Fire Safety in the New Year

Happy 2021! I am not a big believer in New Year's resolution as more than 80% of them fail. However, I am a strong proponent of setting measurable and attainable goals. As you list out your goals for the New Year, don't forget about adding home safety goals to your list.

According to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), 75 percent of all fire deaths and 73 percent of all fire injuries were caused by home fire incidents in 2019. A fire in a residential dwelling occurred every 93 seconds."

Here are some fire safety tips to help you set fire safety goals for your house:

- Make sure your home is protected by working smoke and carbon monoxide detectors. Half of all home fire deaths happen at night, when people are sleeping.
- Test your detectors once a month, and replace your smoke alarms when they're 10 years old. If you need help

testing your detectors, please call the fire station. 520-465-5300

- Cooking is one of the main causes of home fires and home fire injuries. Make safety your first ingredient; stay in the kitchen when you are cooking at high temperatures. Fires can start when the heat gets too high or the stove is unattended. If you see any smoke or turn the burner off. If the grease catches fire, turn the burner off. **DO NOT PUT WATER ON THE FIRE.** Call 911 and get everyone out of the house

- Use candles with care. Unattended candles are an obvious fire danger. When you leave a room, blow out the candle. Or consider using flameless candles.
- If you have children living in your home or visiting, look for fire and burn dangers from their point of view. Never leave lighters or matches where children can reach them.
- Practice fire drills at home. Select a meeting place. Discuss what to do about windows. And instill in children never to hide when there is a fire.

Shop at Home: Giorsetti's Superior Grocery

In April, COVID-19 brought much of Arizona's economy to a screeching halt. All businesses not deemed "essential" were ordered closed by Arizona's governor Doug Ducey.

The lockdown continued for nearly two months. When Gov. Ducey finally gave the go ahead to reopen, businesses slowly began the road to recovery. Even those listed as "essential" had a challenge with this

economic recovery.

Many small businesses in Arizona didn't survive the lockdown. The businesses that did survive are hanging on as best they can. *Copper Area News* wanted to give something back to the local business community. Over the next several weeks, our newspapers (*Copper Basin News*, *Superior Sun* and *San Manuel Miner*) will be featuring local businesses and non-profits, encouraging our readers to Shop at Home, stay local and support our local businesses.

In Winkelman, Giorsetti's Superior Grocery has been serving customers for more than 100 years. Owned by the third generation of Giorsettis, it is probably the oldest business in the Copper Basin area owned by the same family.

Giorsetti's is one of the few stores in the area that offers a butcher meat counter. They also have some hard-to-find items like corn brooms. The store offers groceries, fresh meats, produce and general merchandise.

The store is run by Jeff and William Giorsetti and is open Monday through Saturday from 7:30 a.m. to 6 p.m. It is located at 307 Giffin Ave. near the Winkelman Post Office and the phone number is 520-356-7221.

R9-25-901(9)(a)-(c) and (49)(a) and R9-25-902(C), jointly requested the transfer of 100% of the controlling interests in the Proposed Transferee's ground ambulance company and Certificate of Necessity ("C.O.N.") No. 23 to Proposed Transferee. Proposed Transferee states the reason for the application to transfer as follows: "Due to financial exigencies, the Town of Kearny indicated its intention to discontinue operations of the Town of Kearny Ambulance Service as of December 31, 2020". "CVRMC has the financial stability to bear the burden of operating a remote rural ambulance service. Therefore, CVRMC's Board has authorized the hospital to assume ownership and control over the Town of Kearny Ambulance Service, subject to a Transfer Agreement that is in the process of being negotiated. The anticipated date of transfer is December 31, 2020 at midnight." The Application is a transfer of the existing C.O.N. No. 23 to Cobre Valley Regional Medical Center. The Application provides: "There will be no change in geographic scope of the C.O.N. There will be no change to the response times specified in the C.O.N. There will be no change in the rates currently in effect. The dispatch center and operating base will remain in Kearny. Personnel will remain the same. Equipment will remain the same."
