OBITUARIES

Glenn Audubon Wilt Jr.



Glenn Audubon Wilt Jr., A.B., M.B.A., Ph.D., 88 years old, passed away of natural causes on March 19, 2023.

Dr. Wilt was born in Canton, Ohio on Sept. 29, 1934, and, at age 9, moved with his mother, Hazel Keefe Wilt, to Hollywood, California to join his family of grandmother, uncles and aunts. There he completed through the 12th grade, graduating from Hollywood High School in 1952. His later educational experience involved an A.B.

degree from Occidental College in Los Angeles in 1956, an MBA degree in 1958 from Miami University in Oxford, Ohio and Ph.D. degree from the Business School at the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor in 1963.

In 1962, after completing his course work at Michigan, he accepted an Assistant Professor position at the then-named College of Business Administration at Arizona State University in Tempe, was an early pioneer in "distance learning" and taught his early classes at ASU on Channel 8 KAET television, and was also a weekly moderator on a weekly television news show titled "Arizona Business" which ran from 1963 through 1970, on which he interviewed many nationally-prominent business people. Dr. Wilt taught his last class in the W.P. Carey School of Business at Arizona State University, achieving some 49.5 years of teaching in that school.

Dr. Wilt had a distinguished teaching career, giving information and counseling to thousands of students and was visited after his retirement by many former students and teaching assistants. Dr. Wilt was also a Real Estate Investor and life-long bachelor and is survived by his adopted family, including Gregory E. and Helen N. Rowles and by his two godchildren, Glenn Maxwell

Rowles and Rea A. Allen, with Greg and Rea taking charge of Dr. Wilt's Real Estate Business in his latter days. Dr. Wilt is also survived by his two cousins, Joyce Hansen of California and Timothy Tilton of Tucson, Arizona.

Memorial services will be held Tuesday, April 4, 2023, at Tempe Mortuary, 405 East Southern Ave., Tempe, AZ 85282 with a viewing at 10 a.m. and services at 11. In lieu of flowers or other remembrances, donations may be made to the Finance Department Scholarship Fund in memory of Dr. Wilt, at the W.P. Carey School of Business at Arizona State University.

Southwest Wildfire Awareness Week begins: teamwork is key when it comes to wildfire prevention and risk reduction

Every year, wildfires burn thousands of acres across the state. Fires destroy properties, harm Arizona's natural resources, impact critical infrastructure, and disrupt lives. And every year, people continue to cause more than half of the state's fires. The Arizona Department of Forestry and Fire Management, along with its federal and tribal counterparts work diligently throughout the year collaborating on fuels reduction projects and providing public outreach and education opportunities to reduce wildfire risk.

As the Southwest Wildfire Awareness Week gets underway this week, there is no better theme than, "Preparing Together." The goal of "Preparing Together" echoes that constant teamwork between all state, federal, and tribal agencies. But residents and visitors must do their parts too because it takes a team to prevent wildfires.

Last year, according to DFFM's Arizona Dispatch Center, 1,444 wildfires were

reported across all land jurisdictions, including State Trust, private, federal, and tribal. Of those fires, 941 were human caused. In total, 124,323 acres burned statewide in 2022.

Southwest Wildfire Awareness Week provides agencies a way to amplify wildfire prevention and outreach messaging prior to the state's critical fire time frame. To promote the week, DFFM and partners will focus on increased social media messaging, public service announcements, and public outreach events. On Monday, March 27, DFFM kicks off the week with Governor Katie Hobbs to host the agency's annual wildland fire outlook briefing at the State Capitol.

Over the last few months, a remarkable level of moisture provided much-welcomed relief to the drought-stricken state. But, with all of that moisture comes the potential for high fire activity in certain parts of Arizona. Once conditions dry out and temperatures warm up, a dry and

Pinal County Public Hearing on the use of HUD program funding and approval of FY2023 Annual Action Plan

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) requires Pinal County to publish a five-year consolidated plan and annual action plans outlining the use of funds for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), and Home Investment Partnership (HOME).

All Pinal County citizens are invited to voice their comments regarding housing and community development needs, strategies to meet identified needs, and identifying barriers to those needs. Public input is an essential component of this planning effort.

The Pinal County Board of Supervisors, in conjunction with the cities and towns of Eloy, Florence, Mammoth and Maricopa would like to invite all members of the public to a public hearing on May 3, 2023 at 9:30am. The public hearing is to accept comments on the proposed FY23 Annual Action Plan for the use of CDBG, and HOME funds

Pinal County will receive \$1,884,846 in FY23 CDBG funding. Four participating cities and towns have elected to join the county's entitlement program and may receive funding under this allocation.
