Superior's Chief of Police to serve on AZ Auto Theft Authority Board of Directors

The Superior Police Department and Arizona Automobile Theft Authority (AATA) are pleased to announce the newest appointment to the AATA Board of Directors, Chief Frank Alanis. In January, Chief Alanis was appointed by the Arizona Association of Chiefs of Police (AACOP), representing one of two Chief positions on the AATA's 12-member Board. Members serve four-

year terms and help support the AATA's mission and initiatives to combat and prevent auto crimes in Arizona.

Chief Alanis stated that joining the Arizona Auto Theft Authority as a member of the Board of Directors is an honor.

"This is a giant leap in moving the Superior Police Department forward. It puts the Town and Department on the map and shows that the size of the department is not a factor. I want nothing more than for the citizens of this great town to be proud of their police department and know that we are trying our hardest to be the best department in Arizona. Positions like these are examples of what we're capable," Alanis said.

The Arizona Automobile Theft Authority's mission is to prevent and combat auto theft through a statewide cooperative effort by supporting law enforcement, vertical prosecution, and prevention programs across Arizona.

The AATA functions as the lead agency in a statewide network of law enforcement, criminal justice, and crime prevention partners working together to combat auto theft crimes across Arizona. By focusing resources in these areas, the AATA and its statewide partners are impacting the state's auto theft rate.

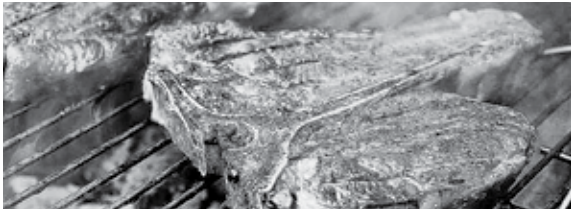

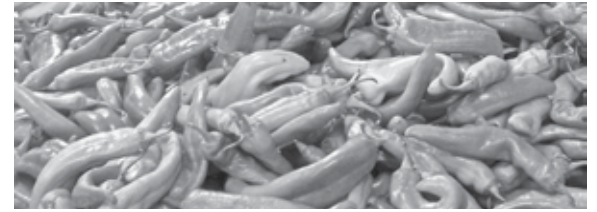

Panthers send trio out with a win on Senior Night

Superior boys' basketball seniors Gabriel Castillo, Sammy Lopez and Julian Navarro were honored in the final home game of their high school careers last Friday night and the trio went out with a 58 – 54 win against visiting Cibecue/Dischii Biko.

"The seniors went out with a win in their last game of high school basketball," Superior head coach Ryan Palmer said afterwards. "All three seniors scored in the game. [That's a] pretty good way to go out."

Currently ranked No. 22 combined with a fifth-place finish in the region standings leaves the Panthers on the outside looking in at the postseason.

"We defeated one of the top teams in our region in Cibecue," Palmer said. "It was a frustrating year. We never seemed to be able to stay healthy or put together four solid quarters.

"There is no doubt in my mind that we are a top-15 team in 1A, however, our record says different. Games like Friday (are proof that) we have improved a lot but, unfortunately, we will not get a chance to make a playoff run."

Winning teaches a lot – dedication, commitment and teamwork to name a few – but there is a lot to be learned in defeat, too. The Panthers will have time to reflect on some of those unexpected and disappointing experiences, make the necessary changes, and challenge themselves to meet the expectations many have of their team.

"Success in basketball, like every other sport, comes down to executing fundamentals," Palmer said. "If you want to win, you have to put in the time on the basics of the game. Fundamentals are the foundation that all other aspects of the sport are built off. Without a solid foundation, the building can't get too high off the ground.

"We failed to reach our season goals," Palmer added. "Failure can be a great motivator with the right attitude. When you fail, you can make excuses and pass blame, or you can accept responsibility, learn, and grow. We have a talented team coming back next year. With the right attitude and work ethic, the future is bright."

Rebolting the Pond, making climbing safer in Superior

It's a scientific fact: metal objects will start to rust if left out in the elements for any length of time. Rusty metal can fail. But when you depend on little metal objects to protect your life, it's a good idea to make sure they are not rusty.

The Central Arizona Bolt Replacement Program (CABRP) is a charity organization whose purpose is to inspect and replace fixed climbing bolts in the Superior area to keep the climbing routes safe for climbers.

The Pond, which is above US Hwy. 60 heading east out of Superior, has been the main focus for the bolt project. The area is marked by the large waterfall on the west side of the highway and climbers have been visiting this area since the 1970s. Many of the climbing routes in The Pond have 20+ year old bolts that are rusted and worn through.

The Pond has 84 total sport routes and is the closest local sport area to the Phoenix valley. Most of the routes were bolted top down with a handful bolted on lead. There are no traditional routes in the Pond.

Most of these routes were developed in the mid 1990's with plated steel wedge and 5-piece bolts that are not going to hold up to the increased traffic on these routes. Most of the anchors are either chains or cold shunts, while some of the hangers are the old SMC hangers. There are currently no glue-in bolts in this area and everything that the group has previously removed in the areas surrounding the Pond have been rusty and worn-out.

"We have found very loose bolts and anchors within the last 2 years, and therefore, we believe the entire area needs to be replaced as soon as possible and before the increased traffic that will arrive in the near future now that climbing is an Olympic sport," the group said on its Facebook post.

This project will entail the removal of 170 anchor bolts, which will be replaced with new glue-in bolts, quick links, and mussy hooks. They will also remove 550 route bolts and hangers, and replace them with Stainless Steel glue-in wave bolts.

Bolt replacement will be a CABRP controlled project with the opportunity to teach the general public correct bolt placement and bolt extraction for free. Volunteer training will be provided during this entire project as this particular project will be conducted 100% by volunteer workers. This project will be a bolt-for-bolt replacement project and they expect to maintain an 80% rate for one-to-one extraction and replacement.

"We always use the same bolt hole whenever possible. Some conditions exist where it is not possible to use the same hole. In these cases, we will relocate the new bolt and hole as close as we safely can to the existing bolt and patch/camo the old hole."

This weekend the group was again at the Pond replacing bolts. Superior Mayor Mila Besich, Town Manager Todd Pryor and Americorps volunteer Tyler were invited for a tour of the project. The Mayor and Manager chose to stay below where the group was working, but Tyler climbed up and assisted with gluing in four brand new bolts onto a shorter 50 foot route.

Not every route requires replacement. So far CABRP has inspected 16 routes and replaced bolts on 12. This project will be ongoing through the fall of 2020. CABRP is also replacing bolts in the Atlantis and Lower Devil's canyon areas near Superior.

Hyperbaric oxygen therapy involves breathing pure oxygen in a pressurized room or tube. Hyperbaric oxygen therapy is a well-established treatment for decompression sickness, a hazard of scuba diving. Other conditions treated with hyperbaric oxygen therapy include serious infections, bubbles of air in your blood vessels, and wounds that won't heal.



In a hyperbaric oxygen therapy chamber, the air pressure is increased to three times higher than normal air pressure. Under these conditions, your lungs can gather more oxygen than would be possible breathing pure oxygen at normal air pressure.

Your blood carries this oxygen throughout your body. This helps fight bacteria and stimulate the

release of substances called growth factors and stem cells, which promote healing.

Conditions for Treatment

Hyperbaric oxygen therapy is used to treat several medical conditions. And medical institutions use it in different ways. Your doctor may suggest hyperbaric oxygen therapy if you have one of the following conditions:

- Anemia, severe
- Brain abscess
- Bubbles of air in your blood vessels (arterial gas embolism)
- Burn
- Decompression sickness
- Carbon monoxide poisoning
- Crushing injury
- Deafness, sudden
