

William (Bill) Glover Gaston was born on July 29, 1946, to Robert Russel Gaston and Marjorie Jean Glover in Dayton, Ohio. Over the



He served the community as a Little League umpire and was an active member of the Moose and Elks lodges. He was an avid golfer and bowler; and enjoyed playing darts. For many years, Bill was involved in the American Mountain Men where he attended rendezvous and shot black powder muzzleloaders. He was a member of the Copper Basin Sportsman Club and shot competitive pistol.

Bill is survived by his children, Michelle (Mark) Peterson, Adam Gaston and Seth (Jessica) Gaston; grandchildren, Walker, Riley, Wyatt, Huntley, Jesse, Ethan, Ayla and Ellee; siblings, Pam (Ed) Ballard, Chris (Mike) Posey, Rob Gaston, and Julie (Ray) Roberson; and numerous nieces and nephews. Caroline Evann Giroux



Caroline Evann (Lederhaus) Giroux, age 97, of Burkburnett TX, passed away on Nov. 23, 2022.

Caroline was born July 28, 1925, in Brooklyn, NY,

to John Henry Lederhaus and Charlotte (Marquardt) Lederhaus. She attended public school in Brooklyn, graduating from Halsey Junior High School in June 1939, and from Bushwick High School in June 1942. At Bushwick High School she played on the Girls Basketball Team and was active in the following clubs: Atlas, Broadcasters, Girls Athletic Association, Latin, Writers, and Fine Arts. In her senior year she was elected G.O. (student body) Secretary. After graduating high school, she worked for Bankers Trust on Wall Street.

In 1942, Caroline met US Army 2LT Robert Giroux of Prescott, Arizona through family mining business connections while he was transiting New York for WWII combat duty. They married in September 1945 in New York City; then made their home in Arizona. They had three children: Frank (Kearny AZ), Lance (Kelseyville CA) and Charlotte (Burkburnett TX, now deceased).

Between 1945 until 1970, the family lived in Prescott, Tucson, Kingman, Ray and Kearny. In November 1970, Caroline moved to Phoenix and enrolled in courses conducted by the College of Business Administration at Arizona State University. Stewart Title & Trust of Phoenix, Inc. hired her in 1981. She worked in their Account Servicing Department until retiring in 1991.

In 2014 she moved with her daughter to Burkburnett, TX.

Caroline loved and cared deeply for her family and the people in her community. At Ray-Sonora and Kearny, she was a parishioner and served with ladies' auxiliary at St. Helen's Catholic Church and at the Infant Jesus of Prague when the community moved to Kearny. She was active with Ray School District's Parent Teacher Association and served as president. She also served as a volunteer at the hospital owned by Kennecott Copper Corporation, and with Boy and Girl Scout units at Ray-Sonora and Kearny. In Phoenix, she held offices in her homeowners' association, including as president and secretary.

Caroline's passions were art and music. She began her studies as a young girl and continued through school and her adult life, and into retirement. She was accomplished at sketch, oil, chalk and sculpture. She loved to dance, play piano and sing. After moving to Phoenix, she joined, performed and competed with the Sweet Adelines, a worldwide choral organization of women who sing four-part harmony.

Preceded in death by her father, mother, husband, daughter and one grandson, Caroline is survived by two sons, eight grandchildren, 17 great-grandchildren, and one great-great-grandson.

Caroline was interred at 10 a.m., Dec. 26, 2022, at Sunland Memorial Park, Sun City, Arizona. Her family plans a spring 2023 memorial "Celebration of Life" at Sunland Memorial Park, date to be determined. Ray teams post wins over ASDB, losses to Superior

The Ray basketball teams played two away games last week.

On Dec. 19, the Bearcats and Lady 'Cats traveled to the Arizona School

for the Deaf and Blind to take on the Sentinels. The Lady 'Cats had a high-scoring game, ending with a 62-4 final score. The boys team also closed out the night with a win, racking up 65 points over the Sentinels' 31 points.

The following day, the teams traveled to Superior to take on the Panthers. The Lady 'Cats received their first loss after three consecutive wins, when the Lady Panthers posted 40 points while the girls only scored 27. The Bearcats put up a tough fight

on the court, but lost by 2 points in the end. The final score of the game was 42-44.

Both teams are scheduled to compete in the Epic Tournaments New Year Classic starting Dec. 28 in Chandler.

Crash claims life of Copper Corridor woman

An Oracle woman was killed in an early morning accident earlier this month.

According to Bart Graves, Public Information Officer for the Arizona Department of Public Safety, on Dec. 13, 2022, at approximately 6:01 a.m., a vehicle

driven by Joan Page of Oracle attempted to cross State Route 77 at Triangle Ranch Road (milepost 100.8). The vehicle failed to yield to another vehicle traveling southbound on SR 77 and the second vehicle collided with the driver's side

of Page's vehicle. Page was pronounced deceased at the scene.

Graves said the driver of the other vehicle refused medical treatment, adding, "Impairment is not suspected."

This was the second fatal accident within

eight days, keeping investigators busy. The first accident occurred Dec. 5 at approximately 8 p.m. at milepost 106.5 north of Oracle.

The victim in the Dec. 5 accident has not yet been identified, Graves said.


