

Alice immigrated to the U.S. with her family in 1951. She attended Anoka High School and Bethel College in St. Paul. She married Harvey Lewis, and raised a family in Cedar, Minnesota. Once the children finished school, the empty nesters moved to Arizona. She took her love for the land with her. In Arizona, she amazed her neighbors by gardening in less-than-ideal conditions. Gardening was therapeutic for Alice.

Fleeing the invading Russian military during WWII, Alice survived diphtheria alone while being moved from hospital to hospital during the war, and struggled all

her life with bronchiectasis. Her last bronchial bout was exacerbated by COVID, against which she refused inoculation. Please get vaccinated and mask up to protect vulnerable people like Alice.

## LETTER TO THE EDITOR

### Local School Districts Facing Massive Cuts Due to Expenditure Limit Rule

**W**e have another major hurdle facing public education coming up in just over a month. In 1980, concerned by some of the budget increases other states were pushing through, Arizona legislators developed a cap on public education fund spending. It is called the aggregate expenditure limit (AEL).

For those of you that are familiar with town or city politics, this is very similar to the expenditure limitations placed on towns that must be overridden by voters. For those of you not familiar, it is basically a cap on the amount of money that public districts can spend. It is approximately 15% less than what schools and the state have already budgeted to spend for the current school year. Charter schools are exempt from this.

If this is not overturned for this year by a 2/3 vote of Arizona legislature, beginning April 1, public school districts will need to cut approximately 30% of THIS year's budget to comply (30% because we already half way through the year). This is money that the schools ALREADY HAVE but will basically have to leave sitting in their bank accounts and not be allowed to spend. With cuts like these, our rural public school districts will be decimated. Larger districts like Tucson or Phoenix Union are looking to have to cut tens of millions. It would almost certainly mean cuts to services, extra curriculars, staff layoffs, and even school shutdowns.

Superior would have to cut over \$475,000.

- Ray — over \$515,000
- Hayden-Winkelman — \$680,000

- Mammoth/San Manuel — over \$750,000
  - Oracle Elementary District—\$900,000
  - Miami — almost \$1.7 million
  - San Carlos — \$1.8 million
  - CVIT — over \$260,000
- My students in Globe would lose almost \$2 million dollars

Remember—These cuts would not save the state money. The money would be sitting in the schools' coffers, just waiting to be spent.

Some have said that there's no way legislators or the Governor would let this happen, that they will get too much pressure from the public. However, many people I have talked to don't even know about this, so how can we pressure them if the word isn't out there. That's where I'm asking for your help.

1. Please email or call your legislators and tell them that they MUST support overturning the Aggregate Expenditure Limit on public education. Tell them your story about your kids, your community, and what the public schools in your community mean to them. If you don't know who your local legislators are you can find them here

2. Please share this information with other Arizonans in your circles. We have to get the word out about this.

Lastly, thank you all for your support of my career, my colleagues, but most of our students. Nobody will be more heavily impacted by this than them.

# Time to Start Firewising!

Late winter in Oracle often means unpredictable weather, but one thing is certain, this summer will be hot and it's not too early to start reducing fire risk around your home. The exceptional bounty of the 2021 monsoon created a super-growth event where grass and annual herbs grew waist high and long dormant seeds sprouted plants that hadn't been seen in Oracle for decades. While it was amazing to live in all that jungle-like splendor, the verdant growth has aged and dried, becoming a thick underbrush of fuel, just waiting for an ignition source. Before that happens, get out your string trimmer and get to work! If possible, work to keep dry, dead grass and annual plants cut down to 4" in areas within 30 feet of your home. Pay attention to tall dry grass under trees with low branches.

Although grass fires are generally fast moving, several years of dry summers and higher than usual temperatures have left trees and woody shrubs in poor condition. Drier slopes have lost up to 20% of their manzanita, many oak trees have more dead branches than living, some have even started resprouting from the base of the trunk. A grass fire can easily climb the ladder of low branches to reach into the tree canopy. When all that dead wood meets an unchecked grass fire, the fire can easily escalate. We all need to do our part to keep Oracle "Firewise" and ensure our community stays safe from wildfires.

You would be prudent to wait until frost danger has passed to prune frost tender shrubs, but it is always time to prune out dead material from a tree or bush. You can tell how if a branch is dead by gently bending a small twig or branch – if it is brittle and breaks easily, it is dead. If it is

still pliable, that indicates that it is still alive. You can also use your fingernail to gently scratch through the young bark on twigs – do you see any evidence of green? Pliable twigs and branches with green directly under the bark are still alive. Don't expect dead branches and twigs to regenerate – once the living cells that transport nutrients are dead, they remain dead.

You may be concerned that pruning will disturb nesting birds. Look for signs of nesting birds, including bird traffic back and forth to the nest, and birds acting agitated when you are close to the nest. If you find a nest in a tree or shrub you would need to prune, be patient. Most birds lay eggs within 2 weeks of making a nest, and most eggs will hatch within 2-3 weeks of being laid. Give your hatchlings another 3-4 weeks to fledge, and then prune to remove the dead growth.

## Know when to go to the emergency department for COVID concerns

Many emergency departments are at capacity due to high COVID case counts, staffing challenges and increasing demand for testing. The Omicron variant is extremely contagious and that makes it important for everyone to get vaccinated and know when to go to the emergency department for COVID concerns, according to the American College of Emergency Physicians (ACEP).

"Emergency departments in many communities are stretching to their limits," said Gillian Schmitz, MD, FACEP, president of ACEP. "You can be sure that an emergency

physician is ready to care for anyone who needs immediate medical attention. Whether it's COVID-related or not, do not ignore the signs of an emergency. But, for those seeking routine COVID tests, it may be more efficient to visit a testing site or take a test at home."

Emergency physicians continue to voice concerns about capacity issues and resource constraints. One way to ease the strain on health systems is to recognize when to treat a potential case of COVID-19 at home, and when to seek emergency care. "Fortunately

# PINAL REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY

## Analysis of Transportation Improvement Program pursuant to Arizona Revised Statutes 48-5304(5)

In accordance with the requirements of A.R.S. 48-5304(5), the Pinal Regional Transportation Authority (PRTA) is publishing this assessment and analysis of the status and implications of its current, adopted transportation improvement program (TIP) on its PRTA Regional Transportation Plan (RTP). In a November 2017 Special Election, the voters of Pinal County approved the RTP and a 20-year sales tax to help fund the roadway and public transportation projects described in that plan. The RTP consists of the three Elements listed below, to be funded over the 20-year life of the tax:

- (1) Roadway Element - \$591.2 million for 13 named roadway projects
- (2) Public Transportation Element - \$20 million for transit, dial-a-ride service and park-and-ride lots
- (3) Local Projects and Administrative Costs Element – at least \$30 million.

The RTP prioritized the 13 named roadway projects into four sequential, five-year phases.

CURRENT ADOPTED TIP: On September 14, 2021, the PRTA Board approved the 5-year TIP for FY 2022 to 2026. This TIP lists PRTA expenditures for all three RTP elements, including Phase 1 and Phase 2 roadway projects, with total expenditures of \$115,810,036 (approximately \$116 million) over the five-year period. FY 2022 began on July 1, 2021, and FY 2026 will end on June 30, 2026.

REVENUES AND EXPENDITURES TO DATE: Collection of the tax began on April 1, 2018, and has generated approximately \$75 million through the end of 2021, but zero dollars of tax proceeds have been made available to PRTA due to a lawsuit filed in January 2018. All PRTA funds have been frozen in escrow since tax collection began more than three and a half years ago. It is hoped that the Arizona Supreme Court in early 2022 will determine that the tax was legal and that the collected revenues could at last be made available for their intended voter-approved purposes.

FUNDING OUTLOOK: The total amount of expected PRTA revenues for FY 2022 to 2026, including funds accrued to date, is estimated to be \$186 million or more. This easily exceeds the amount of PRTA proposed expenditures in the TIP. This revenue estimate is based on projections by a professional economist. Thus, there are expected to be sufficient tax proceeds available to pay all PRTA amounts specified in the TIP and still finish each of the five fiscal years with a substantial cash reserve.

IMPLEMENTATION: With funds finally expected to be available in 2022, the PRTA has developed an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) with each local government that is listed as a recipient of PRTA funds in the TIP. It is expected that these IGAs will be executed in January 2022. Through these IGAs, the PRTA will provide the funding amounts specified in the 2017 election publicity materials, and the respective lead agencies will implement the projects.

CONCLUSION: Based on the above facts, the PRTA has not eliminated or reduced voter-approved funding amount for any RTP element or project. Furthermore, it foresees no reason to do so during the five-year duration of the FY 2022 to 2026 TIP.

for those who are vaccinated, many of the symptoms that distinguish the Omicron variant appear to be mild and can be monitored and managed at home," said Dr. Schmitz.

If you think you have COVID-19 or may have been in close contact with somebody who has the virus, it is time to get tested and contact a primary care physician to discuss treatment options. Emergency physicians report that common symptoms associated with the Omicron variant include head or body aches and similarities with the common cold but may not include loss of sense of taste or smell. Symptoms consistent with COVID-19, regardless of variant, include:

- Fever
- Coughing
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

Consider managing mild or moderate symptoms at home, similar to the way a cold or flu is treated, with over-the-counter medication as directed by a primary care physician. If positive for COVID, follow the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) guidelines for isolation or quarantine. Call 911 or go to the emergency department for severe illness, difficulty breathing,

intense chest pain, extreme weakness, or disorientation, especially for those at high risk of COVID complications, which includes anyone older or with a weakened immune system.

Emergency physicians remind everyone that it is still important to observe local safety guidelines and take all available precautions to avoid getting or spreading the virus. Wear a mask in crowded indoor spaces, social distance, regularly wash hands, and stay home if you are sick. It is recommended that everyone eligible get the vaccine and a booster shot. Anyone who has COVID can spread it, even if symptoms are mild.

"The choices we make to stay safe and protect each other can save lives," said Dr. Schmitz. "Everyone can do their part to slow the spread of the virus and help make sure that emergency departments remain accessible for those who are severely ill with COVID or other emergencies," said Dr. Schmitz.
