# Two Young Brothers First to Die in Arizona's Gas Chamber

Copper Area News has received some articles from a former corrections officer from Arizona State Prison. This retired officer spent 25 years with the Arizona Department of Corrections working all custody levels from juvenile detention units to Death Row. The author wishes to remain anonymous. He hopes to provide the readers with a view of what it is like working with inmates and what life is like behind prison walls.

## INTRODUCTION

The job of a corrections officer is

not easy. The nature of the job, working with men or women behind bars can be stressful. Working in high custody units can add to the stress. The Arizona Department of Corrections has a high staff turnover rate. One in five staff members quit within the first couple of years of being hired or use the training and experience they receive to transfer to Sheriff departments or Federal corrections.

Maximum custody inmates are either there because they are doing

long sentences, are convicted of violent crimes or they are problem inmates while in prison. Inmates on Death Row are under a sentence of death and have nothing to lose by acting out against staff or other inmates. Officers must always be on the alert to prevent these inmates from harming other inmates or staff. To understand the type of inmates that are housed on Death Row, I will provide you with a few of their stories, the crimes they committed and some of their prison life.

**O**n Jan. 22, 1933, the body of Charles Washburn, a 65-year-old prospector, was found in an abandoned well near Casa Sahuaro about three miles from Casa Grande. He had been beaten and shot in the head. Nearly a week later, two young brothers, Manuel, 17, and Fernando "Fred" Hernandez, 19, were arrested for the crime. On Feb. 2, 1933, Sheriff Walter Laveen announced that he had written confessions signed by both brothers admitting to the murder of Washburn. They had hit him in the head with a steel rod then shot him in the head with a 12 gauge shotgun. The motive for the murder was robbery. The Hernandez

brothers took \$35 from Washburn.

The brothers were tried separately. On May 16, 1933, Fred Hernandez was found guilty of first degree murder. At his sentencing hearing, he was sentenced to death on the gallows. Manuel was tried as an adult and found guilty of first degree murder on May 22, 1933. He was later sentenced to be hanged. He was the first known juvenile to be given a death sentence in Arizona. Juveniles in Arizona had been previously tried for murder as adults but had been sentenced to life in prison. On May 31, 1933 they were both sentenced to be hanged on Aug. 11, 1933. They were granted a reprieve on their first execution date pending their appeals.

The Hernandez brothers were placed at the state prison in Florence awaiting their execution. Appeals were filed by their attorneys. In October of 1933, a special election was held. One of the items on the ballot was a bill changing the execution method in Arizona from hanging to use of lethal gas. The bill passed by a vote of 13,043 to 10,045. A gas chamber would be installed later at the state prison. The new law brought into question whether the Hernandez brothers and two others who had been sentenced to hang before the new law should be hanged or executed by gas.

It would be up to the Arizona Supreme Court to decide

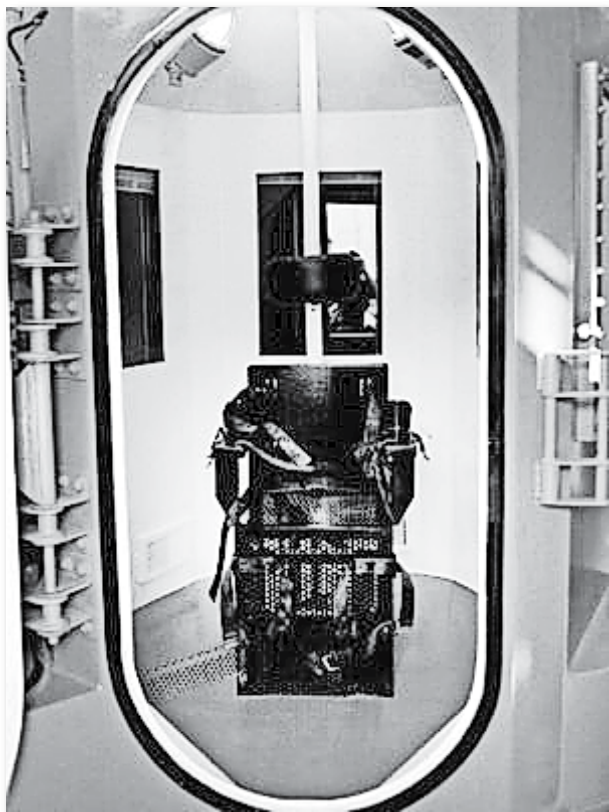
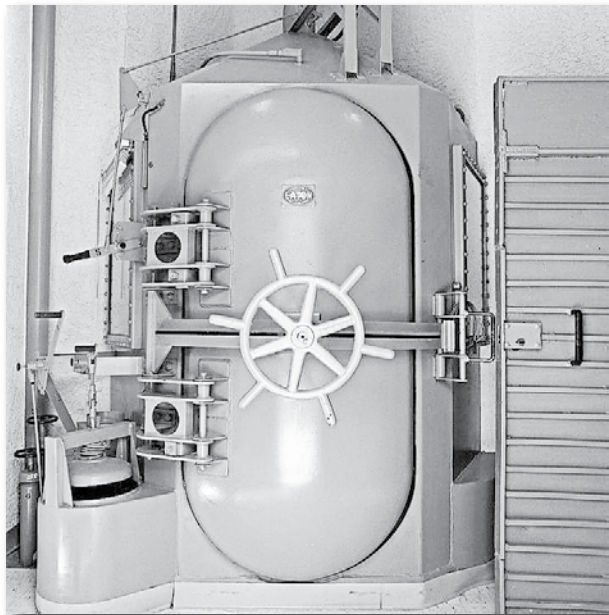

the method of execution for the four condemned men. The Arizona Attorney General was arguing that they should be executed by lethal gas, the method voted on by the people of Arizona. The Hernandez brother's attorney argued that the law had abolished hanging and that execution by lethal gas constituted cruel and unusual punishment in violation of the Eighth Amendment

to the United States Constitution. In April 1934, the Supreme Court heard the appeal of the Hernandez brothers and upheld their conviction and sentenced them to death by lethal gas. At the same time the court's ruling about execution method would apply to the other two men who had been convicted and sentenced to be hanged, Lewis Douglas and George Shaughnessy.

The date of execution for the Hernandez brothers was set for July 6, 1934. On June 22, 1934, the Hernandez brothers attended a hearing of the Board of Pardons and Parole where they asked that their lives be spared. Despite their tearful pleas, the Board denied clemency.

On June 28, the boy's mother, Mrs. Alejandria Hernandez Lopez, and six of her 13 children traveled to Phoenix to speak with Governor Mauer and plead for her son's lives. The Governor told her, "Tell them to put their faith in God. I am as powerless as you are to save them. There is no avenue now by which they can escape with their lives." The Governor did have the power to pardon or commute their sentence but only if the Board of Pardons and Parole recommended it. On July 2, 1934, the Board of Pardons and Parole held a special meeting in Prescott, Arizona at the request of the Latin American Club of Phoenix. The club had asked then to consider a stay of the pending execution date and that the death penalty be commuted to life imprisonment. The Board denied both requests.

On July 5, 1934, 18 members of the Hernandez family, their attorney, a priest and a few newsmen visited Manuel and Fred at the prison. The family took pictures with their brothers and feasted on watermelon. They visited for two hours before saying their tearful goodbyes. Manuel had composed a note which was dictated to another death row inmate, George

Shaughnessy, who wrote it. Shaughnessy, 19 years old, was scheduled to die in the gas chamber one week after the brothers. The note was given to the boy's attorney, H.G. Richardson who read it to the newspaper men.



# Healthy Teeth resources offer easy ways to prevent children's tooth decay

Good oral health in young children plays a critical role in a child's overall wellbeing and education. Yet, tooth decay is the most common chronic disease faced by young children and is also 100% preventable.

First Things First, Arizona's early childhood agency and partners, recently launched Healthy Teeth resources ([FirstThingsFirst.org/resources/healthy-teeth/](http://FirstThingsFirst.org/resources/healthy-teeth/)) in time for February's National Children's Dental Health Month to help more families understand the importance of early oral health and what they can do to help prevent tooth decay in their babies, toddlers and preschoolers.

According to a 2016 First Things First study, conducted in partnership with the Arizona Department of Health Services, 52% of Arizona's kindergartners have experienced tooth decay compared with 36% of 5-year-old children nationally.

Left untreated, tooth decay in young children's primary teeth puts them at risk for future problems like damaged permanent teeth; increased vulnerability to infections in other parts of the body, such as the ears, sinuses and the brain; impaired speech development, and reduced self-esteem.

"We know that if a child is seen for their first dental visit

by age one, they are 20 times less likely to have cavities at five years old than a child who has their first dental visit at age five," said Greeta Mills, First Smiles Oral Health Professional with University of Arizona Cooperative Extension. "Early preventive dental visits reduce suffering and save dollars. Our screenings look for any sign of early dental disease. We then visit with the family about our findings and help direct them to their dental home."

The Healthy Teeth resources offer basic, but often unknown, tips to prevent tooth decay, including in babies. For example, families often don't know that a child's first dental visit should happen once the first tooth appears or by their first birthday. Or, that germs that can cause decay can be passed from parents to babies when they lick their pacifier.

Here are four easy tips:

1. Don't share germs. Your baby is born with no germs in their mouth, but germs are easily passed from yours to theirs — when you share spoons, food or lick their pacifier. Do your best to not put things from your mouth into your baby's mouth.
2. Limit sugar. Sugar is in many foods, especially sweets (candy, cookies, flavored yogurt and pudding), snacks (chips and french fries) and

sweet drinks (soda, juice, teas and sports drinks). Try to serve healthier foods and snacks and give your child more water to drink.

3. Take care of their teeth at home. Starting at birth, clean your baby's gums with a clean, soft washcloth after each feeding. Once their first teeth appear (usually at about 6 months), gently brush with a soft infant toothbrush and small amount of fluoride toothpaste, about the size of a grain of rice. From ages 1 to 3, try to brush twice a day for two minutes using a smear of fluoride toothpaste. The best times to brush are

after breakfast and before bed. Starting at age 3, brush with a pea-sized amount of toothpaste.

4. Take care your child to regular dental check-ups. Schedule your child's first dental visit when you see their first tooth or by their first birthday. Just like they need regular check-ups with their doctor, your child needs a dental check-up starting at age 1 and every year after that to prevent tooth decay and the need for much more costly dental care later.

We have also shared a reference guide of recommendations from the Federal Trade Commission regarding identity theft including information on how to request free credit reports, security freezes and fraud alerts.

Upon discovering this incident, we took the following actions to correct this issue and prevent it from reoccurring:

- We immediately conducted an investigation into the incident and ceased using Accellion's services.
- We have reviewed our file transfer processes and tools to ensure that they are not at risk of a similar attack.
- We have removed all of our data files from Accellion's systems.

Accellion is coordinating their response with the appropriate law enforcement authorities.

Arizona Complete Health takes the responsibility of protecting our members' personal information very seriously. We sincerely regret any concern or inconvenience this incident may have caused our members and their families. *Copper Area News* is committed to providing our readers with as much information as possible. This graph shows the positive cases as of press time on March 9, 2021. We have also included a graph showing the daily counts for the past week. The state has reported that as of this past week, there has been a decrease in cases statewide. This downward trajectory has not been seen since early September, 2020.

New data reported this week is the number of residents who have been vaccinated per zip code. We will update that on a weekly basis.

There are a few points we would like our readers to consider when following this data.

1. This will continue to be a rolling total of positive cases. It does not reflect recoveries or deaths. The Arizona Department of Health Services does not break out this data.
2. If you see a reduction in numbers from day to day it is most likely due to a data entry error or mis-coding of a zip code (at the state level).
3. This is all zip code based data; most of our zip codes include unincorporated areas. There is no way to track exactly which areas each of the positive cases are. Example, Kearny and Winkelman each have small communities in their zip code that are not in the Town's incorporated boundaries.
4. If you live in Gila County, please follow the Gila County Health and Emergency Management, Facebook. They have maintained their data on recoveries and current positive cases.

The boy's sister Dolores tried to translate the note for the family but broke down crying.

The note read:

"I am giving this warning to the outside world, as I sit in my cell awaiting my time to come, and hoping Jesus Christ, our savior, will spare me from death. I, Manuel, am guilty of a crime, but my brother Fred, is not, but still the laws of Arizona say we have to pay with our lives.

"Anybody who reads this warning, please do not drink or steal or do anything bad. Do God's work instead of Satan's work. I am about to meet God at 5 o'clock this morning, with His word on my lips. May the Son of God guide you and keep you from sin, so you will not have to suffer like my brother, Fred Hernandez. Be good to your mother, sisters, brothers, but take and make the Son of God your Savior (Jesus Christ).

Love him more than anything else. I am only 18 years old and my brother, Fred, 19, just boys who got drunk.

"Stay away from liquor and other evil things and you will be glorified in the eyes of God. Do Satan's work and you are condemned to eternal flames. Please heed this warning and you will never be sorry. If you do not, you will suffer. My parents suffer more than I or you ever will. Your mother is your best friend on earth. Jesus

Christ, the Son of God, is always your friend. Take him as your Savior. Cry out to Him and confess your sin and he will forgive you and save you."

The Hernandez brothers were executed together on July 6, 1934. They sat side by side on a special straight back chair fitted with leather straps to tie them down. They were the first to die in Arizona's gas chamber. It was the first double execution by lethal gas in the United States.
