



Superior junior Daniel McConnell threw a complete-game shutout to earn his win


of the season in the Panthers' 7 – 0 victory against visiting San Manuel last Thursday.

San Manuel scored three runs in the first, second and fifth innings with a single run in the fourth.


San Manuel senior Taya Dockum went
