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## Oracle Brush Dump is open again for residents of Oracle

The Oracle Brush Dump is open. The hours of operation are 7 a.m. through 5 p.m., seven days a week.

As the name implies, this site is for brush only. No trash, construction materials, hazardous materials, dirt, gravel, or any non-brush related materials are accepted. This includes green cactus, because it does not burn well; as well as large tree stumps, which seldom burn all the way.

Fire Chief Robert Jennings stated, "Yes, it did take a long time, but alas, we are not in charge of Mother Nature, who has not blessed us with much moisture this last year. That said, our crews worked very hard to burn the huge piles of brush (and other stuff) and it is now clean and ready to accept brush only."

Materials which do not burn or, at least not well, which are left at such facilities become unexpected burdens, costing more time and money to haul away. Remember, the Oracle Brush Dump is a resource for the whole community, to make it safer for everyone, as well as less unkempt and a place of which to be proud. Such services can only last as long as they are used wisely for the intended purpose. Please help us continue to offer this convenience.

Chief Jennings stated, "Those who dump these unacceptable items are jeopardizing the program as burning these materials are strictly prohibited in our burn permit. We do not have the resources to monitor everything dumped by every person. Please, if you see someone dumping such items, either remove the items yourself or report back to us at the fire station what was dumped, the description of the vehicle and a license plate number, if possible, so that we can ban these offenders."

Chief Jennings also stated, "Thank you for your patience during this last year. We look forward to serving this great community of Oracle, which now includes the area of Campo Bonito, which was recently annexed into the Oracle Fire District, and wish all of you a happy, prosperous, and above all, healthy, new year!"

An alternative to the brush dump, for trash and other materials, is the Waste Management (WM) transfer station in

# Resolution Copper completes \$75 million restoration of historic mining land

## 15-year project cleans up 475 acres of land impacted by historical mining of Magma Copper Company

Resolution Copper has completed a \$75 million restoration and reclamation project of 475 acres of land impacted by close to a century of historic impacts from the Magma Copper Mine near the Town of Superior.

Resolution Copper voluntarily committed to accelerate the reclamation work to demonstrate its commitment to cleaning up the historic mining impacts well in advance of any new mine development activities.

Resolution Copper Project Director Andrew Lye said, "We're proud to deliver this significant piece of environmental remediation work decades earlier than required, to make our community a cleaner and safer place to live and work. Cleaning up the historic Magma Copper Mine ahead of time demonstrates our commitment to operating safely and responsibly, in a way that brings lasting benefits to the entire community. This work was completed by local contractors and ongoing post closure monitoring and maintenance activities will continue to provide local jobs as an important part of our business."

In total, the reclamation project has supported more than two dozen local jobs with businesses such as Oddonetto Construction, based in Globe, Arizona.

Oddonetto Construction owner Mike Oddonetto said, "Resolution Copper has been an important source of business for my firm for more than a decade, and I look forward to continuing to work with the company to grow our business."

The Magma Copper Company ran mining and processing operations between 1910 and 1996, including smelting operations on the site between 1924 until 1971. Since 2005, reclamation work by Resolution Copper has included more than a decade of soil clean-up, placing a cover with soil and vegetation over the historic tailings, restoring and establishing drainage for passage of stormwater, reshaping and vegetating development rock piles, removing the old concentrator complex and smelter structures. Reclamation and restoration have included shaping landforms to a more natural state and vegetating with a native seed mix characteristic of the surrounding Sonoran Desert landscape.

Recently, the completed restoration and reclamation was approved by the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ). As required, Resolution will continue post-closure monitoring for the next three decades, including groundwater monitoring, surface water monitoring, regular inspection of all facilities and

monitoring of the vegetative cover.

Resolution Copper also recently completed a \$200 million project to deepen the Magma Copper Mine Shaft # 9, that was originally constructed in 1971. Over the last four years, the shaft has been sunk a further 2,000 feet to over 6,800 feet below the surface. It now connects to the newer Shaft 10 in two places, improves ventilation, and increases safety by providing a second exit for workers.

Resolution will now focus on the maintenance of Shaft 9 and 10 and continuing the underground characterization study to increase ore-body knowledge, as the project continues to progress through a multi-year federal, state and county permitting process. After the permitting process, a detailed feasibility study will be completed over several years to inform investment

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# Arizona State Prison and the Hollywood, TV Connections

Copper Area News has received some articles from a former corrections officer from Arizona State Prison. This retired officer spent 25 years with the Arizona Department of Corrections working all custody levels from juvenile detention units to Death Row. The author wishes to

remain anonymous. He hopes to provide the readers with a view of what it is like working with inmates and what life is like behind prison walls.

## INTRODUCTION

The job of a corrections officer is not easy. The nature of the job, working with men or women behind bars can

be stressful. Working in high custody units can add to the stress. The Arizona Department of Corrections has a high staff turnover rate. One in five staff members quit within the first couple of years of being hired or use the training and experience they receive to transfer to Sheriff departments or

Federal corrections.

Maximum custody inmates are either there because they are doing long sentences, are convicted of violent crimes or they are problem inmates while in prison. Inmates on Death Row are under a sentence of death and have nothing to lose by acting out against

staff or other inmates. Officers must always be on the alert to prevent these inmates from harming other inmates or staff. To understand the type of inmates that are housed on Death Row, I will provide you with a few of their stories, the crimes they committed and some of their prison life.



## BEHIND THE WALLS

Stories from Arizona State Prison

Hollywood and the entertainment industry have always been fascinated with crime, prisons and law enforcement. Just look at the number of crime dramas on television and the popularity of movies like the *Dirty Harry* series starring Clint Eastwood, *Shawshank Redemption*, *The Green Mile* and television shows like *CSI* and *Law and Order*. The television series *Law and Order, Special Victims Unit*

has a connection to Arizona State Prison in Florence. That connection is actor/comedian Richard Belzer.

Richard Belzer played the part of Detective John Munch on *Homicide: Life on the Streets* and *Law and Order: Special Victims Unit*. The character of John Munch is the longest running character on a prime time television drama, 22 consecutive seasons. In 1983, Richard Belzer along with comedian/actor Paul Rodriguez and a group of new comedians performed for staff and inmates at Central Unit, Arizona State Prison – Florence.

Paul Rodriguez has appeared in numerous movies and television shows including *Born in East L.A.*, Clint Eastwood's *Bloodwork*, *Resurrection Boulevard* and *American Family*. He also produced and starred in the comedy concert film *The Original Latin Kings of Comedy*. The performance by Richard Belzer and Paul Rodriguez is available on video. The name of the production is *Belzer Behind Bars*. Warden Bob Goldsmith and Major Don Herndon of the Department of Corrections had parts in the film as well as some other staff and inmates.

Below is a list of movies that had scenes filmed at the Arizona State Prison – Florence Complex in Florence, Arizona:

**LIFE IN A WESTERN PENITENTIARY – 1914:** A documentary film about prison life in the west. The film was shown in theaters around the country. Trivia: This movie was shown at the prison. Some of the townspeople were invited and watched the movie with the inmates.

**THE HONOR SYSTEM – 1917:** Silent drama that was the first socially conscious film that made a plea for prison reform. Plot: The story of an innocent man convicted of murder and his grim experiences in a prison run by three corrupt administrators. It attacked the mistreatment of inmates and included a dramatic

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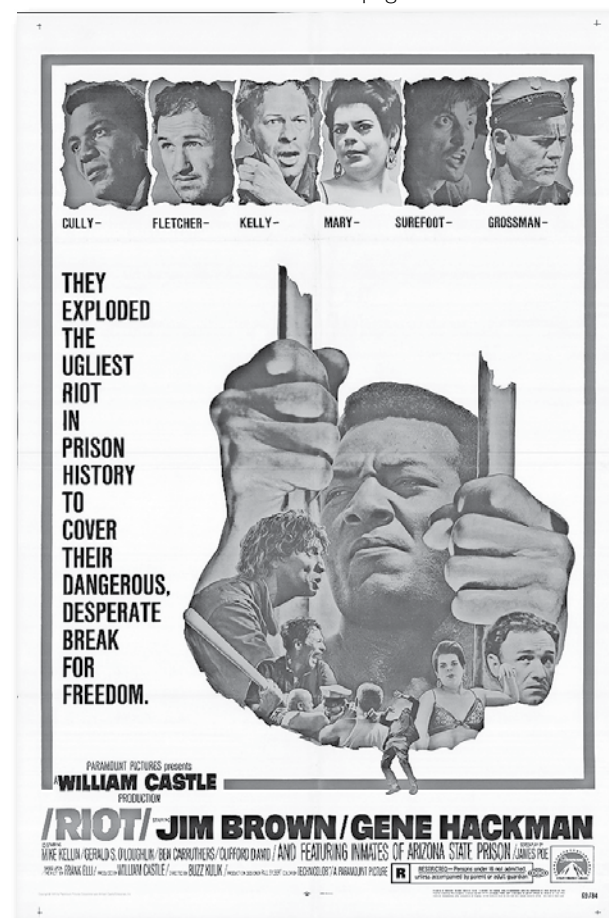

prison break scene. Trivia: Director, Raoul Walsh and actor, Jack Pickford (brother of silent film movie star Mary Pickford) actually stayed in the prison among inmates for a few days to get a feel for the atmosphere. Raoul Walsh is the man given credit for discovering John Wayne.

**THREE SEVENS – 1921:** Plot: Daniel Craig, an innocent man is convicted of manslaughter. The prisoners plan to take over the prison due to mistreatment by the Warden. A few escape. A new Warden arrives and promises Daniel justice if he gets the escapees to return. Daniel gets them to come back to prison and finds out the real murderer of Daniel's alleged victim was the long lost son of the previous corrupt Warden. He also finds romance with the new Warden's daughter. Trivia: Antonio Moreno starred in the movie. He was well known as a "Latin Lover" during the silent movie era. If you grew up in the 1950s and 60s, he is best known for his part as the scientist Dr. Carl Maia who discovers "The Creature from the Black Lagoon". He also played Emilio Figueroa in the classic John Wayne western, "The Searchers."

**THE WAY TO THE GOLD – 1957:** Plot: Jeffrey Hunter plays the part of a paroled inmate. While in prison, an old convict tells him about \$250,000 that was buried in northern Arizona. He searches for the money and is followed by other criminals interested in the big payoff. Trivia: Jeffrey Hunter's part was originally offered to Elvis Presley but Elvis' manager wanted 50% of the movie profits and \$250,000 to sign. Can

you imagine, "Jail House Rock" at Arizona State Prison. The staff and inmates would have been "All Shook Up." The actual Warden of Arizona State Prison, Frank Eyman, played the part of the Warden. Jeffrey Hunter co-starred with John Wayne in the Searchers.

**RIOT – 1968:** This prison movie starred NFL Hall of Famer, Jim Brown and two time Academy Award winner Gene Hackman. Plot: Inmates start a riot to divert the prison staff from an escape plot. Trivia: Riot was the first motion picture to be filmed entirely in an active prison. 56 inmates appeared in the movie along with Warden, Frank Eyman and a few staff members.

**RUN SIMON RUN – 1970:** This movie was also known as "The Tradition of Simon Zuniga". Plot: Burt Reynolds plays a Papago Indian who returns to his people after serving a long time for a crime he did not commit. To clear himself from the murder of his brother, he begins a long and bloody search for the killer. Trivia: This is the last film actress Inger Stevens (TV series "The Farmer's Daughter") appeared in before her tragic suicide.

**STIR CRAZY – 1980:** Plot: Gene Wilder and Richard Pryor are

two men framed for a bank robbery and sentenced to prison. They use a prison rodeo to escape and clear their names. Trivia: The Arizona State Prison Complex in Florence used the money they made from the film to build their own rodeo grounds.

**RAISING ARIZONA – 1987:** Plot: Nicolas Cage is a petty criminal married to a police officer, played by Holly Hunter. They kidnap a rich man's baby and are pursued by a bounty hunter and the law. The opening scene of a prison escape was filmed at Florence Prison. Trivia: This Coen brother's movie had a character named Florence Arizona. She was the mother of the kidnapped baby.

**WILD SEVEN – 2006:** The opening scene is filmed at the entrance to the prison in Florence. One of Florence's Correctional Officers, Jose Carrion had a small role in the movie. Plot: Robert Forster (Jackie Brown) and Richard Roundtree (the original "Shaft") star in the film. Forster plays an ex-convict seeking revenge against the man who sent him to prison.

**BELZER BEHIND BARS – 1982:** Comedians Richard Belzer and Paul Rodriguez bring a "gang" of stand-up comedians to perform at Central Unit for the inmates and staff.

*Copper Area News* is committed to providing our readers with as much information as possible. This graph shows the positive cases as of press time on Jan. 12, 2021. We have also included a graph showing the daily counts for the past week. Daily statewide case counts are recording higher than they were during the last peak this Summer and hospitals are becoming overwhelmed by COVID-19 patients.

There are a few points we would like our readers to consider when following this data.

1. This will continue to be a rolling total of positive cases. It does not reflect recoveries or deaths. The Arizona Department of Health Services does not break out this data.
2. If you see a reduction in numbers from day to day it is most likely due to a data entry error or mis-coding of a zip code (at the state level).
3. This is all zip code based data; most of our zip codes include unincorporated areas. There is no way to track exactly which areas each of the positive cases are. Example, Kearny and Winkelman each have small communities in their zip code that are not in the Town's incorporated boundaries.
4. If you live in Gila County, please follow the Gila County Health and Emergency Management, Facebook. They have maintained their data on recoveries and current positive cases.
