On December 15, 2022, AWC filed a Rate Application for its Eastern Group which consists of the Southeastern Region (Apache Junction, Superior, Miami, Bisbee, Sierra Vista, and Winkelman water systems) and Falcon Valley (Falcon Valley, Oracle, Saddlebrooke Ranch, and San Manuel water systems).

The Company asserts that for the test year ending June 30, 2022 ("TY"), AWC had adjusted operating income of approximately \$3 million and an original cost rate base ("OCRB") of \$117.9 million and fair value rate base ("FVRB") of \$171.2 million resulting in a rate of return of 2.55 percent on OCRB. AWC's proposed rates and charges that would produce an overall revenue increase of \$9.7 million or approximately 32 percent, to produce an 8.21 percent rate of return on the Company's OCRB or a 5.97 percent rate of return on its FVRB. The Company requests that its new rates take effect no later than January 15, 2024.

In addition, AWC proposes further consolidation of rates within its Southeastern Region and Falcon Valley service areas. The Company also requests to continue its approved Central Arizona Project surcharge as well as its Purchased Power Adjustor Mechanism.

The Company requests to expand the applicability of its Arsenic Cost Recovery Mechanism ("ACRM") to address compliance with federal regulation of "forever chemicals" and to then rename the ACRM the Federal Compliance Cost Recovery Mechanism ("FCCRM"). AWC estimates that FCCRM investments will total approximately \$43 million. AWC also proposes to continue its System Improvement Benefits ("SIB") surcharge mechanism to recover a return on and of net investments made between rate cases for water main and water service connection replacements, and to be administered consistent with the currently approved SIB mechanism for the Eastern Group.

AWC requests the implementation of a new Tax Expense Adjustment Mechanism to allow it to adjust for changes to federal and state income taxes. The Company also proposes to increase the Water Availability Fee charged to developers in Apache Junction, and to implement a new Sustainable Water Acquisition Mechanism to acquire and maintain a sustainable water supply for the Eastern Group water systems. The Company's proposed rates and charges are intended to produce the following revenue increases within each service area:
