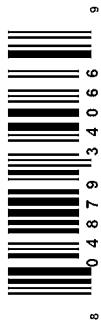



Support Local: Legends of Superior Trails

In April 2020, COVID-19 brought much of Arizona's economy to a screeching halt. All businesses not deemed "essential" were ordered closed by Arizona's governor Doug Ducey.

The lockdown continued for nearly two months. When Gov. Ducey finally gave the go ahead to reopen, businesses slowly began the road to recovery. Even those listed as "essential" had a challenge with this economic recovery.

Many small businesses and non-profits in Arizona didn't survive the lockdown. The businesses that did survive are hanging on as best they can. *Copper Area News* wanted to give something back to the local business community as a thank you for supporting us through these troubled times. Our newspapers (*Copper Basin News*, *Superior Sun* and *San Manuel Miner*) have been featuring local businesses and non-profits since the beginning of 2021, encouraging our readers to Shop at Home, stay local and support our local businesses. To date, *Copper Area News* has featured 130 businesses and groups in the Copper Corridor.

When the pandemic hit the world in early 2020, life changed for everyone. Those who worked in outdoor recreation and managing outdoor spaces, had new challenges, and the pandemic increased activity at these highly sought after venues. For Superior, the parks and trails were in constant demand as people were looking for safe things to do during the early days of the pandemic.

The Legends of Superior Trails Inc. is a local non-profit that was formed in 2015 to initially lead, develop, promote and maintain the main Legends of Superior Trail. The role of the group has expanded to work on trails in the greater Superior area and also promote outdoor recreation in Superior.

The planning for a trail connecting the Arizona National Scenic Trail - Picket Post Trailhead to the town of Superior began in the mid-2000s, when local leaders began planning for economic diversification. With the help of many volunteers at the Arizona Trail Association and local community members, in partnership with the Tonto National Forest, one of the first legs of the trail was constructed connecting the airport in Superior via a trail to the Hewitt Station Trailhead along the Arizona Trail. This first attempt of trail connection was a success but was quickly challenged when the Arizona

Department of Transportation expanded the US 60 highway from two lanes to four lanes. The leadership of LOST and the Tonto National Forest worked with ADOT to mitigate the loss of their first trail alignment, the segment was reconstructed to connect hikers to the Picket Post Trailhead of the Arizona Trail through Arnett Canyon and over to Pinal City and, when first constructed, ended near the airport in Superior.

While the leaders were busy working on this project, in partnership with the Town of Superior the group worked with Resolution Copper to develop an access agreement to allow for the old US 60: Miami-Superior highway to the tunnel be used as a trail for hiking, mountain biking and equestrian use. This trail had historically been used, but mine ownership had limited access. The Queen Creek Canyon segment of the LOST is currently one of the most used trails by both locals and visitors. It is not uncommon to see many hiking groups using the trail and learning more about the area on the interpretive signs along the trail.

In early 2020 the Town of Superior worked with BHP to attain an easement which allowed the Town and LOST to build additional segments of trail that connects the other segments to the walk over bridge onto Main Street near Porters. The trails were completed in the Spring of 2020, but the pandemic cancelled the grand opening celebrations for the new segments which are called the Miners & Ranchers and Panther to Pinal segments. Both of these segments are accessed off of Panther Drive.

In total, the Legends of Superior Trail is 12 miles long. On this trail you can traverse three riparian areas and an urban trail along Main Street. Many use the LOST trail to avoid walking across the US 60.

The LOST board is looking forward to collaborating with the Tonto National Forest this year to expand their roles, helping to maintain trails throughout the area and to begin the planning work facilitated through the Forest Service on the Superior Tourism and Recreation Team (START). The START plan will help to further identify where trail heads and other recreation amenities should be placed and ensure forest management is in place to accommodate the increase in visitors expected to the area.

The LOST raises funds through corporate

sponsorships, donations and their signature fundraisers "Hashbrowns, History and Hiking". You can learn more about the the LOST, their board

members and all of their activities online at www.superioraztrails.com. Their 2022 Hashbrowns, History and Hiking series will begin in February.

Hashbrowns, History and Hiking events return to Superior's LOST

The Legends of Superior Trails Inc., a 501(c)3 non-profit based in Superior, will be hosting its signature fundraiser, Hashbrowns, History and Hiking events in February and March of 2022. These events feature a hearty breakfast, historical presentation and a guided hike on segments of the Legends of Superior Trails. The breakfast and historical presentations will be hosted at the Superior Chamber of Commerce, located at 165 W. Main St. Doors open at 7:30 a.m. and the presentations begin shortly after 8 a.m. Following the presentations guests are taken on a guided hike on the Legends of Superior Trails.

This year the hiking series will feature the following presentations:

• **History of Pinal City - Friday, Feb. 11, 2022:** this event will include a guided hike through the remnants of Pinal City. Learn about how the Silver King Mine and Pinal City were discovered and how quickly Pinal City, a town of great economic promise, became a legendary ghost town. RSVP: <https://conta.cc/3Inhlon>

• **Mining History of Superior – Saturday, Feb. 19, 2022:** this presentation is sponsored by Resolution Copper Mining and will feature a presentation by historians and cultural engineers from Westland Resources on the history of Mining in Superior. The guided hike on the Queen Creek Canyon segment of the LOST will show guests where historic mining operations once operated and explain the mine workings of the past in the area. • **History of US 60: Miami-Superior Highway - Friday, March 5, 2022:** The Queen Creek Canyon segment of the LOST trail was once home to the Miami-Superior highway, a highway that was one of the first million-dollar highways built in America. Join local historian and retired ADOT engineer Rick Powers for a presentation on the history of the highway and how the highway changed the economic opportunities for the communities of Miami and Superior. The highway will celebrate its 100th anniversary in April of 2022. RSVP: <https://conta.cc/3dQqu3g>

• **Geological History of Queen Creek Canyon - Saturday, March 19, 2022:** Learn about how the geological formations of Picket Post and Apache Leap Mountains were formed and learn about the geological history of the area with Arizona State University Professor Steve Semken.
