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LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Sheriff to redeploy Deputies to fast growing San Tan Valley

Our population continues to grow in Pinal County, even in a down economy. New families are relocating in the faster growing cities of Maricopa and Casa Grande, yet it doesn't compare to unincorporated San Tan Valley. The 2010 census counts 81,321 San Tan residents and current estimates show 90,000 or more.

Last year, the county contracted with the Segal Company of Washington DC to perform a staffing study for the Sheriff's Office which said, "Based on population, the average staffing for Maricopa and Pima Counties is 1.33 per 1,000 residents...Pinal County would need 141 additional sworn personnel."

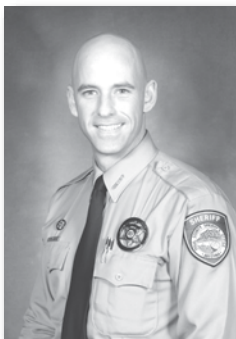
The Board of Supervisors approved our current \$330 million county-wide budget with nearly \$40 million in cash reserves. I requested 64 additional sworn positions to meet the increased demand for service and population growth, yet the board denied any new positions.

Last week, the board hosted a budget summit with all elected officials and we heard a gloomy forecast of shrinking cash reserves. I will again make a request for additional Deputies this year, yet I'm not counting on the board to view this second request as their priority.

At this meeting, I challenged the board to make good on their campaign promises of 2012. While campaigning, they promised to reorganize county government and prioritize public safety, yet there have been next to no changes in the priorities of this government.

In 2008 I made several promises to you - my future bosses, that I would improve staff training, hold staff accountable, obtain Jail accreditation and reduce Deputy response time to emergencies. We've achieved all these goals and more, yet continued population growth requires additional staff to keep up with increased demand for service. Instead, the 2014 Sheriff's Office budget has 29 less full time positions than in 2008.

My senior staff has recommended that I redeploy Deputies and other sworn staff to meet the changing demands for service. I have already terminated long standing agreements with the FBI and DEA multi-agency task forces in order to reassign deputies back to uniformed patrol. My staff recommended permanent reassignment of 20 deputies from other areas of Pinal County to



San Tan Valley effective June 1st.

I'm bringing this issue to your attention in advance, to let you know that with current staffing levels I can no longer fulfill my promise of faster emergency response times in most areas of Pinal County. We shall respond immediately to all emergency calls, yet lower priority calls (non-life threatening) may have an extended response time.

As Sheriff, I will make do with whatever financial resources and staff that the board provides. I am confident that our Sheriff's

Office shall continue to provide exceptional law enforcement services.

I thank and appreciate the citizens of Pinal County for your continued trust and support as we strive to be the very best in law enforcement. It is our sincere privilege at PCSO to serve and protect our Pinal families.

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Sheriff Babeu to reallocate 20 officers to San Tan Valley

The Pinal County Board of Supervisors and the Sheriff's Office have begun the political posturing portion of the budgeting process.

During a recent budget working session, the Board of Supervisors left Sheriff Paul Babeu with the impression that new funds would not be forthcoming in the 2014-2015 budget. In response, Sheriff Babeu released a letter to the media outlining his plan to deal with the growing population in unincorporated areas and a lack of new resources. According to his letter, the Sheriff will reallocate 20 sworn personnel to San Tan Valley from the rest of the County areas.

According to the Sheriff, PCSO would need 141 additional sworn personnel to meet similar staffing levels

maintained by Maricopa and Pima counties. Last year the Sheriff sought 64 new sworn personnel, but received no additional funds. Babeu indicated that the efficiency gains via new technology, procedures and training allowed the department to handle the growing population while overall staffing was reduced. However, the Sheriff asserts population gains coupled with efficiency improvements have reached parity. To maintain countywide service levels, PCSO must increase staff, or barring that, shift resources to meet minimum service levels in the high population grow areas. The beneficiaries of the reshuffle will be the residents of San Tan Valley.

The effect on the remaining areas of the county is not clear. The Sheriff indicates that Priority 1 calls will be still be handled quickly, but lower priority calls might have a longer response time.

As the county continues to add population to unincorporated areas, the pressure on PCSO will continue to increase. Either additional funds will need to be provided or the high growth areas could take steps to build their own police forces via incorporation. No one has a crystal ball to determine which course makes the most sense for the high growth areas and the County as a whole. What is all but certain, is the pressure on County finances and the Sheriff's department will continue.

Supervisors Pete Rios and Cheryl Chase did not have a comment before press time.



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New board members named to Mammoth-San Manuel Governing Board

At the Mammoth-San Manuel School District Board meeting, a raise was approved for school district employees. The 2014-2015 Certified Salary Schedule reflected a 1 percent increase. Support staff also received a 1 percent increase in their salary schedule. A \$500 stipend for certified teachers, librarian, speech and counselors was approved for those that sign a contract during the 15 day window

and return to work by Aug. 5, 2014. New school board member appointee Frances Wickham from Mammoth was introduced and welcomed by Superintendent John Ryan and the board. Lynn Zeiler was also recertified as a board member. A donation of \$800 from BHP Billiton to San Manuel High School Wrestling was approved. The donation of \$1,000 from Trail Riders of Southern Arizona to Mammoth-San Manuel Community Schools was also approved.

Murder trial begins for David Mota

The trial of San Manuel resident David Arnoldo Mota in what is called a deadly road rage incident in Oro Valley began Tuesday, March 18, 2014, in Pima County Superior Court.

Mota was charged with first degree murder, drive by shooting, and aggravated assault in the incident that occurred on Feb. 28, 2013 that resulted in the death of 22 year old Joshua Switalski. The shooting occurred around 8 p.m. when it is alleged

that Mota fired two shots at Switalski's vehicle after being involved in a verbal altercation with Switalski and his girlfriend while both vehicles were traveling north on Oracle Road near First Ave. in Oro Valley.

Opening statements by the prosecution said Switalski and his girlfriend were on their way to dinner when the vehicle driven by Mota cut them off in traffic. This led to the verbal

altercation. The defense attorney Natasha Wrae, in her opening statement, said that it was more than a simple exchange of words. She said obscenities and racial epithets were shouted at Mota and his passenger Daniel Fehr. These actions frightened Mota she contended. She also said that Mota fired his gun to scare Switalski, not intending to hit him. The case is ongoing.

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Young swimmers from San Manuel win Medley Relay at State Meet

The 8 and Under State Championship Swim Meet was held March 15-16 at the Anthem Community Center in Anthem, Ariz. Five boys from the San Manuel Sea Lions competed in the meet. Ethan Kellam, Mason Stewart, Rocky Andrade, Joey Castellanos, and Ben Fister (all 8 years old) qualified for the maximum number of individual events for the meet. The most exciting fact was that the Sea Lions would have both a Medley and Free Relay at the meet and both would be seeded among the best in the fast heat.

The meet started with the Medley Relay on Saturday. In the heat prior to the fast heat, two teams set very fast times, beating the best seed times, and making it clear that it would be a battle for the Sea Lions just to get on the podium. Minutes later, Joey Castellanos led out the Backstroke leg of the Medley Relay followed by Mason Stewart swimming the Breaststroke. Rocky Andrade had an incredible swim in the Butterfly leg and Ethan Kellam brought it home swimming Freestyle. All swimmers swam personal best times on each leg of the relay dropping more than 4 seconds overall to become State Champions in the Boys 8 and Under Medley Relay. Coach Alex Gort beamed with pride over the relay win. "We

have a relay that does not have a weak link," said Gort. "What a thrill to win against the best teams in Arizona like Ford Aquatics, Scottsdale Aquatics, Swim Neptune, and Westside Silver Fins. I am so proud of these boys."

After the Medley Relay, swimmers competed in individual events including the 100 Freestyle, 25 Fly, 50 Breast, 25 Free, and 50 Back. Andrade finished in the top 16 in four events (4th-100 Free, 4th-25 Fly, 10th-25 Free, and 19th-50 Back). Stewart finished eighth in the 50 Breaststroke. Kellam finished ninth in the 25 Butterfly and 12th in the 50 Backstroke. Castellanos's top individual finish was 17th in the 25 Butterfly, and Fister's was 18th in the 25 Butterfly.

On Sunday, the first event was the Freestyle Relay. The Sea Lions were excited about their chances. They had the fastest seed time and had won the Medley Relay. The order went Andrade, Stewart, Kellam, and Fister, each swimming one length of the pool. As the race unfolded, it became evident that the team from Scottsdale Aquatics Club would win and it would be a three way battle for the other two spots on the podium. It would come down to an exciting finish, with the Sea Lions finding themselves finishing fourth just missing the

podium by 3 hundredths of a second.

After the Free Relay, the swimmers competed in the 100 Individual Medley (IM), 25 Back, 50 Freestyle, 50 Butterfly, and 25 Breaststroke. Both Stewart and Andrade had three top 16 finishes. Stewart finished seventh in the 25 Breaststroke, and had a couple of 11th place finishes in the 100 IM and 25 Back. Andrade finished 11th in the 50 Freestyle, 14th in the 25 Backstroke, and 16th in the 100 IM. Castellanos finished 15th in the 25 Backstroke to earn his first individual ribbon at the meet. Kellam's best finish on Sunday was 18th place in the 100 IM, and Fister's best finish was 20th in the 50 Freestyle.

Overall swimmers showed great improvements at the meet and had fun while competing. The Sea Lions swim team has started registration for the summer season and practice is scheduled to begin on April 9. Additional information can be obtained by contacting Coach Alex Gort at 896-2190.

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Interagency wildland drill held in Oracle

Close to 200 firefighters from Southern Arizona participated in a series of training exercises in Oracle last week. The training was utilized to prepare firefighters for the upcoming wildfire season. The exercise was hosted by the U.S. Forest Service, Arizona

Forestry Division, and several local fire agencies from Pima and Pinal Counties. These included the Northwest Fire District, Eloy Fire District, Golder Ranch Fire District, Pinal Rural Fire Department and the Oracle Fire Department.

Wildland members from the Pima and Pinal County Wildland Team from the Southeast Zone took part in the exercise.

These are the firefighters that would respond to the Oracle area if there was a wildfire. The drill exercises provided wildland firefighters refresher and certification training which included chainsaw use; deployment of emergency fire shelters; wildland/urban interface triage; and deployment of sprinkler systems and drafting operations.

Michelle Fidler, public information officer said the drill allows the firefighters to get to know each other, strengthen their relationships, and to learn more about the terrain of the area. They also familiarize themselves with different locations in Oracle. The interagency training comes at a time when fire conditions are high due to the warm winter and low rainfall this year.
