Design, Construction Plans Finalized for Oracle Bond Project

As students in the Oracle Elementary School District returned to school on a hybrid schedule in early March, District staff were also engaged with design and construction partners to finalize the \$13.2M bond project designs and construction planning.

With the help of our project manager at H2 Group, architects at BWS Architects, and construction management from Chasse Building Team, our Capital Bond Projects have been organized into three phases. Phase I includes the construction of the new classroom building,

kitchen renovation, library renovation, ADA upgrades in all restrooms, HVAC replacement, and campus security. Construction for Phase I is slated to begin this summer. Phase II includes our parking lot reconfiguration and ADA site circulation upgrades. Construction for Phase II is also slated to start this summer. Phase III includes playground upgrades for both the K-4 and 5-8 playgrounds/common areas.

During the February meeting, our Governing Board approved the pre-construction contract for Phase II between the District and our selected construction partner, Chasse Building Team. The pre-construction contract for Phase I was approved earlier this school year. Once the pre-construction phase is complete and we are prepared to begin construction, the Governing Board will

Sorted were: 150 cans of soup, 75 bags of spaghetti and the sauces to serve them

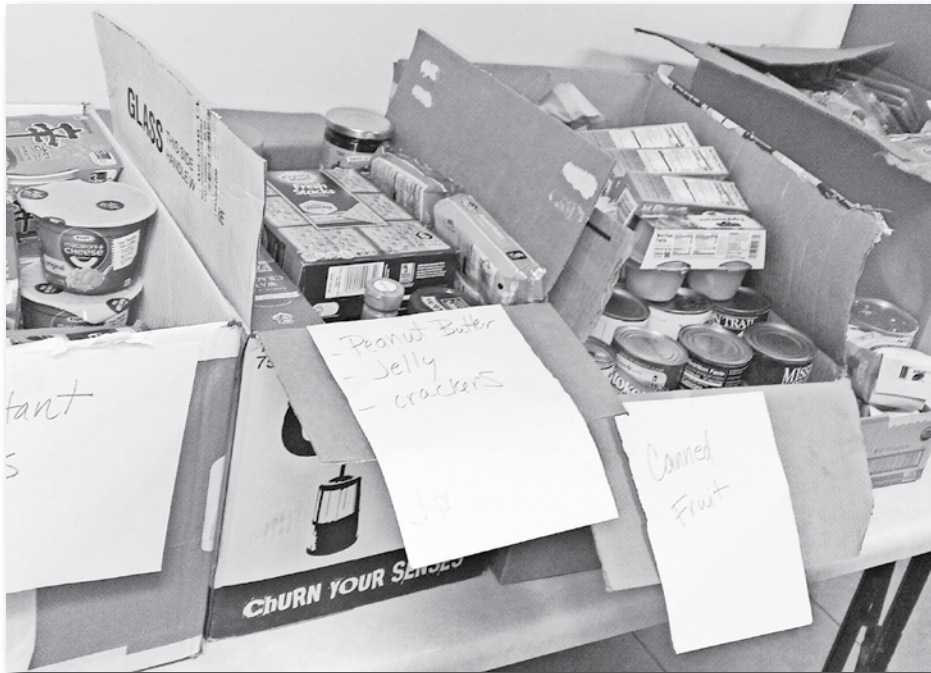

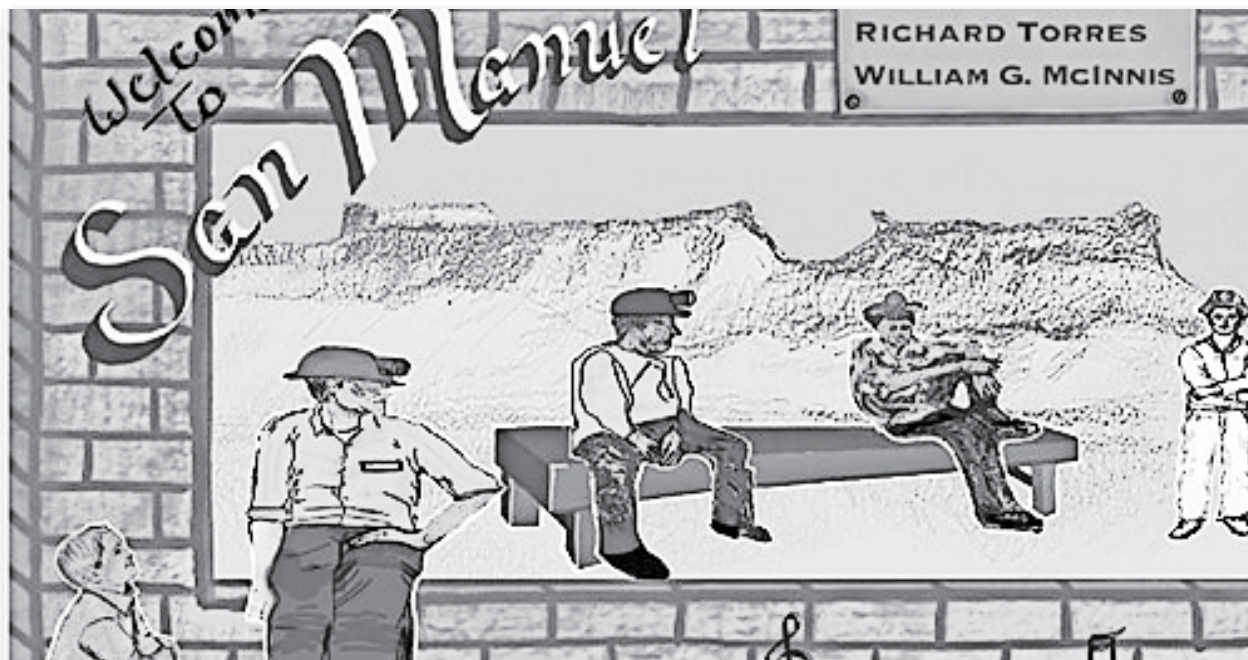

Sprucing up our town

San Manuel, AZ - Coming soon to the south wall of the San Manuel Elks Lodge #2007 (the Elks) building, in the lower shopping center, will be a 100 foot long, 15 foot high mural. It is the inspiration of Hannah Smallhouse, the daughter of a longtime ranching family from the valley.

Hannah has been working on finding a way to bring this mural from dream to reality since early August, beginning with getting permission from the Elks to place the mural on their wall, and securing initial funding from the Copper Town Association. She then began collaborating with the art departments at both her school and San Manuel High School, as well as a group of Tucson mural artists.

The final design was presented for approval to the Elks and the Copper Town Association at their respective meetings in February. The mural will consist of three panels depicting San Manuel's beginnings as a copper mining center and visual references to beautiful local mountains and valleys.

The project is planned to begin after the March 27 weekend. The projected cost for the mural is in the range of \$15,000 to \$20,000. This is a lot of money, but, when you consider the 150,000 sq ft size and the 20-plus years it will last, it makes more monetary sense.

The Copper Town Association has established a Go Fund Me page, which may be accessed through their Facebook page, found at www.facebook.com/coppertownassociation/.

There is also a link to sign up to be a part of the painting crews. Hannah would love to see you all come out to help with this community art project.

be asked to approve a contract between the District and Chasse Building Team for the actual construction of Phase I and Phase II. At this time, the District plans to complete Phase III independently by purchasing new playground equipment outright from playground equipment vendors.

During the month of March, the District team approved the final design for the parking lot, bus drop off area, and traffic flow. They also engaged in a Value Engineering (VE) effort to consider and prioritize a 53-line item list of options recommended by our partners, to help keep costs down. Going through the VE process was time consuming, but in the end, we believe it will result

in more bang for the buck, increased student safety, a more functional campus, and an overall higher quality outcome.

Even so, there is more work to be done than even the \$13.2M will cover. Fortunately, District staff has been successful in acquiring additional funding from a variety of sources to include the Arizona School Facilities Board (SFB). The SFB funded the HVAC replacement for the Science classroom, at an estimated \$7,000 and the replacement of the cafeteria flooring at an estimated \$35,000, which has already been completed. Now, they've approved \$233,000 in additional funding for the

repair/replacement of roofs for four buildings (5th Grade, Cafeteria, Gymnasium and Science.) District staff is hopeful their request for SFB funding to purchase kitchen equipment will also be approved.

The District team and Governing Board is very pleased with how the design of the campus and facility improvements are shaping up as well as the support received from our project partners. In the midst of a global pandemic that has changed much about our lives, we are feeling very positive about the value this bond project will deliver to the students of the Oracle School District as well as the community at large.

All Pinal County citizens are invited to voice their comments regarding housing and community development needs, strategies to meet identified needs, and identifying barriers to those needs. Public input is an essential component of this planning effort.

The Pinal County Board of Supervisors, in conjunction with the cities and towns of Eloy, Florence, Mammoth and Maricopa would like to invite all members of the public to a public hearing on May 5, 2021 at 9:30am. The public hearing is to accept comments on the proposed FY21 Annual Action Plan for the use of CDBG, HOME, and ESG funds.

Pinal County will receive \$1,287,410 in FY21 CDBG funding. Participating communities will receive an allocation of \$130,000 each totaling \$1,807,410 in CDBG funds for the county. Four participating cities and towns have elected to join the county's entitlement program. Those communities include: Eloy, Florence, Mammoth, and Maricopa. Pinal County will also receive \$612,860 in HOME funding, and \$156,877 in ESG funding. Pinal County is seeking input on the Annual Action Plan which outlines the proposed projects to include:

CDBG

1. Administration of CDBG program = \$120,000
2. Hopi Hills fire hydrant/waterlines installation = \$1,167,410 to benefit 2,005 persons of whom 65% are low and moderate income (LMI).
3. Eloy ADA park improvements = \$130,000 to benefit 9,610 persons of whom 69.25% are LMI.
4. Florence ADA compliant sidewalks = \$130,000 to benefit 4,024 persons of whom 52% are LMI.
5. Mammoth park improvements = \$65,000 to benefit 1,530 persons of whom 69% are LMI.
6. Mammoth water system improvements = \$65,000 to benefit 1,530 persons of whom 69% are LMI.
7. Maricopa utility improvements = \$130,000 to benefit 76 persons of whom 100% are LMI.

HOME

1. CHDO set-aside for housing development = a minimum of \$91,929 to serve LMI households/persons.
2. Owner occupied housing rehab = \$260,000 to serve low income households/persons.
3. Housing development = \$260,931 to serve LMI households/persons.

Copper Area News is committed to providing our readers with as much information as possible. This graph shows the positive cases as of press time on March 30, 2021. We have also included a graph showing the daily counts for the past week. Statewide, positive case counts have reduced dramatically, as the number of people vaccinated has increased. Case counts in the Copper Corridor are not increasing and have been holding steady.

New data reported this week is the number of residents who have been vaccinated per zip code. We will update that on a weekly basis.

There are a few points we would like our readers to consider when following this data.

1. This will continue to be a rolling total of positive cases. It does not reflect recoveries or deaths. The Arizona Department of Health Services does not break out this data.
2. If you see a reduction in numbers from day to day it is most likely due to a data entry error or mis-coding of a zip code (at the state level).
3. This is all zip code based data; most of our zip codes include unincorporated areas. There is no way to track exactly which areas each of the positive cases are. Example, Kearny and Winkelman each have small communities in their zip code that are not in the Town's incorporated boundaries.
4. If you live in Gila County, please follow the Gila County Health and Emergency Management, Facebook. They have maintained their data on recoveries and current positive cases.
