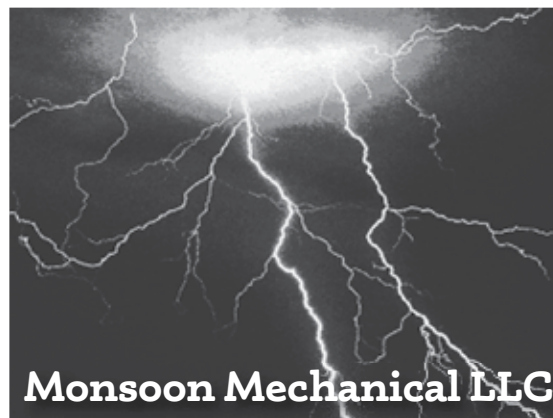

However, the amount of tires, mattresses and other items littered across the desert is unacceptable and an eyesore. The Pinal County Attorney's Office is launching a 'rewards program' that will provide a \$500 reward to tipsters who submit information on people illegally dumping items if the tip leads to charges in the case.

"This is a problem that we need the whole community to help us solve," said Pinal County Attorney Kent Volkmer.

Pinal County has also created a new, simplified online page to direct residents to any resource they are seeking.

This includes how to properly dispose of bulky items, when and where to find community cleanups, and how to report an illegal dump site.

"We wanted a one stop shop with all the information that people would need to do the right thing," Volkmer said. "We are really excited and hopeful that this new program is going to cut down on illegal dumping and hold those that do dump accountable."

The new online site, which includes the submission

### Supervisor Visits Superior, Copper Basin Area

On Dec. 3, after meeting with Mayor Mila Besich of Superior, and the Copper Corridor Economic Development Coalition, Supervisor Cavanaugh joined a group of stakeholders for a tour of the scenic Copper Corridor.

Starting at the Sunflour Market and Café, the owner Willa Ficarra was very welcoming and gave a great history of the building. Supervisor was met there by Theodora Schiro, Dawn McVicker, and Gerry Kaufhold and by Pete Casillas of the Superior Chamber of Commerce for a conversation on the patio. After discussing economic development, farming, water, substance abuse, and the Resolution Copper Mine, the bulk of the group headed to Kearny.

Meeting Kearny Magistrate David Orzell at Old Time Pizza, the owner Gary Birkett spoke with the group about the history of Kearny and his business. Magistrate Orzell shared good news about the Cobre Valley Regional Medical Center's new state of the art medical facility, and the Buddy Project that will bring a mobile veterinary clinic

to the Copper Corridor.

After departing Kearny, the group ventured past the ASARCO Ray Mine to Winkelman Flats, downtown Hayden, and the San Pedro subdivision. Mr. Kaufhold provided stories of the people who lived in the former towns of Ray, Barcelona, and Sonora, and how the mine consumed those towns after Kennecott Mining Company planned and built Kearney. He also shared much of the history of Hayden and how the adjacent San Pedro neighborhoods were formed.

The tour was a great opportunity to get to know the people and traditions of a very historical part of Arizona. Thank you to all who helped make this possible. Through working together, we can help make Pinal County an even better place to live.

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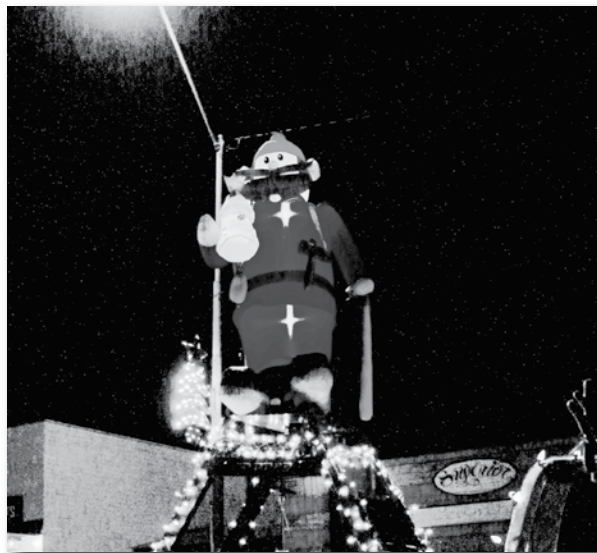

local Ambulance Service to keep it from going away. He also introduced the Buddy Project, which plans to bring a mobile veterinary clinic to the Copper Corridor area, provide spaying and neutering services, and educate local pet owners.

Doctor Pizza regaled us with stories about the Arizona Trail. He got a call one afternoon from a pair of women hikers who were so exhausted they just said “Bring us Pizza and Ice Cream. We’ll pay you ANYTHING!” That started the tradition of Old Time Pizza delivering food and drink directly to the trail head out along the Florence-Kelvin Highway.

A new movie about the Arizona National Scenic Trail features about 10 minutes of interviews with Gary and Lorraine. They have become internationally known because we have hikers coming through from dozens of countries on several continents. I’ve personally given rides to hikers from Japan, Germany, Australia, and New Zealand. Olympic Gold Medalist Clara Hughes came through and stayed two days at our local General Kearny Inn. She had the honor of carrying Canada’s flag at the opening ceremony of the 2010 Winter Games in

Resolution BOA2021-03

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF SUPERIOR ACTING AS THE TOWN BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT COMMISSION, APPROVING A VARIANCE REQUESTED BY JOAQUIN MANCINAS FOR 823 W. MARTIN STREET TO ALLOW USE OF THE EXISTING FRONT SETBACK LINE FOR THE FUTURE HOUSE. WHEREAS, the Town of Superior acting as the Town Board of Adjustments Commission has, at its regular meeting on November 29th, 2021, studied and considered Resolution No. BOA2021-03 recommending a variance request submitted by Joaquin Mancinas for a variance for the allowance to use the existing front setback lines for the future house at a residence located at 823 W Martin Street in the Town of Superior, a copy of which is attached hereto; and WHEREAS, a timely and properly noticed public meeting on Resolution No. BOA2021-03 was held by the Board of Adjustments Commission of the Town of Superior during its regularly scheduled meeting on September 29th 2021, at which hearing evidence, oral and documentary, was admitted on behalf of Joaquin Mancinas requesting a variance for the real property located at 823 W Martin Street to allow a variance for the following matters: The property has special circumstances and conditions. The 8-inch Town Main sewer line, Sewer Manhole, and 15 feet of utility easement for the sewer line are located in the middle of the applicant parcels. The current owner purchased the property with pre-existing conditions. The conditions described above were not imposed by the applicant. The future house dimensions will not fit in any other way on the property without interfering with the sewer line, manholes, and utility easement unless the 20-foot front setback is given to build the house. The existing conditions of the setbacks are not causing any inconvenience nor being materially detrimental to the adjacent property, neighborhood, or public welfare. Moreover, the current property is located at the end of the street adjacent to queen creek. It is the last parcel on the dead-end road. Attached Exhibit “A” Site Plan shows the property boundary lines, the setback lines, and the Sewer line and Easement. Zoning Ordinance regulations §18.2 Limitation on Lots: A. This Article does not prohibit routine maintenance on legal non-conforming lots. C. Any legal lot existing at the time of the enactment of this Ordinance, or any amendment, which does not conform to the required lot width or depth and/or lot area may be used for any use permitted in that zone district provided that all setback requirements can be met. If the size and shape of the substandard lot is such that no permitted structure that may be constructed that meets the required setback requirements for that zone district, an application for a variance may be submitted to the Board of Adjustment for their approval conditional approval, or denial. 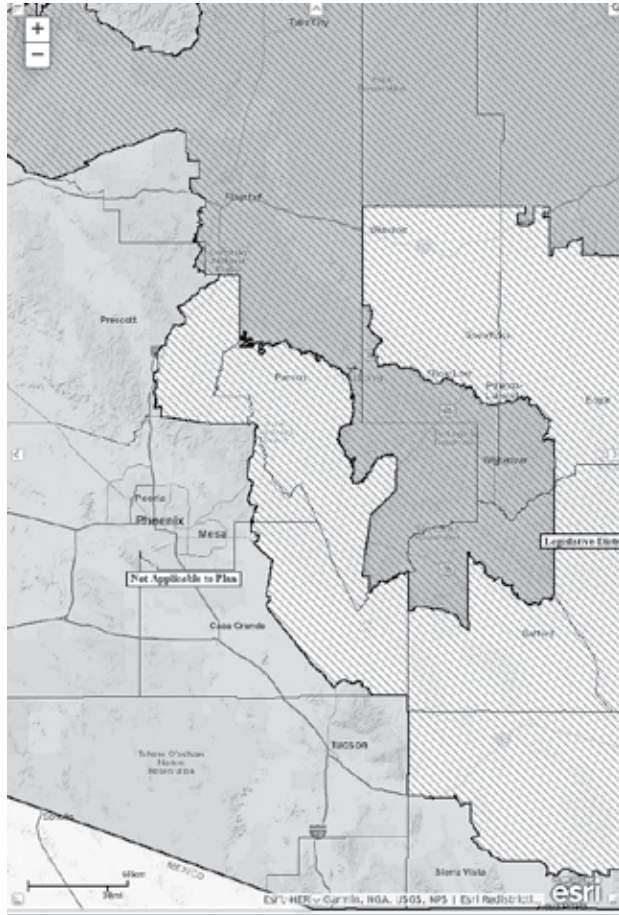

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF SUPERIOR, ARIZONA, URGING THE ARIZONA INDEPENDENT REDISTRICTING COMMISSION TO KEEP RURAL ARIZONA TOGETHER BY CONSIDERING AND ADOPTING THE PROPOSED BASE CONCEPT DISTRICT MAPS AS PROVIDED. WHEREAS, Constitution of the United States of America orders a national census to be performed once every ten years to re-enumerate and reapportion the population of each respective state; and WHEREAS, the Arizona Independent Redistricting Commission is charged with the work of determining said reapportionment for congressional and legislative representation within the State of Arizona, and WHEREAS, the Arizona Constitution requires the commission to draw new district boundaries in a grid-like pattern across the state, compact, contiguous, and "shall respect community interest", to the extent practicable, and to create politically competitive districts where doing so "would create no significant detriment to the other goals", and WHEREAS, this charge not ignoring, it is in the interest of the Five Eastern Rural Counties of Graham, Greenlee, Gila, Southern Navajo and Apache, and adjacent communities of the Copper Corridor and Verde Valley, to remain united in political representation; and those interests being fundamentally different in nature, economically, culturally, historically, and in policy concerns, than that of metropolitan regions and counties; THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, We do join the other citizens and governments of the 5+ Eastern Counties in urging the Commission to establish the Legislative representation of this region solely rural and undivided. We do endorse and offer the attached base concept district proposals for the 5+ Eastern Counties rural legislative district for consideration and adoption by the commission. B) The five Eastern Counties, along with the greater part of the Copper Corridor and Verde Valley, supplementing with northern Cochise, but connecting the San Carlos and White Mountain Apache nations with that of the Navajo and Hopi Nations via a strip of uninhabited territory of North Eastern Gila County and South Western Navajo County.
