# Carlotta Bidegain

Carlotta "Scottie" Bidegain, 88, of Tucson, passed away January 3, peacefully, at home, surrounded by loving friends and family.

Scottie was born November 24, 1926 in Illinois. She and her immediate family moved to the southwest when she was a young girl, and, eventually, settled on a ranch on the San Pedro River near Cacabel. It was there that she met many of her lifelong friends and her future husband, Mike F. Bidegain. After marrying, she and Mike continues to

ranch throughout Arizona. Living in various small towns and ranches over the years, leaving her mark on all of them, Scottie and Mike spent most of their child-raising years in Ray, and, then, later, Kearny. Following her passion for ranching, livestock, and the land Scottie was very involved in 4-H, competitive trail riding, ranching and riding. Scottie returned to the Tucson area to run her parent's ranch in Silverbell and did that for the better part of a decade.

After leaving the ranch in Silverbell, Scottie began her own business in the late 1970's providing trail rides. This is where she turned many clients into friends and lifelong riding partners. Being well known for saddling, hauling and guiding eight-plus horses and riders, Scottie worked tirelessly, providing the true horseman's experience to many and teaching them about the desert she so loved. Even into the late 1990's, she continued to guide

horseback rides and then scaled down to being a one horse woman until her physical limitations and surgeries forced her to no longer own a horse. She was, however, always accompanied by her ranching, turned service, dog, Molly. A true companion, loved and respected by all for her service to Scottie, Molly was a comfort and a friend.

Scottie is preceded in death by her parents. She is survived by her brother, Stephen Claflin of NJ; sons, Michael (Sherry) and Philip, daughter Margaret (Dan Riley: loving, supportive companion): 10 grandchildren and 15 great-grandchildren. ## Clear Water Coming Soon

Good news was hinted at last week, and good news it is: the water filtration plant is now up and running. This might not seem like good news at first, for the new movement of water is stirring up some of the sediments remaining in the pipes. The water looks a bit dirty now, but it will clear soon.

"Clean water" has two components, the treatment of water for living organisms and the filtration of water for solids and soluble materials. The chlorination equipment at

the well treats the first, and the filtration plant treats the second.

Now we are getting a needed checkup on the water storage tanks. They are not leaking, but every ten years or so they need to be checked and serviced.

If we need reminding, this Saturday, January 17, begins our Journey for a Clean Kearny. Please be a volunteer! We need people for litter patrol, people with trucks and trailers to haul off trash, and people to help put items on the trailers and in the

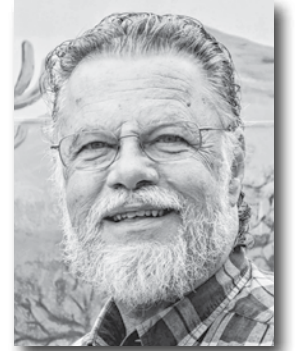
rolloffs.

# Kearny Police Department receives funds for ballistic vests

The Kearny Police Department received a check for close to \$6,000 from the 100 Club of Arizona in which they plan to use to purchase ballistic vests for the officers. Chief of Police Rich Corso and Town Manager Anna Flores were excited and grateful to receive this generous donation that Jim Kirk from the 100 Club presented to them.

The 100 Club of Arizona helps provide immediate financial assistance to families of public safety officers and firefighters who are seriously injured or killed in the line of duty and to provide resources to enhance safety and welfare. Last year the 100 Club earned over three million dollars. The 100 Club is a charitable non profit organization.

Chief Corso said, "We have four full time officers, not including me, four reserves and 24 VIP's who are considered volunteers in police. The VIP's have volunteer uniforms and basically patrol and report to the police department if there is anything suspicious. The dispatch department has three full time employees and two part timers. We are also over our EMS department which includes two full time employees and 13 to 15 part timers."

Anna Flores said, "We are so happy for what you have done to help our police department and our community they wouldn't be able to have their vests without the help of the 100 Club." Jim Kirk of the 100 Club is a retired Tucson Police Officer of 25 years and about a year ago started working with the 100 Club. Kirk said, "I work harder now after being retired, but I enjoy being able to come out and help. The 100 Club does so many different things from scholarships to funding for police equipment and even turnout gear for the fire department."

For the last eight years Kirk was a peer counselor with Tucson Police. He said, "If you have any issues with your police department or any tragedy that strikes a family please give me a call, I would be happy to help out." Kirk added, "A recent event in Tucson, a police officer had died and within 48 hours, we were able to deliver a check to his wife and family for \$5,000 which is huge because of the time it takes for social security, benefits and pensions to get into place. The funds can help bridge the gap and the family can go through the mourning process without worrying about immediate financial needs." Flores said, "These types of things make a difference you are changing people's lives." Anna Flores enjoys the rural community of Kearny and they are planning a clean-up day on Jan. 17 from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. People can put the large trash out and it will be picked up. "From that point on we have a planning committee that will be planning a different block every month in hopes to help keep cleaning up the town," said Flores. "We have Boy Scouts and several other organizations that are volunteering to help with this project."

Many efforts are being made to help make Kearny a clean, safe and comfortable place to live. Thank you to our police, fire, emergency services and the public for doing your part in enriching the lives of others.

- The total household income limit for widows, widowers, and disabled persons with children under age 18 residing with the claimant is \$37,231.

If you are a new applicant you must apply in person at the Assessor's office with Identification.

If you have an exemption amount left over to apply to vehicles we will notify you by mail or email if possible to reduce expenses.
