Local Artist Returns Home: Javier Gomez, Tzu Tattoo

uperior has always had a unique role in developing artists, welcoming them into the community and despite lacking actual art courses in the public schools, many students are still inspired to grow their artistic talents. Blank walls on buildings have become a canvas and art now pops up in a variety of places.

For Javier Gomez, his journey as an artist started when he was invited to help develop a mural in downtown Superior when he was in high school. He and several of his schoolmates worked on the mural that is on the Senior Center wall in the alley by the Food Court Park. The mural was funded through a grant program; local artist Gloria Arvizu helped to lead the program and saw that Javier had the talent to be part of this larger project. He will tell you it was in that moment that he was told he was an artist and he realized that he could use his talents for a profession. In that program, he learned about different artists, their techniques and the impact of their art on society. He would keep honing his talents. He graduated from Superior High School in 2001.

Javier continued to develop his talents after high school. He joined the Coast Guard and served proudly for six years. During his time in the Coast Guard, he was encouraged to continue his art, but this time he was encouraged to use his skills for tattoo art. It started with some of his shipmates asking for tattoos and eventually he was asked by one of his superiors, Chief Warrant Officer Apple G. Pryor to design a tattoo for her. This tattoo would inspire him to keep working, developing his skills and continue to let his faith guide his life. She wanted something meaningful to keep her inspired and to show her faith; she was the first African American Female Chief Warrant Officer.

This tattoo would be something special. Her story and why she wanted this tattoo came after the Captain of their ship asked her to remove her cross necklace. When she refused his request, the Captain forcefully removed the necklace. In that moment, Pryor knew that she wanted something permanent that showed her faith, something that would always be with her, something no one could rip off or take away from her. In a moment of stillness in her faith, she knew that she was going to ask Javier to make her the tattoo. She asked him to pray on it and let God lead him to the design. For Javier, this task would lead him into the profession of tattoo artistry and also business ownership.

Chief Warrant Officer Pryor continues to be a mentor and friend to Javier and made the visit to his new tattoo shop TZU Tattoo in Superior for another design.

The name of TZU Tattoo, comes from the Mayan word for hummingbird.

"I started studying hummingbirds after seeing them in many meditations," said Javier. In his study of the hummingbird he learned that they were fierce birds even though they were tiny; they reminded him of the spirit of Superior.

Those days in high school that inspired Javier to

become an artist in turn inspired him to return home to Superior and open a shop. He wanted to give back to his community and has many ideas that he is working on to incorporate youth and other art aspects into his business. The store also offers some retail items such as T-shirts, hats and other merchandise in case a tattoo isn't in your plans.
